ANTI-DOPING COMMITTEE – FIA MEDICAL COMMISSION

Mr Bruno CORSANI – Decision notified on 10.12.2010

Mr Bruno Corsani, who took part in the "Coppa del Chianti Classico" event counting towards the FIA Historic Hill-Climb Championship held at Castellina in Chianti, Italy, on 2 October 2010, tested positive for Bisoprolol, a specified substance belonging to the P2, beta-blockers group of substances prohibited in particular sports (including Automobile Sport) of the World Anti-Doping Agency Prohibited List.

The Anti-Doping Committee – FIA Medical Commission (ACMC) held a hearing in this case on 2 December 2010.

Decision of the ACMC

The ACMC concluded that an Anti-Doping Rule Violation according to Article 2.1 of the FIA Anti-Doping Regulations – "Presence of a Prohibited Substance or its Metabolites or Markers in a Driver's Sample" – was established.

As a consequence, the ACMC has decided to impose the following sanctions on Mr Bruno Corsani:

- 1) the sanction of reprimand;
- 2) Mr Bruno Corsani is disqualified from the individual result achieved in the "Coppa del Chianti Classico" event counting towards the FIA Historic Hill-Climb Championship held at Castellina in Chianti, Italy, on 2 October 2010, with all resulting consequences including forfeiture of any trophies, points and prizes.

Mr Bruno Corsani has 21 days in which to appeal this decision to the Court of Arbitration for Sport.
