PRESS CONFERENCES

FORMULA ONE

The Media Centre will host four official FIA press conferences during the race weekend.

There will be one press conference on each of the four days during the event. All FIA press conferences take place in the international press conference area, located on the first floor of the Media Centre. Transcripts will be distributed within the Media Centre. Please note that only FIA Accredited media may attend.

Thursday 23 March – 15:00 hrs

Participants: drivers chosen by the FIA F1 Head of Communications and Media Delegate

Friday 24 March – 18:00 hrs

Participants: team personalities chosen by the FIA F1 Head of Communications and Media Delegate

Saturday 25 March – 18:00 hrs

Participants: top three drivers of the qualifying session

Sunday 26 March – 18:00hrs

Participants: top three finishing drivers

ADDITIONAL FIA ACCREDITED MEDIA OPPORTUNITIES

Qualifying: All drivers eliminated in Q1 or Q2 will be available for media interviews immediately after the end of each session, as well as drivers who participated in Q3 and are not required to take part in the post qualifying press conference.

Race: Any driver retiring before the end of the race will be available for media interviews after his return to the paddock. In addition, all drivers who finish the race outside the top three will be available immediately after the end of the race for media interviews.

During the race every team will make at least one senior spokesperson available for interviews with officially accredited TV crews. A list will be made available in the Media Centre.

WORKING IN THE MEDIA CENTRE

The FIA Media Centre for the 2017 Formula 1® Rolex Australian Grand Prix is located in Pit Building 1, which also houses Race Control. This building is at the northern end of the Start-Finish Line, close to Pit Lane exit.

The International Media Car Park, for permit holders only, is behind the Race Personnel and Paddock Club parking areas adjacent to the Formula 1® Paddock.

Access to this Car Park is through Gate 1, the main entrance on Canterbury Road. When you leave your car, walk back towards the starting grid and the Media Centre is in the two-storey building straight ahead of you.

The National Media Car Park, also for permit holders only, is at the 'Village Green' at the southern end of the circuit and is accessed from Gate 10 via Fitzroy Street.

FIA Accredited Journalists and Radio representatives will be located on level one of the FIA Media Centre in Pit Building 1. FIA Accredited Photographers are located in the FIA Photographers' Area in the Media Compound, a few meters north of the FIA Media Centre.

All accredited journalists and photographers must register at their respective Media Receptions upon arrival at the circuit.

Staff at the Reception Desk will assist with internet access, seating allocation and locker keys.

Coffee and hot drinks as well as light snacks and soft drinks will be available to purchase from Wednesday through to Sunday in the Media Café, located in the media compound.

If you have any queries or concerns about working in the Media Centre please contact staff at the Reception Desk.

INFORMATION FOR PHOTOGRAPHERS

PHOTOGRAPHIC SUPPORT SERVICES

Nikon and Canon will be located in the Media Compound.

PHOTOGRAPHERS SHUTTLE SERVICE

STANDARD SERVICES

The following services are available to all media on arrival at the circuit, without pre-booking:

STANDARD PHONE SERVICES

Standard phone and fax services will be available to all media without a connection fee. Phones will be located at the front of the media work room.

INTERNET SERVICES

A public internet network will be available in both the Media Centre and Photographic Centre. This network will provide an Ethernet hand off point at most locations as well as a wireless network. This service will run at a speed of approximately 30/30 Mbps over a shared network. This will include Internet browsing, mail services and FTP services.

2017 FIA FORMULA ONE WORLD CHAMPIONSHIP™ • Key F1 Regulation Changes

The cars, the bodywork and the tyres – ‘fatter and faster!’

For possibly the first time, the look of the cars has been a central part of the creation of the new regulations for 2017.

The cars are set to look much more ‘aggressive’ and will be heavier and wider – and run on much fatter tyres. The cars are two metres wide, 20 cm wider than they have been for 20 years. The tyres have increased in width by more than 20 per cent.

The wings will also be wider and the rear wing will be lower than in 2016.

Tyres

The front tyres have expanded from a 2016 size of 245 mm wide thread to 305 mm. The rear tyres from 325 mm wide thread to 405 mm wide thread.

Wings

The front wing has increased from a 1650 mm span to 1800 mm. The rear wings are lower, but wider – changing from 750 mm wide, and 950 mm high, to 950 and 800, respectively.

Weight

The overall gross weight has increased from 702 kg maximum to 722 kg plus tyres (estimated at five kgs).

Speed

The various and many changes are expected to improve lap times by more than three seconds due, in particular, to “aerodynamic rules evolution, wider tyres and reduction of car weight”.

The final generation 2016 cars were fast enough to set track records at many circuits including Bahrain and Austria. World champion Nico Rosberg recorded a pole lap time at the Hungarian Grand Prix that was more than two seconds faster than in 2015.

Engines

The 1.6-litre hybrid turbos are set to continue this year and remain until at least 2020.

The engine token system has been abandoned and will no longer be used.

The price of engines, for customer teams, has been reduced by one million Euros per season and a further reduction by three million euros is set for 2018.

A boost pressure constraint is being introduced in 2017.

Drivers are to be limited to a maximum of four power units per season, instead of five as in 2016.

Sound

Calls for more noise from the engines have been heard. Higher revving engines with an increased level of noise are promised.

Safety Car starts and re-starts

If a race starts behind a Safety Car, as in Monaco, Britain and Brazil in 2016, a standing re-start will be used when the Safety Car returns to the pits and the track conditions are deemed to be safe for racing.

Qualifying

Qualifying continues to be one hour of on-track action broken into three parts – a Q1 period of 16 minutes followed by two further sessions of 15 and 14 minutes respectively for Q2 and Q3.

Hamilton heads clear of the chasing pack • 2016 Race Report

Nico Rosberg claimed a well-earned victory and a perfect start to his determined bid for a first world drivers' title on Sunday when he won a spectacular, exciting and both incident- and drama-laden 2016 Formula 1 Rolex Australian Grand Prix.

The 30-year-old German came home first ahead of his Mercedes team-mate defending drivers' world champion Lewis Hamilton with four-time champion German Sebastian Vettel finishing third for Ferrari.

Australian Daniel Ricciardo was fourth for Red Bull Racing in a contest interrupted — and suspended for 20 minutes — by the first red flag at the Albert Park Circuit in 21 years since the Australian race came to Melbourne in 1996.

The suspension came after 18 laps when two-time champion Spaniard Fernando Alonso, in a McLaren Honda, collided with Mexican Esteban Gutierrez of the new Haas Ferrari team.

Alonso's car flew off track, hit the barriers and rebounded and rolled high into a gravel trap. His car was destroyed, but both men were unhurt in the crash, Alonso waving to the fans as he walked away.

Rosberg's win was his second in Melbourne, following his triumph in 2014, and the 15th of his career. "It's been a great weekend," he said. "The car has been unreal and to beat the Ferraris is just great. I'm super excited..."

Behind Ricciardo, Brazilian Felipe Massa took fifth place for Williams ahead of a superb sixth place for Frenchman Romain Grosjean on his debut with the new American Haas team.

German Nico Hulkenberg finished seventh for Force India ahead of Finn Valtteri Bottas in the second Williams and Spaniard Carlos Sainz, who held off his frustrated Toro Rosso team-mate Dutch teenager Max Verstappen to take ninth.

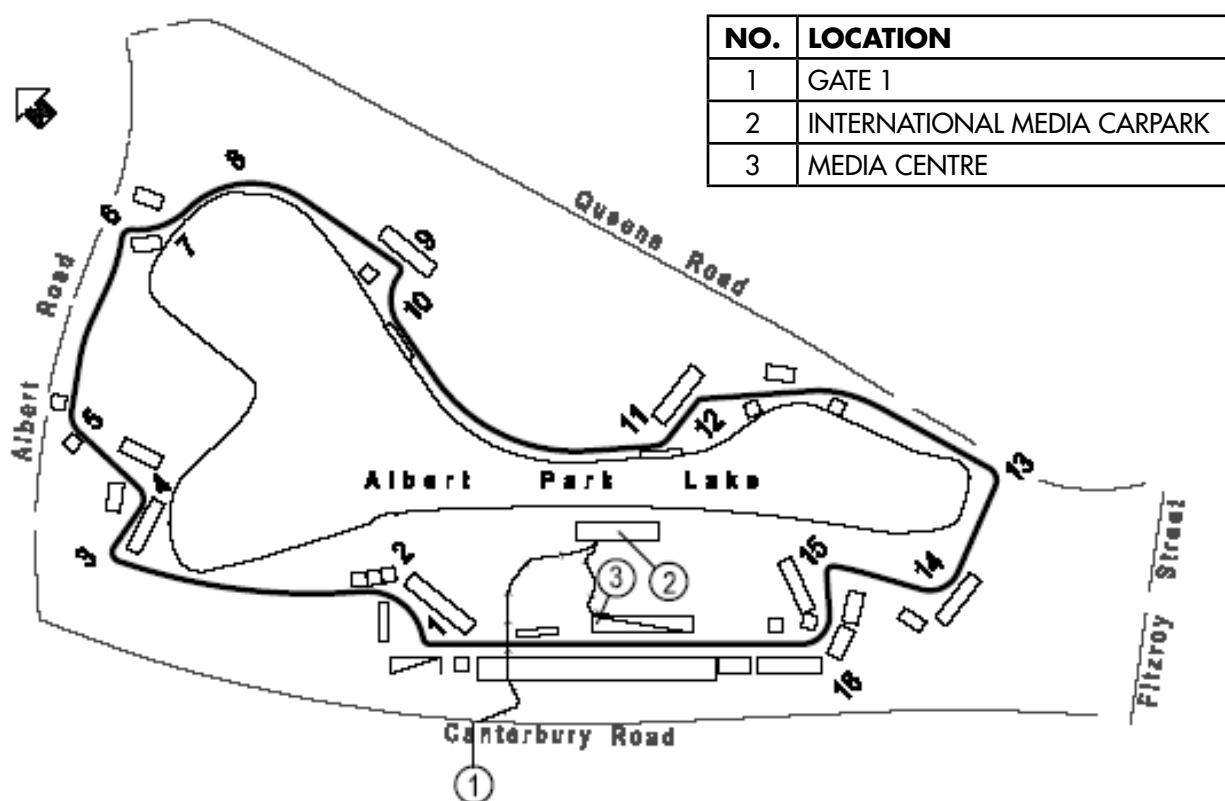

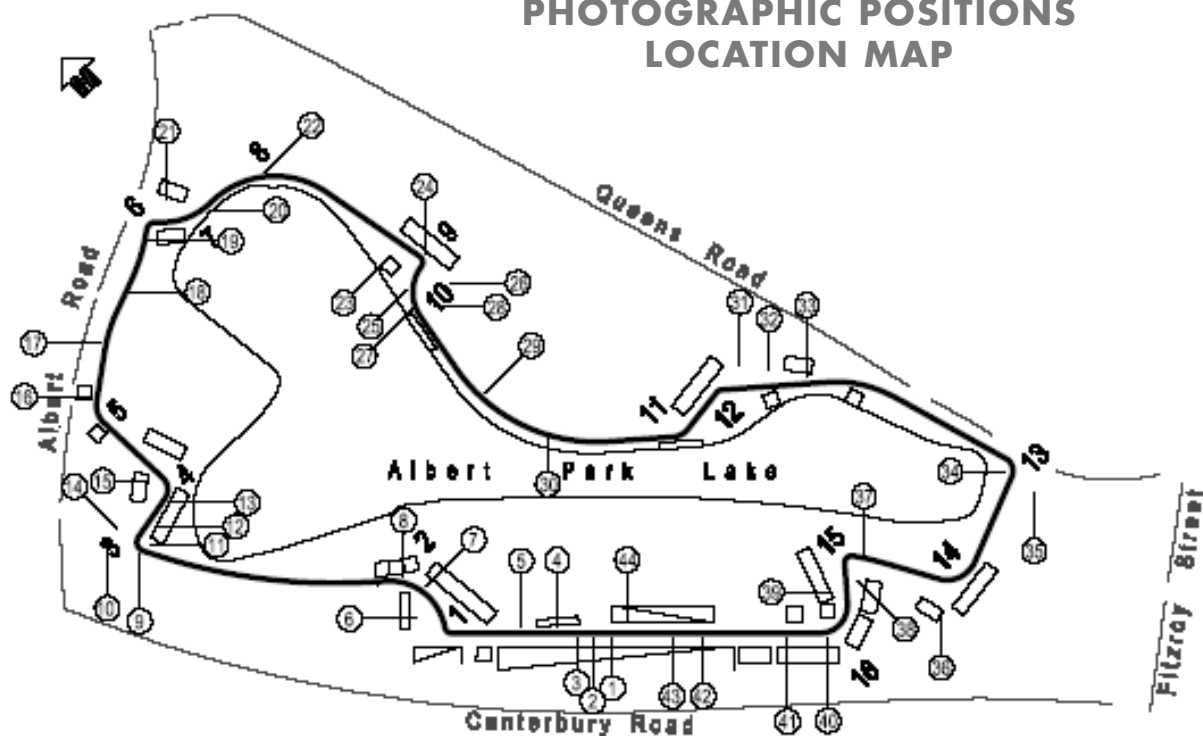
