DID YOU KNOW IT?

9 December 1983 – Hungary requested to host a Formula One Grand Prix; the first possible option was a street circuit inside Budapest's Népliget Park that had hosted the 1936 Hungarian Grand Prix and rounds of the European Touring Car Championship from 1966 to 1970.

10 August 1986 – The Hungaroring, built in 1985, hosted the first Formula One Hungarian Grand Prix, that was also the first Formula One race to be held behind the Iron Curtain

5 June 2011 – Not even the rain spoiled the first WTCC visit at the Hungaroring, as 60,000 fans crowded the grandstands on Sunday; Chevrolet drivers Alain Menu and Yvan Muller shared race victories.

6 May 2012 – Local hero Norbert Michelisz won the second race in the Zengő Motorsport BMW; Michelisz took the lead after a wonder start from the third row of the grid and drove Hungarian fans crazy.

5 May 2013 – Rob Huff's SEAT León overtook Mehdi Bennani's BMW 320 TC on the outside of Turn 1, at the end of a safety-car intervention and claimed the first WTCC victory for the Münnich Motorsport team.
