Gentlemen

Thank you for accepting our invitation for 4 May.

Attached you will find a summary of our preliminary proposals, which have six main objectives:

- to improve the racing spectacle without introducing artificial rules;
- to put a greater emphasis on driver skills by finally eliminating electronic driver aids;
- to reduce the cost of operating a front-running Formula One team;
- to reduce very substantially the cost of operating a smaller competitive Formula One team;
- to encourage new teams to enter Formula One;
- to encourage a full grid of 24 cars.

Please feel free to put forward any additional ideas which you feel may help achieve the above objectives and also to suggest additional means of ensuring the ongoing success of Formula One.

As you know, the meeting starts at 11 am on 4 May. We have, however, made provision to continue until midday on 5 May should this prove necessary.

We intend to present final proposals to the World Motor Sport Council on 30 June, to take effect on 1 January 2008
