
Whichever category speaks to you most directly, we hope you will enjoy all the sights and sounds our city and our circuit have to offer.





Super Seb takes third straight Singapore win

Sometimes the statistics just don't lie.

When Formula 1 arrived in Singapore for the sixth time, Sebastian Vettel was leading the World Championship by the handsome margin of 53 points, the Red Bull Renault driver comfortably clear of Ferrari's Fernando Alonso – both of them two-time Singapore winners.

By the time they left, Vettel had extended his lead to 60 points. The two men had duly finished first and second, Vettel making it a Singapore hat-trick of wins since 2011. It was the German's seventh win of 2013 and the 33rd of his career, set up by his fifth pole position of 2013.

Not that the 41st pole position of Vettel's F1 career was straightforward: he thought he had done enough for his second Marina Bay pole with his first run in the final stage of qualifying, returned to the Red Bull box and then sweated even more heavily than usual in the Singapore heat as Nico Rosberg's Mercedes, the Lotus of Romain Grosjean and Red Bull teammate Mark Webber all threatened to steal the all-important premier grid position away.

"I'd say this is physically the toughest race of the year," said a relieved World Champion.

"It's a very long circuit, with so many corners, and the humidity and heat are factors. It feels fantastic, though, when you get a lap right. It hasn't been on the calendar for long but already it feels like a classic."

Once the race got under way, Rosberg nosed ahead – but running too deep into Turn 1, the Mercedes man had to back off as Vettel calmly seized the initiative and sailed off into the Singapore night.

Vettel, 26, won the 61-lap race by a margin of 32.627 seconds from Alonso with Lotus Renault's Kimi Raikkonen a brilliant third after a weekend of physical pain from a 12-year-old back injury.

"The car was incredible," said Vettel after what looked like an easy win. "I said to the team, this doesn't just happen like that, by accident or by luck, there's hard work behind it and I appreciate it – it's just a pleasure to drive it around this crazy track!"

Alonso's fifth Singapore podium was made possible by a blindingly fast start which catapulted the two-time Singapore winner from seventh to third by the end of the opening lap.

"It was a fantastic start," Alonso agreed. "We didn't have the pace so we knew we had to invent something! That was the first possibility; the other was a different strategy that paid off with a second place that tastes like a victory for us."



Raikkonen performed superbly to bring his Lotus through from 13th on the grid for his first Singapore podium, a stunning round-the-outside move at Turn 14 on Jenson Button's McLaren Mercedes helping him on his way.

Not even a Safety Car intervention just before half-distance could halt Vettel's progress. It came when Daniel Ricciardo's Toro Rosso hit the wall on the outside of Turn 18 and expired. When the Safety Car went in after 30 laps Vettel again streaked away to assume command of the race once more.

With Vettel in such dominant vein, it was left to his Red Bull colleague Mark Webber to add a headline-grabbing finishing touch. His car expired on the final lap and Webber parked it at Turn 7. The laconic Australian thumbed a lift back to the pit lane and was duly picked up by Alonso – earning both men a reprimand.

Vettel completed F1's coveted race-by-race hat-trick by setting the fastest lap of 1 minute 48.574, an average speed of 167.940 kilometres per hour, on lap 46.

HISTORIC F1 CARS COME TO MARINA BAY

Did you like your skirt fixed, your bottom flat? Were you a fan of JYS, or was Emmo more your style? Were you around between 1966 and 1985, or are the legendary names of historic racing new to you?

Whatever the answers to those questions, anyone with the slightest emotional attachment to motor racing and its rich tradition cannot fail to be thrilled by the first appearance of Historic Formula One Cars at Marina Bay this year.

The FIA Masters Historic Formula One Championship has partnered with HGP to bring a 24-strong field of cars with some of the most evocative names in Grand Prix history to the streets of Singapore.

With no disrespect to the regular drivers in Masters Historic racing, names like Kubota, Folch and Lyons may not be entirely familiar – but names like Lotus, Fittipaldi, Williams and McLaren most certainly are.

The FIA Masters Historic Formula One Championship, inaugurated in 2004, is for Grand Prix cars built between 1966 and 1985. That means they bridge one of the most remarkable periods in F1 history, taking us from the 'Return to Power' in the mid-Sixties, when Sir Jack's Brabham Repco took the crown, through the brutal days of 'ground effect' cars to the turbo-charged time of the mid-Eighties when Alain Prost's McLaren TAG Porsche reigned supreme.

By way of example, series front-runner Joaquin Folch campaigns a 1981 Brabham BT49C owned by none other than Bernie Ecclestone, the man who turned Formula 1 into the global phenomenon we know today.

The Williams FW08 driven by Richard Eyre was used by Flying Finn Keke Rosberg, whose son Nico is this year's World Championship favourite, on his way to the 1982 title, while reigning FIA Masters Historic Formula One Champion Greg Thornton will be in the Lotus 91/5 cockpit once graced by the late and much-loved Italian driver Elio de Angelis.

Anyone who saw the recent Hollywood hit movie *Rush* will know the names of Hunt and Lauda were central to the dramatic 1976 F1 season. James Hunt's spectacular career saw him in Hesketh cars before his title-winning switch to McLaren that year; Frank Lyons' McLaren M26 is a throwback to that memorable year, while Frenchman Frédéric Fatien will be driving the very Hesketh 308B with which Hunt won the Dutch Grand Prix in 1975.

Crudely expressed, the 'ground effect' technology pioneered by Lotus in the late Seventies and arguably perfected by Patrick Head at Williams shaped the underside of the car and added side-skirts to accelerate airflow underneath, eliminate air pressure and thus suck the car on to the track surface. It briefly held sway until the 'flat bottom' rule was introduced in 1983.



All 24 cars will run with glorious-sounding Cosworth DFV engines rev-limited to 10,000 rpm.

No laptops or computers will be seen in pit lane; there will be no digital data on the steering wheels; there will be just drivers and their cars – some of the most remarkable ever built in the six decades and more of World Championship history.



PORSCHE CARRERA CUP ASIA

The Singapore race is scheduled as Round 10 of the 12-round 2014 series but will in fact be the ninth race – round five, the second of two races slated for Zhuhai, was cancelled because of torrential rain.

The man leading the 2014 charge is Malaysia-based New Zealander Earl Bamber, racing for LKM Racing, who has won five times this season on his way to a current points total of 137. The 24-year-old is simply carrying on the sparkling form that carried him to the 2013 PCCA title – and he comes to Marina Bay as the defending race-winner here from last season as well.

Bamber did the 'hat-trick' on the Singapore streets last season with pole position, victory and fastest race lap of 2m 20.997, an average lap speed of 114.004 km/h over the 12-lap race, so it's no wonder he is looking forward to coming back.

"Coming to the Singapore Formula 1 circuit is probably the highlight of the Porsche Carrera Cup Asia calendar," Bamber says. "It's the best race, it's in the city, with such a big crowd, it's our only street track of the year for us – everyone gets really excited for Singapore and the atmosphere is really cool."

Like most drivers, Bamber also has a spot on the challenging Marina Bay layout that particularly appeals to him: "Thinking about my favourite corners of the track, I think it has to be the famous Singapore Sling. It catches a lot of drivers out into the wall but it's a really nice section of circuit, especially for a Porsche Carrera Cup car. These cars like to eat a lot of kerb and it's always good fun to bounce through there up on two wheels. It makes it entertaining for us and it's a pretty special thing to drive a Porsche round the streets."

Closest to Earl this year is the Austrian who would love to claim his maiden PCCA crown. That's 26-year-old Martin Ragginger, from the Mozart city of Salzburg – and wouldn't winning here be music to his ears! Ragginger has only two race wins in 2014 to his name but sheer consistency sees the Team Porsche Holding driver sitting just 11 points adrift of Bamber.

A further five points behind is China's former F1 hopeful Ho-Pin Tung, now 29 and racing for Hong Kong outfit Budweiser Team Absolute Racing, who took fifth place overall in the 2013 PCCA as he did the previous season.

The only other race-winner this season so far is another familiar name – Alexandre Imperatori, the 2012 series champion. The Hong Kong-based Imperatori, 27, won round three in Shanghai but hasn't been back to the podium since finishing second in round four in Zhuhai.

In Class B it's Bamber protégé Alif Hamdan who leads the way for Nexus Racing. The 23-year-old Malaysian has racked up six class victories for a haul of 140 points, which puts him 10 clear of evergreen 49-year-old Francis Tjia of OpenRoad Racing.

Next up is Singapore's own Yuey Tan on 126 points who has one class victory in Shanghai in 2014 to date and, like Bamber, is looking forward to racing in his home city.



"The Singapore Grand Prix circuit is very special to me," says the 32-year-old businessman who campaigns with Dorr Havelock Racing. "It's my home grand prix and even though I don't get to practice on it, I still like it very much. I dream about it sometimes!"

That doesn't mean Marina Bay can't be a bit of a nightmare at times, especially if the weather is fickle.

"The track is quite different in the wet and the dry," Tan adds. "The thing about the wet is that there are a lot of road lines around and these can catch you out. A lot of them are covered up, but sometimes they can get you. In wet conditions, not only do you have to apply the throttle a lot more cautiously, but also watch out for the lines.

"There's a lot more grip in the dry, but I try not to over-drive the car as I would in some other areas because there is no run off in Singapore. After 'making friends' with the wall in 2010, I don't want to do that again...."

A field of some 28 911 GT3 Cup (Type 991) Porsches will race on the Singapore streets. The 3.8-litre flat six engine delivers 480 bhp at 7500 rpm, its six-speed gearbox worked by a pneumatic paddle shift, a PCCA first for 2014.

This will be the series' third appearance in 2014 as support category to Formula 1, but as Bamber is quick to point out, nothing else comes close.

"It's a lovely event," says the New Zealand star who is also making a name for himself in the Porsche Mobil 1 Supercup series on the other side of the world.

"I was lucky enough to race in Monaco earlier this year which is the jewel of Europe, but I almost enjoy Singapore more as a grand prix. Everyone enjoys the spirit. You walk around with a smile on your face all weekend."


OLD SUPREME COURT & CITY HALL
