DUTCH GRAND PRIX 2021

The return of the Formula 1 Heineken Dutch Grand Prix to Zandvoort, after 36 years of absence, was a huge success. Together with all parties involved, history was written last year. On the renovated circuit of CM.com Circuit Zandvoort a diverse racing program was presented with the ultimate highlight being the Formula 1 race on Sunday, September 5th. Despite the fact that only two-thirds of the intended audience was allowed to attend the event due to covid restrictions, the sea of orange created an unprecedented atmosphere in the stands. Max Verstappen's victory in front of a delirious home crowd was a fitting finale to the race weekend.

An estimated 70 million fans worldwide watched the race weekend at Zandvoort via television. The Netherlands, and Zandvoort in particular, have been put on the map. A showcase of Dutch entrepreneurship, organizational skills, entertainment and sports fans.

ABOUT ZANDVOORT

Zandvoort is a small beach town in The Netherlands with approximately 17.000 inhabitants. Within a half hour drive of the nation's capital, Amsterdam. Zandvoort is a popular destination for both the Dutch and the foreign tourist. It is known for its almost 9-kilometre-long beach with over 35 trendy beach pavilions. And with five-million-day tourists and 1 million overnight stays every year, it is still the leading seaside resort in the Netherlands.

The small town is not only known for its beautiful beaches and nature, but also for the racetrack that has been there since 1948. With a history of 31 F1 races, famous drivers. Many other motorsport races are being held at CM.com Circuit Zandvoort, year round. The town is inextricably linked to racing. The locals love it and always give a warm welcome to racing fans from around the world.

REJUVENATED TRACK

The entire track looks new per 2021. Adjustments were made ranging from a new layer of asphalt to a modified pit building and from new curbstones to approximately 90,000 temporary seats that have been created for this event. The classic race track still has 14 turns, still is 4.3 km long. Some turns have been specially modified for the F1 races in Zandvoort. The Arie Luyendykbocht and the Hugenholtzbocht have become banked corners with a slope of 32% (18 degrees). This did result in spectacular battles in 2021 in these banked corners. On this rejuvenated historic F1 circuit we are Ready for More.

Orange Family Event

Besides being known for its enormous cycling culture, the Netherlands has more bicycles (23 million) than inhabitants (17 million), the Netherlands is also known for its orange fans. Last year we saw visitors from all ages, resulting in a family event.

The Max factor

Max Verstappen his success in Formula 1 has converted almost everyone in The Netherlands to race fans! With thousands of racing fans in the stands in the Netherlands is a dream come true for all Dutch racing fans young and old!

ACCESSIBILITY

Sustainable transport

The Formula 1 Heineken Dutch Grand Prix is the only Grand Prix in the world with a train station within walking distance of the circuit. And that's not all! Over 70% of all racefans will use sustainable transport to reach CM.com Circuit Zandvoort. As you would expect the Dutch prefer to travel by bike, with over 26.000 fans expected to come to Zandvoort by bike each day. Others use public transport, such as the bus or the train, and even 5% of fans are expected to come to the event on foot.

On that note; for 2022 the organisers do not offer any parking spaces anymore for regular ticket holders, as all other sustainable and more comfortable options are preferred by this group. And discussions are ongoing concerning a desired decrease in car use with Formula 1 and our partners.

Mobility in Zandvoort

Zandvoort has a unique lay-out and has two road disclosures. In this part of the Media Guide an overview of all the mobility measures is given to assure a pleasant stay in and to Zandvoort.

Road closures

During the event days the roads to Zandvoort are closed to anyone without a FOM car pass. The reasoning behind this is to avoid traffic and therefore delays. Zandvoort is familiar with traffic delays during regular summer days. This is also expected during the event days. Please keep this in mind and travel early to avoid traffic.

Parking

All public parking spots in Zandvoort are closed from Thursday up to and including Sunday as they will become reserved parking areas. In the beginning of the week there are some public parking spots available however be aware of the fact that these are paid parking spots. Please park in the reserved parking slots which have been allocated for media as much as possible. If you choose to park at public parking spots, please be aware this is at own costs and risks.



BIKE

Media can enter the circuit with a scooter or bike via gate 2. Please park your vehicle at the media parking facility next to the media centre entrance (down stairs). It is not allowed to cycle or ride over the circuit other than from and to the entrance at gate 2. To enter the circuit, you need to collect a official accreditation sticker from the F1 and show your media accreditation at the gate.

PUBLIC TRANSPORT

Public Bus Transport

The bus is one of the best options for everyone staying or living in the Amsterdam region (incl. Amstelveen, Uithoorn, Aalsmeer) and Schiphol/Hoofddorp. This is also a direct and comfortable transport option from Amsterdam Zuidooost. Visitors from outside these regions mainly choose other transport options, which means that you can travel to the circuit by bus comfortably and with less pressure.

Not only can you travel by bus throughout the region of Amsterdam, Meerlanden and Haarlem- IJmond, but bus lines 300 (all days) and 356 (Saturday and Sunday) run directly from Haarlem Station to the main entrance of the circuit. Within 14 minutes you can be at Gate 1 from Haarlem Station. Connexxion runs between 10 and 12 times an hour on average, so you never have to wait long for the next bus. Bus lines 300 and 356 run directly to Zandvoort and back towards Haarlem train station during inflow (08:00-12:00) and outflow (after F1 practice, qualification and race), so there is no need to transfer between buses. The buses also run directly from Schiphol/Hoofddorp.

Train

The Dutch Grand Prix is the only Grand Prix in the world with a train station within walking distance of the circuit. Specially for the event, a large number of extra trains run during the Dutch Grand Prix. From the NS-station Zandvoort aan Zee it is less than 15 minutes' walk to the entrance of the circuit. Extra trains run between Amsterdam Central Station and Zandvoort Station, so you never have to wait long for the next train. You can travel to Zandvoort with your OV chip-card or buy a ticket online in advance.



MEDIA PARKING AT P-ZUID & SHUTTLE


For media, there is a parking lot situated at P-De Zuid. There are parking spots available for accredited media with a corresponding FOM Media Parking sticker. The sticker needs to be requested up front via FIA and can be collected in the MAC with your media accreditation. Media should follow the following signage and routes to Zandvoort. The most convenient way to drive is by taking A9 to Alkmaar. Then take the N205 to Zandvoort which guides you through Haarlem. Eventually the signage below will show up on the roads.



From the Media Parking there will be shuttles to Zandvoort circuit according to the following timetable (8-10 minute drive) the buses will come around every 10 minutes:

- Wednesday August 31st: 11.30 – 19.00
- Thursday September 1st: 08.30 – 21.30
- Friday September 2nd: 06.30 – 23.30
- Saturday September 3rd: 06.30 – 23.30
- Sunday September 4th: 06.30 – 23.30

The shuttles will stop at NH Hotel at Gate 2.



Shuttle service gate 2 to Media Centre:

Past the security check at Gate 2, there is a media pick-up point at the Shell station. Buggies will be stationed there to drive all media back and forth to the Media Centre in the pit building.

MEDIA ACCREDITATION CENTRE (MAC)

The CM.com circuit can only be entered with the special FIA passes that need to be requested through the FIA. The Media Accreditation Centre (MAC) is situated at Hotel NH Zandvoort. Located directly across the circuit, with limited car park availability for pick-up.



The accreditation center is situated in meeting room 2. There will be direction signs.



By car

Follow the route to the circuit, you can park at the private parking lot at Hotel NH Zandvoort. On Wednesday, you can reach Zandvoort and the MAC without check points or road blocks. From Thursday on, you can only enter Zandvoort via one route. Take the N205 and N201 to Zandvoort which guides you through Haarlem. You can pass the check points coming into Zandvoort by showing your ID and official FIA/FOM accreditation confirmation letter. Please note, there is very limited parking space at the MAC. Parking at the NH Zandvoort Hotel is only allowed to collect your accreditation.

Photographers' shuttle circuit service

Due to the Covid rules, there were no visitors in the General Admission (GA) area in 2021 and the Circuit Photo Shuttle could drive over part of the service road. This edition, in 2022, the GA area is full of fans so the Circuit Photo Shuttle can no longer drive over the service road.

The photographers' shuttle buses will go on the track in between races to pick-up and drop-off photographers if the program permits. The busses leave from T3. This is within walking distance of the Media Centre as indicated on the map (see appendix B). They will stop at three fixed positions at the track as shown on the map and leave the track via the pit lane to return to their start position. A time schedule will be provided at the Official Notice Board in the Media Centre. If there are changes in the program, it can occur there is no time left to go out. Race Control will make that call.

Photographers should know until which moment it is allowed to cross the track. Always go for certainty: ask a marshal post for permission, before you cross the track. They are in contact with Race Control. It is not allowed to cross the track without permission. There are various spots allocated for photographers to work. These spots are indicated on the map.

Track opening: within 5 minutes after the end of each event, indicated by a car with a green flag that goes around the track.

Attention! Please take note of the Red Zones on the map, do not stay there!

The Red Zone Map can be found on the Official Notice Board at the Welcome desk.

Finish Podium Photo Regulations

Only a selected group of appointed Parc Ferme Photographers have access to the pitwall for Podium Photos, including a selected group of Team Photographers. Other Photographers are allowed to stand on the main straight when permission is given by officials. There is no structure or podium where photographers can take their podium images and it is not allowed to enter the pitlane, parc ferme or pitwall without special authorization of **FIA F1 Media Delegate**.


ACCIDENTS AND EMERGENCIES

- Contact first response via radio (channel 1)
- State your name, organisation/role and exact location
- Briefly explain the accident and describe the state of the victim.
- Check victim for breathing and consciousness
- Comfort the victim and stay with him/her
- Wait for arriving first responders or emergency services



FIRE

- Contact first response via radio (channel 1)
- State your name, organisation/role and exact location
- Mark the location of the accident and keep bystanders at a distance
- Briefly explain what or whom you need
- If possible, try to extinguish the fire
- Wait for arriving first responders or emergency services – Without putting yourself at risk



EVACUATION

- Carefully listen to your radio and follow given instruction
- Proceed to the indicated muster point
- Do NOT take initiative but follow the given instructions
- Stay on the indicated muster point and await further information.



Last year, Circuit Zandvoort underwent major renovations, both on and off the track. With new asphalt, banked corners, a modified pit lane and many more changes, the circuit got its required Grade 1 license to hold a F1 race in Zandvoort. A large number of permanent and temporary modifications have also been made off the race track. To provide safe and comfortable access for all fans, three entrances and two additional tunnels have been constructed. In addition, nearly 85,000 temporary seats have been built especially for the event.

This year, minor adjustments were made to the event grounds. For example, the surface of a number of zones have been modified and some catering tents and food and beverage stands have been relocated.


