Focus: Tasmania

The RACT recently purchased three iconic Tasmanian properties, Freycinet Lodge at Coles Bay, Cradle Mountain Hotel in the Tasmanian Wilderness World Heritage Area and Strahan Village on the West Coast of Tasmania. All delegates will need to ensure that they have a valid visa to enter Australia. You should allow a minimum of six weeks for the granting of a visa by the Australian embassy or consulate in your country.
