FIA ANTI-DOPING DISCIPLINARY COMMITTEE

Mr Tommy JOHNSON – Decision notified in writing on 04.10.2011

Mr Tommy Johnson, who took part in the Alastaro (FIN) event counting towards the 2011 FIA European Drag Racing Championship and who was selected for a doping control on 2 July 2011, tested positive for d-amphetamine (dextroamphetamine), a Non-Specified Stimulant belonging to Section 6, Stimulants, of the World Anti-Doping Agency Prohibited List.

Mr Tommy Johnson was provisionally suspended as from 22 July 2011.

The FIA Anti-Doping Disciplinary Committee (ADC) held a hearing on this case in Paris on 7 September 2011.

Mr Tommy Johnson was informed orally of the following decision immediately after the hearing.

Decision of the ADC

The ADC concluded that an Anti-Doping Rule Violation according to Article 2.1 of the FIA Anti-Doping Regulations – "Presence of a Prohibited Substance or its Metabolites or Markers in a Driver's Sample" – was established.

As a consequence, the ADC has decided to impose the following sanctions on Mr Tommy Johnson:

- 1) ineligibility for a period of 1 year, starting on 2 July 2011 and expiring on 2 July 2012;
- 2) disqualification from the individual result achieved in the Alastaro (FIN) event counting towards the 2011 FIA European Drag Racing Championship, as well as from any competitive results achieved as from 2 July 2011, with all resulting consequences including forfeiture of any trophies, points and prizes.

Mr Tommy Johnson has 21 days in which to appeal this decision to the Court of Arbitration for Sport.
