Re: Clarification of article 10.10.3 in the Sporting Regulations

Decision

Rationale : Clarification to define a car with or without AC

Art. 10.10.3

Limitation of the continuous driving time to 80 minutes in races where the ambient temperatures will reach 32°C (perceived temperature).

Only for cars without air conditioning if the maximum ambient temperature predicted during a race is higher than 32°C (or at the stewards' discretion), the maximum consecutive driving time must not exceed 80 minutes throughout the duration of the race.

A car will be considered with air conditioning if, when in motion, the car is able to respect the following rule:

- The temperature around the driver must be maintained at a figure less than or equal to the external temperature;
- Get the temperature back down to the value defined above in 8 minutes maximum after a car stop or safety car period.

A car will be considered without air conditioning if it is not able to respect the above rule.

If the driver at the 'pit-in' loop and at the following 'pit-out' loop is the same, the driving time will be considered as consecutive – although the time in the pit will not be taken into account for the calculation (with reference to the article on driving time).

The minimum rest time must be 30 minutes between consecutive stints.

The official maximum ambient temperature predicted will be published 2 hours before the start of the race.
