TRAVEL INFORMATION - HOW TO GET TO SOCHI AUTODROM

Sochi Autodrom is approximately 30km away from the center of the city of Sochi, 10km away from Adler Railway Station, 10km from Sochi International Airport and 50km from Krasnaya Polyana.

Sochi Autodrom is a part of the Olympic Park, which helps accentuate its unique features. Magnificent Olympic venues, views of the Black sea and the surrounding snowy mountain peaks create an incredible backdrop for motor racing, while the advanced transport network, convenient infrastructure, hotels and a theme park nearby help to create the perfect conditions for fans to enjoy their visit to the 2014 FORMULA 1 RUSSIAN GRAND PRIX.






TRAVEL INFORMATION - HOW TO GET TO SOCHI AUTODROM

SPECTATOR TRANSPORT SYSTEM

Please note that restricted vehicle access will be in place on roads leading to Sochi Autodrom as well as areas in the immediate vicinity of the race track between 9th and 12th October. It is therefore advisable to use the transport system where possible.

Specifically for the 2014 FORMULA 1 GRAND PRIX OF RUSSIA, a network of additional bus routes and increased frequency of suburban trains to Sochi Autodrom will be in operation.

The Spectator Transport System, which includes a modern system of suburban trains Lastochka, is the most economical and fastest way to get to the Sochi Autodrom.


PARKING

In order to use the car parks, located close to the Sochi Autodrom, spectators need to purchase a Parking Permit in advance. On-site payment is not available.

A parking permit can be bought in the lobby of the Tulip Inn Hotel, which is located at: 354340, Russia, Sochi, Adler district, Imeretinskaya lowland, Olymiyskiy prospect 2.

The permit allows for one car to be parked at a specific parking space in area P8, see route map below.

Black Sea

Sochi is a city in Krasnodar Krai, Russia, located on the Black Sea coast near the border between Georgia/Abkhazia and Russia. The Greater Sochi area, which includes territories and localities subordinated to Sochi proper, has a total area of 3,526 square kilometres and sprawls for 145 kilometres along the shores of the Black Sea near the Caucasus Mountains.

Daniil Kvyat

T4 Grandstand will be renamed the Kvyat Stand during the 2014 FORMULA 1 RUSSIAN GRAND PRIX in honour of the young Scuderia Toro Rosso driver, Daniil Kvyat, the hugely popular home crowd favourite.

Google Street View

Following a visit to the track from special teams of drivers working for Google Street View you now have the opportunity to view the Sochi Autodrom, the Sochi Olympic Park and surrounding region, up close and in amazing detail.

Fan-TV

Fan-TV will be transmitted onto the giant screens, strategically placed around the track. Throughout the weekend, it will broadcast footage from previous races, as well as what's happening at the Russian Grand Prix weekend on and around the track.

Music

Lenny Kravitz will headline the musical performances at the 2014 FORMULA ONE RUSSIAN GRAN PRIX weekend. He is set to perform on Saturday 11th October 2014. On Friday 10th October guests will be greeted by DJ Leonid Rudenko, the author of 'Parade of Nations' mix for the Sochi 2014 Winter Olympic Games opening ceremony. And on Sunday 12th October Zveri and Ottawa bands will perform the weekend's closing show. Zveri are seven times winners of the MUZ-TV Best Rock Act award, winners of MTV Europe Music Awards Best Russian Act award. Ottawa's 'Smile' hit single ranked 2 in Russian music iTunes sales chart throughout the first half of 2014.

Multiple Circuits

Sochi Autodrom consists of two circuits layouts – the full length grand prix circuit, winding its way through Sochi Olympic park among the Olympic venues and used for hosting FORMULA 1 races, and the shorter, permanent circuit, used all year round for track days and other events.

Pit-Walkabout

All weekend ticket holders for the Russian Grand Prix will have access to the pit lane and get to see what is going on behind the scenes! The Pit Lane Walkabout will take place on Thursday, 9th October 2014.

The Last Mile

The volunteers of the Russian Grand Prix will create an amazing atmosphere for the fans, media representatives and Formula 1 teams as they make their way to the Sochi Autodrom. The "Last Mile" service will take place along the pedestrian routes all the way from the main railway stations, parking places and hotels of Imerentinskaya lowland to the entrance of the Sochi Autodrom.

Third Longest Circuit

The 5853 kilometre circuit is the third-longest circuit on the Formula One calendar, behind Spa-Francorchamps in Belgium and Silverstone in Great Britain.

Video & Race Control System

The Sochi Autodrom Race Control building is the first in the world to have a video control system with Real-Time Full HD technology. 48 Speed Dome cameras, located on the perimeter of the racing track, are connected by a fibre optic cable. These cameras give a 360-degree horizontal and a 180-degree vertical view, while providing a

32-x magnification. All 48 cameras can be controlled either from the Race Control building or with a special device on the track itself.



SOCHI AT A GLANCE

Sochi is one of the southernmost regions in Russia and the second-largest city of Krasnodar Krai. Located along the Black Sea coast, it is approximately 1,600km (995 mi) south of Moscow. The city has a permanent population of 399, 673 (2014) and Greater Sochi (includes four administrative districts: Central Sochi District, Lazarevskoye District, Khosta District, and Adler District) has 473, 206 residents, making it Russia's largest resort city.

Sochi is often unofficially called the 'Summer Capital' of Russia, or the Black Sea Pearl. Sochi is the biggest and busiest summer sea resort in Russia, attracting more than four million visitors annually with its amazing mountainous coastline, endless shingle beaches, warm sunny days, and bustling nightlife. From May to September Sochi's population at least doubles with tourists, including celebrities, and the political elite of the country visiting the region

Sochi belongs to a tiny part of Russia, which is located in the subtropical climatic zone. Sochi enjoys around 300 sunny days a year, which is unbelievable for Russia and only exceeded by the adjacent Krasnodar Krai coastal cities. This makes Sochi an ideal place to visit all year-round.

Greater Sochi occupies 145km along the Black Sea coastline. Its total area is 3,500km² (2,175 sq. mi) - three times larger than Moscow. However, most of the population is spread along the narrow coastline stripe, while the mountain area (1,900km²/1,180mi²) mostly belongs to Sochi National Park and partly to the Caucasian Biosphere Reserve. The city alignment is from north-west to south-east, from the neighboring city of Tuapse right to the Russian border with Abkhazia.

Hotel complex "Barkhatnye Sezony" ***

Complex "Alexandrovskiy Sad" is located near the subtropical park of total area of 300 hectares where more than 120 species of local flora are represented.

Complex "Chistye Prudy" located between the Seaside promenade and the Lake of the ornithological park.

"Ekaterininskiy Kvartal" is located on the seacoast, easy to access by walking through a spacious boulevard crowded by guests and locals at night.

Complex "Russkiy Dom" owes its name to numerous picturesque Slavic style restaurants.

NEW RULES IN 2014

There are some important changes to the F1 regulations for 2014.

Changes to the 2014 Technical and Sporting Regulations:

Power - it's out with 2.4-litre normally-aspirated V8 engines and in with 1.6-litre V6 turbo engines, revving to a maximum of 15,000rpm. While the old V8s produced more than 750bhp, the 2014 units put out around 600bhp with additional power coming from Energy Recovery Systems (see below).

Gearbox - gearboxes have eight forward ratios - rather than the previous seven - which each team must nominate ahead of the season.

Energy Recovery Systems (ERS) - from 2014, a larger proportion of each car's power comes from ERS which, together with the engine, makes up the powertrain or power unit. As well as generating energy under braking, ERS units also generate power using waste heat from the engine's turbocharger. Unlike the previous KERS - which gave drivers an extra 80bhp for just over six seconds per lap - the 2014 ERS gives drivers around 160bhp for approximately 33 seconds per lap. To compensate for the extra power being generated under braking by ERS, teams are allowed to use an electronic rear brake control system.

Fuel - to promote fuel efficiency, from 2014 fuel is limited to 100kg per race. Previously fuel was unlimited, but teams typically used around 160kg per race.

Minimum weight - to compensate for the increased weight of the 2014 powertrain, minimum weight has been increased from the current 642kg to 690kg.

Exhaust - unlike previously where two exhaust tailpipes were used, the 2014 regulations mandate the use of a single tailpipe, which must be angled upwards to prevent the exhaust flow being used for aerodynamic effect. Additionally, bodywork is not allowed to be placed behind the tailpipe.

Nose height - for safety reasons the height of noses has been reduced for 2014. The maximum height is 185mm (previously it was 550mm).

Front wing - front wings will be a little narrower from 2014 with the width reduced from 1800mm to 1650mm.

Rear wing - the rear wing also looks a little different for 2014. The previously legal lower beam wing has been outlawed and the main flap has become slightly shallower in profile. Support pillars, however, are allowed. The DRS slot is also bigger than in 2013.

Testing - in-season testing returns for 2014, albeit in a restricted format with the regulations allowing four tests of no more than two consecutive days at circuits where an event has taken place. There are also increased restrictions on wind tunnel testing and CFD simulations.

Points - double drivers' and constructors' points will be awarded at the final race of the Formula One season - Abu Dhabi for 2014 - in order to maximize focus on the championship until the end of the campaign.



NEW RULES IN 2014

Driver numbers - drivers will be asked to choose their race number, between 2 and 99, for the duration of their career in the FIA Formula One World Championship. Number 1 will be reserved for the current world champion, should he choose to use it. If more than one driver chooses the same number, priority will be given to the driver who finished highest in the previous year's championship. The driver number must be clearly visible on the front of the car and on the driver's crash helmet.

Additional Friday practice drivers - we are used to seeing teams replace one of their race drivers with a test driver for opening practice on a Friday. However, from 2014 teams are able to run up to four drivers - though still only two cars - in either Friday session.

New penalties - race stewards will have the option to hand out five-second penalties for minor infringements. Additionally, any driver who earns 12 penalty points on their superlicence during a 12-month period will be given a one-race ban.

Pole position trophy - a new trophy will be awarded to the driver who scores the most pole positions during the season. In the event of a tie, the trophy will be awarded to the driver who holds the greatest number of second places. If there is still a tie, the greatest number of third places will be taken into account and so on until a winner emerges.







Motorsports most famous street circuit takes six weeks to build up and organize, offering drivers with the challenge of negotiating numerous elevation shifts and very tight corners, including one of the slowest corners in F1 racing as well as one of the fastest. Due to its unique configuration, change in speeds and lack of straights, keeping the engine cool is a point of focus for the teams, as Formula One cars depend on air moving over the car to remove heat, and don't use formal cooling technology.

The combination of a fast, safe, high tech car with a talent pool of the best up-and-coming drivers in single-seater motorsport has made the series a must-see for fans of real racing.

Ten out of twenty-fours drivers of the current Formula One grid got their chance to race at the pinnacle of motorsport after proving their worth in the GP2 Series. In fact, over 60 drivers so far have received the opportunity to drive an F1 car as a result of their time in GP2 since we began.

Since 2005, drivers have graduated from GP2 to F1 every year; from our first ever champion Nico Rosberg to Marcus Ericsson this year. Five of our Champions are racing in F1 this season proving if need be that GP2 is the natural path to the pinnacle of motorsport.

Once again, 2014 promises more of the same as our young drivers fight to follow in the footsteps of their now famous forebears all the way to the top.

The Values

Since its inception the GP2 Series TM was designed to reflect five core values: performance, cost control, entertainment, safety and preparation. The sporting and technical regulations are the blueprint of the championship and are only changed if the proposed modifications fit into the template formed by these values, which remain the guiding principles of the GP2 Series TM.

Performance

GP2 lap times are highly competitive with the final few rows on the F1 grid, proving that there isn't another junior formula, which can match the performance levels of the GP2 Series TM. Engines which provide over 612bhp, no electronic gizmos such as traction control or power steering, plus ground effects and proper slick tyres make the GP2 cars powerful and tricky beasts to handle.

Cost control

Operating at about 1% of the cost of running a Formula One team, GP2 Series TM teams nevertheless race on the same tracks, on the same weekends, for the same audience and offer very impressive racing for the crowd and the F1 paddock to enjoy. With centralised purchasing, strict limits on testing and an outright ban on individual developments costs are kept in check, while modifications are made with an eye on how they will affect the price structure for the teams.

To cut down the costs even more in 2014, the organisers have decided to keep the GP2/11, the Series' third generation car for another year instead of introducing a new chassis.

Entertainment

By far GP2's biggest selling point is the excitement its races provide for the fans. With two races per weekend, reverse grids, compulsory pitstops, Prime and Option tyres and 26 identical cars on display, the series never fails to enthrall and entertain.

Safety

Racing at speeds very close to F1, safety is of course the highest priority. The GP2/11 car has passed every one of the stringent F1 FIA crash tests, and includes anti-intrusion panels, while wearing the HANS device is also compulsory. The series has a dedicated commitment to safety, which has been borne out over the last six years.

REGULATIONS

The GP2 Series is a one-make championship consisting of 26 identical cars. The chassis are designed by Dallara Automobili, and since 2012 has run under the specification GP2/11. The power base is a Mecachrome assembled 4L Renault V8 engine.



The GP2 Series uses **slick Pirelli tyres in four specifications** (super soft, soft, medium and hard) which are predetermined by Pirelli in advance of the race weekend.

Each driver has **five** sets of dry-weather tyres per weekend – three of "prime" specification and two of "option" specification. Each driver will also be provided with **three** sets of wet-weather tyres.

The compulsory pitstop during Race One remains, in which a minimum of two tyres must be changed. This pit stop may not be carried out until the driver has completed **six laps**.

No individual developments or upgrades are permitted in the series, and all spare parts must be purchased directly from the GP2 Series. Repairs of structural components must be carried out by Dallara in order to ensure integrity.

Weekend format and points allocation

A race weekend is composed of one practice session of **forty-five minutes** and one half hour qualifying session, followed by two races.

The qualifying session is a straight fight for fastest laptime, and determines the order of the grid for Race 1. **Four** points are awarded for pole position.

Race 1 is run over 170km or 60 minutes (except for Monaco where the race is run over 140km and in Budapest where the race is run over 160km), and each driver must complete one compulsory pitstop in which a minimum of two tyres must be changed.

In a change of regulations in 2014, unless he has used wet-weather tyres during Race 1, each driver must use at least one set of each specification of dry-weather tyres during Race One.

The **top ten drivers** score points (25, 18, 15, 12, 10, 8, 6, 4, 2, 1) with **two points** being awarded to the driver who set the fastest lap of the race.

The grid for Race 2 is determined by the finishing order of the first race, with the top 8 positions reversed. Race 2 is run over 120km or 45 minutes (except for Monaco where the race is run over 140km), with no pitstops allowed. The **top eight finishers** score points (15, 12, 10, 8, 6, 4, 2, 1) and the driver who sets the fastest lap scores **two points**.

Any driver who is not classified in the top ten positions at the end of the race or, didn't start the race from his normal grid position or, changed tyres during race two at a time when climatic conditions did not necessitate the use of a different specification of tyre, will not be eligible for points awarded for fastest lap.

There was drama and excitement in abundance, and with the championship going down to the wire in two of three years, we were treated to an epic fight for the crown.

And despite our series only running for four seasons, three of our GP3 Champions have reached the impressive heights of Formula 1 this year: Our first Champion Esteban Gutiérrez will drive for Sauber F1 Team in 2014 for a second season, whilst his successor Valtteri Bottas will continue driving for Williams F1 Team after both completed successful roles as F1 test drivers.

GP3 SERIES PHILOSOPHY AND VALUES

Since its inception the GP2 Series was designed to reflect five core values: performance, cost control, entertainment, safety and preparation. These values remain the guiding principles of the GP3 Series.

The GP3 Series has been designed to keep the GP2 philosophy and its values intact.

Performance

With GP3 laptimes beating those of its nearest rivals, it was clear from the outset that we were never going to be just another championship in the ever expanding pool of junior formulae. Over 400HP engines, and no hidden snazzy gadgets like traction control or power steering, means it's all about the driver with these machines. We've also been told they're a lot of fun to drive!

Cost control

Just like our sister Series GP2, GP3 races on the same tracks, on the same weekends and for the same crowds as Formula One with the same impressive display of racing – but for a minute fraction of the cost. Centralised purchasing, strict limits on testing and an outright ban on individual developments means costs are kept in check, while all modifications are made with an eye on how they affect the price structure for the teams.

Entertainment

By far GP3's biggest selling point is the excitement its races provide for the fans. With two races per weekend, reverse grids and 27 identical cars on display, the series never fails to enthrall and entertain. There is also the added bonus of being able to catch the Formula One race after GP3 has packed up for the day!

Safety

Racing at such high speeds means safety is of course of the uppermost priority: the GP3 car has passed every one of the stringent F1 FIA tests. GP2 has been committed to safety over the last six years; something we have ensured is mirrored in the GP3 Series.

Preparation

The record speaks for itself: there has never been an F1 feeder category as successful as the GP2 Series with over half of the 2014 Formula 1 grid consisting of GP2 graduates. GP3 is following in the footsteps of its big sister series with three of our GP3 Champions having already been snapped up by F1 teams for 2014 with 15 progressing to GP2 and beyond which is high praise indeed.
