FIA ANTI-DOPING DISCIPLINARY COMMITTEE

Mr Tomáš ENGE – Decision notified on 27.07.2012

Mr Tomáš Enge, who took part in the Navarra (ESP) event counting towards the 2012 FIA GT1 World Championship and who was selected for a doping control on 26 May 2012, tested positive for levamethamphetamine (a specified stimulant) and amphetamine (a non-specified stimulant) belonging to Section S6, Stimulants, of the World Anti-Doping Agency Prohibited List.

Mr Tomáš Enge was provisionally suspended as from 14 June 2012.

The FIA Anti-Doping Disciplinary Committee (ADC) held a hearing on this case in Paris on 20 July 2012.

Decision of the ADC

The ADC concluded that an Anti-Doping Rule Violation according to Article 2.1 of the FIA Anti-Doping Regulations – "Presence of a Prohibited Substance or its Metabolites or Markers in a Driver's Sample" – was established.

As a consequence, the ADC has decided to impose the following sanctions on Mr Tomáš Enge:

- 1) A Sanction of Ineligibility for a period of 18 (eighteen) months, starting on 14 June 2012 and expiring on 14 December 2013;
- 2) Disqualification of the result obtained by the Athlete in the Navarra (ESP) event of the 2012 FIA GT1 World Championship, as well as any competitive results achieved as from 14 June 2012, with all of the resulting consequences including forfeiture of any trophies, points and prizes.

Mr Tomáš Enge has 21 days in which to appeal this decision to the Court of Arbitration for Sport.
