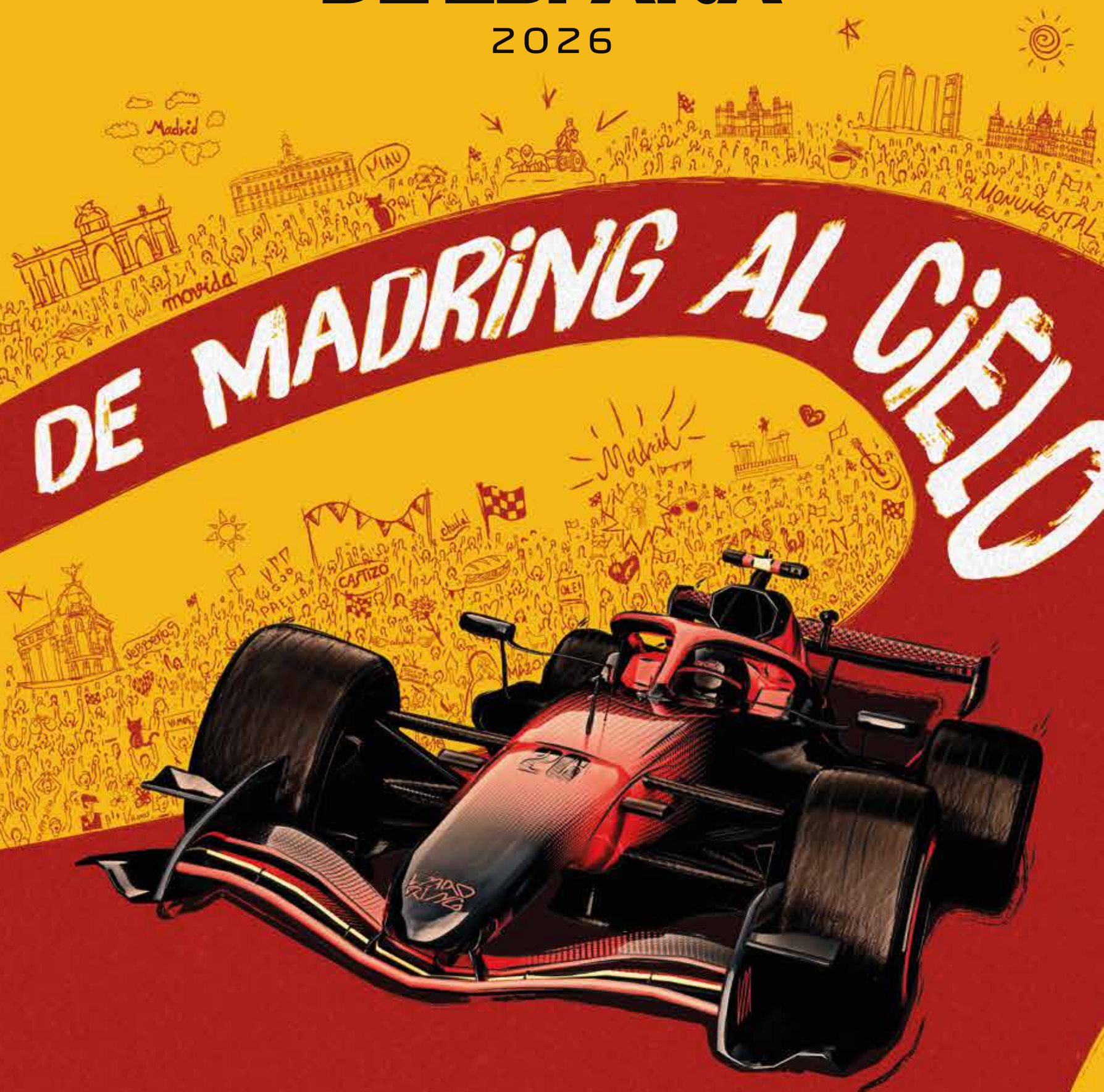

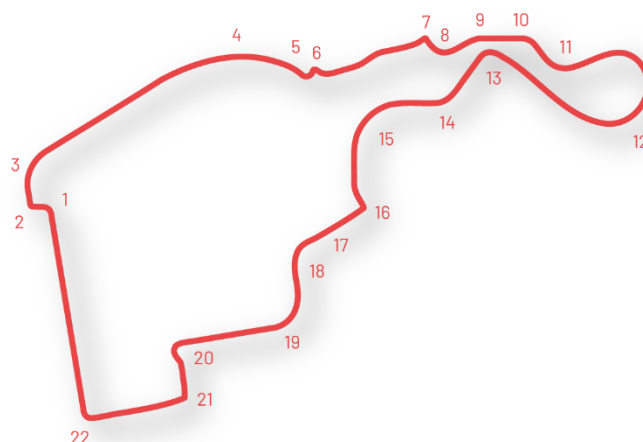

1.2 MADRING - CIRCUIT MAP OVERVIEW



A spectacular new addition to the Formula 1 calendar. Madrid's 5.416km MADRING combines permanent racing facilities with sections of public roads to deliver a unique hybrid circuit. The FIA Grade 1 layout features 22 corners, dramatic elevation changes and multiple high-speed straights where cars are expected to exceed 340km/h. La Monumental is the circuit's signature feature in Turn 12 as it is the longest banked corner on the Formula 1 World Championship calendar.

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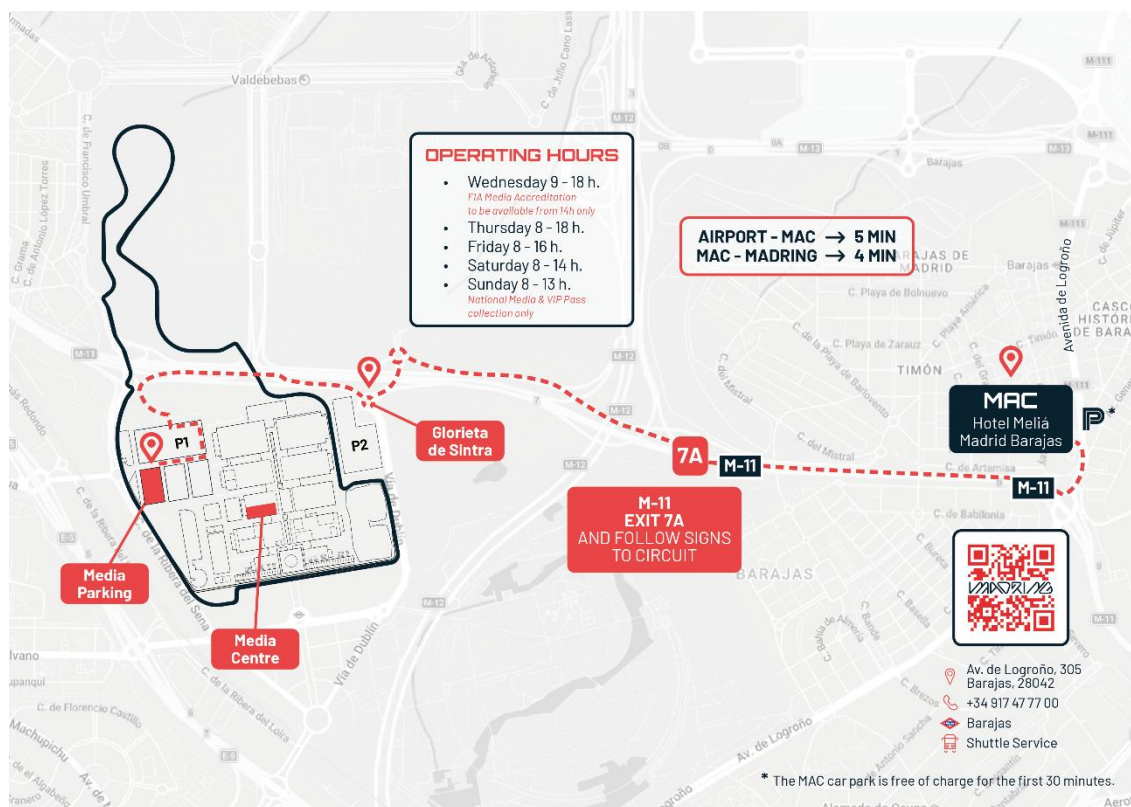

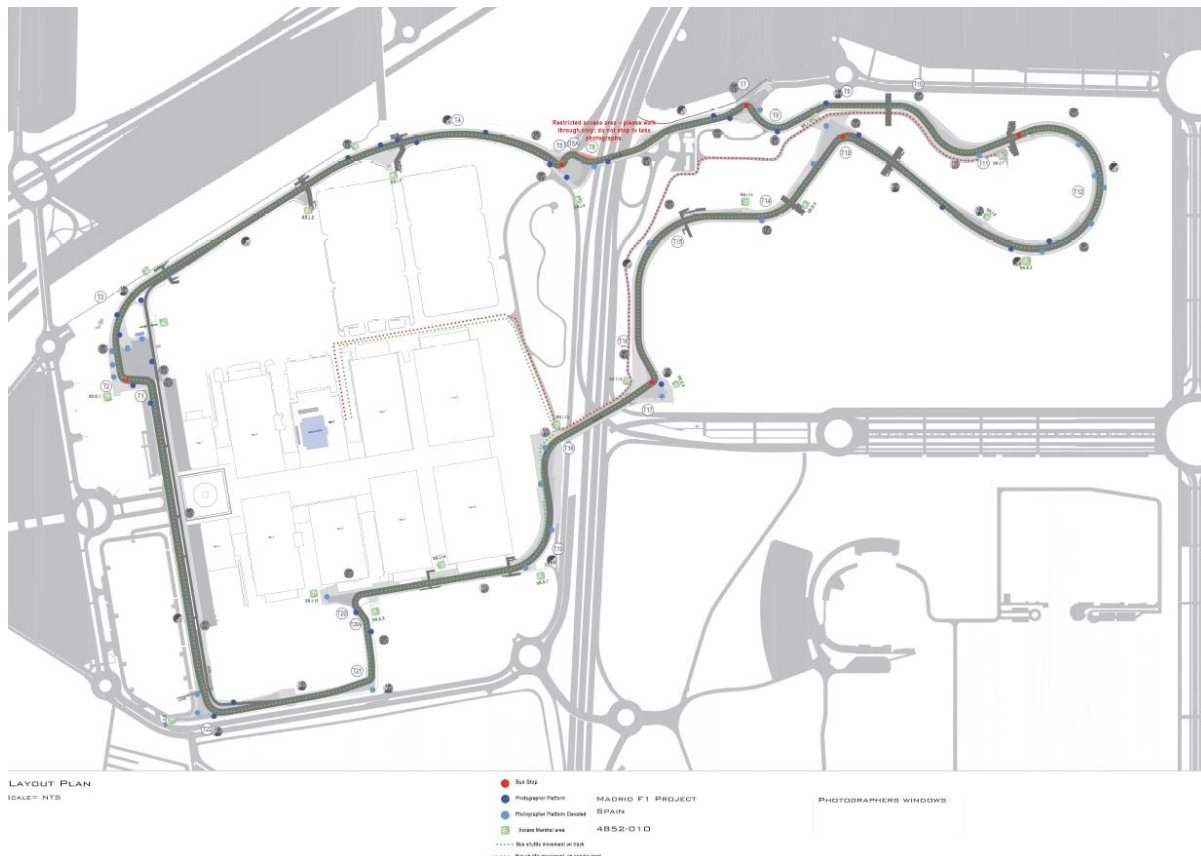

MEDIA TRANSPORT, CAR PARK INFORMATION & SHUTTLES

Airport Hotel Shuttle to Media Hotel & Media Accreditation Centre

Shuttle buses from the Airport Terminal 1, 2 and 4 to Hotel Meliá Barajas operate from 07:15 - 00:55.

The shuttle buses are blue navy buses labeled with the names of "Meliá Barajas" and "Hotel Madrid Alameda Aeropuerto affiliated by Meliá".

Remark: Pickup times at the terminals are approximate and may be subject to change due to causes beyond the control of the hotel. Seats are limited.

Departure at Terminal 1, 2 and 4:

Terminal 1: At arrivals (Floor 0), you have to go outside and proceed to the right (in front of hall 2). The "Hotel Shuttle" stop is located in front of the Lost Luggage Office, almost at the very end of the terminal.

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Terminal 2: At arrivals (Floor 0), you have to go outside, pass the taxi rank and you will find where the "Hotel Shuttle" stop is located.

Terminal 4: At arrivals (Floor 0) you have to go outside, pass the taxi rank and on the left handside, after the transit bus stop No.1, you will find the "Hotel Shuttle" stop.

From the Hotel Meliá Barajas to the Airport Terminal 1, 2 and 4, the Hotel Shuttle operates daily from 04:35 - 17:05.

Seats can be booked at the reception desk from the Hotel Meliá Barajas to the airport at the time of check-in at the hotel.

MAC Shuttles / Media Hotel to Media Car Park at the Circuit

Complimentary shuttle buses will be running from the Media Accreditation Centre / Media Hotel located at the Hotel Meliá Madrid Barajas, Av. de Logroño, 305, Barajas, 28042 Madrid between Wednesday - Sunday. Media Car Park at the Circuit

Accredited media have access to a limited number of car park spaces at the circuit. Journalists wishing to use this facility must request a car park pass when collecting their accreditation at the Media Accreditation Centre. As availability is limited, passes will be distributed on a first-come, first-served basis upon arrival at the Media Accreditation Centre.

Access to the media car park area will be via Glorieta de Sintra, and all instructions provided by Security and Access staff must be followed at all times.

Public transportation by Metro to the Circuit

From the "Feria de Madrid" Metro station (Line 8, Nuevos Ministerios - Airport T4), you can walk to the Media Centre in approximately 15 minutes. To do so, exit via the Avenida del Partenón exit and follow the signs to the bridge after Turn 3. Once inside the venue, follow the signs for "Centro de Prensa - Media Centre".

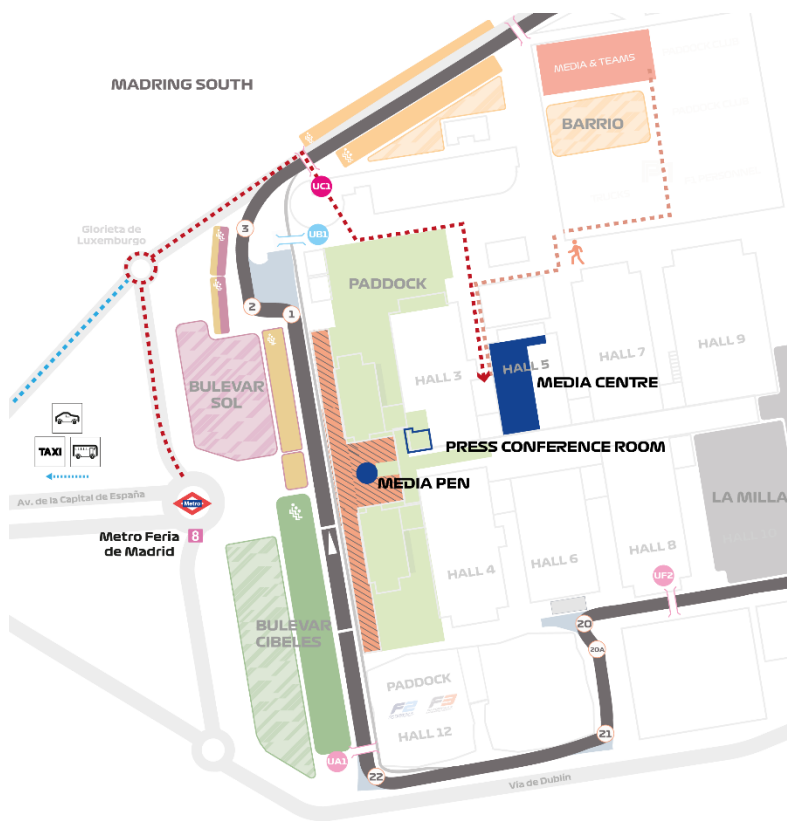
Ride-share apps & taxis to the Circuit

There are two options for reaching the circuit by Ride-Share/Taxi service:

1. The official Ride Share/Taxi point is at the roundabout Monumento a Don Juan de Borbón. From here, it is a 20-minute walk to the paddock, entering via circuit bridge UC 1 behind Turn 3.
2. If you are planning to arrive or depart via a ride-share app, you can also use the Media Accreditation Centre at the Hotel Meliá Madrid Barajas, Av. de Logroño, 305, Barajas, 28042 Madrid, as a drop-off/collection location. Media can hop on one of the shuttles by showing their media pass (approximately 10 minutes to the Media Car Park).

3.4 CHANGES IN FORMULA 1 IN 2026 (SOURCE FORMULA 1.COM)

2026 is a year of significant change in the world of Formula 1, with this year's cars having to adhere to brand new power unit and aerodynamic regulations.

With so much that's different, it can be hard to stay on top of all the developments, so here we run you through the main changes you need to know ahead of the new season.

SMALLER CARS: A number of changes have been made to [the dimensions of the cars in 2026](#), including a shorter wheelbase. The distance between the front and rear axle is 200mm shorter than last year - 3400mm instead of 3600mm - creating what drivers have been calling a more nimble car than in 2025.

The cars are narrower, too, with 100mm taken off the width of the floor, and the tyres adding to that. The front tyres are 25mm narrower than last year, and the rears have had their width reduced by 30mm.

While the new proportions can have an impact on racing - giving that little bit more space for two cars to battle in - they also can impact grip, with a smaller contact patch for the tyres.

LIGHTER CARS: The removal of the MGU-H (Motor Generator Unit - Heat) has played a part in being able to lower the weight limit, as have the above reductions in size. With smaller car and tyre dimensions, there has been a significant drop in the minimum weight limit, down from 800kg in 2025 to 768kg this year.

Drivers have [already commented](#) on their ability to feel that difference in weight behind the wheel, as an improvement in handling despite the lower downforce levels that are a result of new aerodynamic regulations.

FRESH AERODYNAMICS: The main rule change from last year is the removal of the Venturi tunnels underneath the car that generated so much aerodynamic performance through ground effect. Although the new floor regulations still allow a lot of performance to be gained in this area - particularly with a bigger diffuser - it's not as dominant as in the past.

The front and rear wings have been simplified; wheel covers have been removed (another weight-saver) and bargeboards included that are designed to direct turbulent airflow from the front wheels inboard. The intent is to reduce outwash - the practice of pushing that turbulent air away from the car, often disturbing the car behind - and improve the ability for cars to follow each other.

NEW POWER UNITS: Running on Advanced Sustainable Fuels for the first time, the V6 turbo hybrid has become... a V6 turbo hybrid. But it is a very different power unit.

Gone is the MGU-H - a complex and heavy motor - and the Internal Combustion Engine (ICE) now has a reduced power output of around 400kW. However, the MGU-K (Motor Generator Unit - Kinetic) remains and is more powerful, with the

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electrical energy output increasing from 120kW to 350kW, to make for a roughly 50-50 split between internal combustion and electrical power.

The battery is now allowed to be recharged with more than double the previous 4MJ (megajoules) per lap, and in tandem with the increased electrical power output that places a greater emphasis on harvesting that energy.

That is done under braking, on part-throttle, through what is being termed 'super clipping' (the MGU-K operating in reverse when still at full throttle at the end of straights, permitted with certain limitations) or a driver lifting off the throttle themselves before hitting the brakes.

THE INTRODUCTION OF ADVANCED SUSTAINABLE FUELS: In tandem with the new power units comes the significant change of the fuel that will be used by the teams this year. Instead of a fuel derived from crude oil or fossil feedstocks, Advanced Sustainable Fuel is one where the molecules have to be extracted from an advanced sustainable feedstock.

In basic terms, that is anything second-generation that is not in competition with the food chain. That could be residues from different industries or even organic waste, with the FIA measuring the CO2 equivalent to every step in order to also control the processes to extract the molecules.

It also has to be a drop-in fuel, meaning they're designed to replace fossil fuel equivalents without requiring any adjustment to the engine.

OVERTAKE MODE: Replacing the Drag Reduction System (DRS) as an overtaking aid is a new power mode simply known as Overtake Mode, that allows a driver to recharge an extra +0.5MJ, and generate an additional electrical power profile, so they can sustain a higher speed for a longer period.

There is one detection point per lap for this mode - expected to be out of the final corner on many occasions, leading onto a long straight - and the mode will be available to drivers on the following lap as long as they stay within a second of the car in front at that detection point.

Its use will be most effective on longer straights as the delta speed it will deliver should have a greater effect on closing the distance between the two competing cars.

STRAIGHT MODE (ACTIVE AERODYNAMICS): Straight Mode is a different aerodynamic configuration that allows cars to reduce their drag, making them more efficient when accelerating up towards top speed.

The rear wing continues to open up a gap - just like it did when drivers used DRS in the past - but now the front wing also moves. The uppermost front wing elements drop down at the same time the rear wing's top element does.

This is a mode that is used automatically on every single lap in dry conditions, in every area that is designated for it (see below for more on the track zones). Essentially, the car will adapt between two different configurations depending on where it is on the track, providing maximum downforce in corners but then less drag on straights.

5.2 F3

INTRODUCTION

Centro District	
<u>Gallery of the Royal Collections</u> In June 2023 the Gallery of the Royal Collections opened its doors beside the Royal Palace and the Almudena, in an imposing building carved from the rock that descends six floors from the Plaza de la Armería down to the Campo del Moro. The nearly seven hundred thousand visitors in its first year speak for themselves. For 2026 two fascinating exhibitions arrive, "Weaving Courtly Life" and "Extraordinary Marvels", with guest works from the National Gallery and the House of Alba.	<u>Royal Academy of Fine Arts of San Fernando</u> The Royal Academy of Fine Arts of San Fernando, founded in 1752, conceals a museum that few visit and that competes unabashedly with the celebrated Art Triangle: more than fifteen hundred paintings, as many sculptures and tens of thousands of drawings and prints. Goya was a member and professor from 1780, and thirteen of his works hang here. For two centuries this was the institution that set the criteria of Spanish art.
<u>Liria Palace</u> Liria Palace preserves and shows the legacy of one of Spain's most influential families. It is the jewel in the crown: built in the eighteenth century and rebuilt after the Civil War, it treasures more than eight hundred works, with Goya, Rubens, El Greco, Titian, Velázquez and Rembrandt, as well as handwritten letters by Columbus. It has opened widely since 2019 and, in 2026, you'll also be able to stroll through its gardens in summer.	<u>Thyssen-Bornemisza Museum</u> The Thyssen-Bornemisza Museum opened in the Villahermosa Palace in 1992, and the State acquired it a year later for three hundred and fifty million dollars. Its forty-eight rooms trace seven centuries of painting, with a nineteenth-century North American collection unique in Europe, from Van Eyck to Hopper.

Brach Spa & Sport Club Right on the Gran Vía, the Brach Spa & Sport Club unfolds across 400 square metres of soft whites and golden touches, a luminous haven with a 20-metre pool, hammam, infrared sauna and a state-of-the-art gym. Its treatments range from the holistic, with acupuncture, reflexology, osteopathy and Bach Flower Remedies, to facial and body rituals crafted with the savoir-faire of Clarins, and every massage is designed on the spot, according to what the body asks for that day.	Hamma Hamma, the most singular offering from Hammam Al Ándalus, awaits at Barquillo 47, in the very heart of Salesas. Here every session is private, and its brick cabins bathed in soft light feel more like a cave than a treatment room. Water reigns before, during and after the massage. You step back onto the street with a wholly different awareness.
Fitness	
Revive Revive offers, across its two locations in Justicia and María de Molina, an idea as simple as it is powerful: to train, recover and connect as a single experience. Its strength, Hyrox and Sculpt classes invite you to train better. In the Recovery Room, where the Finnish sauna, the ice bath and the infrared cabin cease to be an extra and become an essential part of performance. The coffee bar does the rest, and you leave keener than the day before.	Abada Club In Salamanca District, Abada Club opened its doors in 2025 with 2,300 square metres and a BREEAM certification rarely seen in the sector. The fitness floor brings together Eleiko, Egym and Matrix machines and a circuit of eighteen smart devices that customise training with artificial intelligence. Five boutique studios, with yoga and pilates at Soul, HIIT at Pulse, boxing at Urban and cycling at Beat, sit alongside a recovery area, a sauna and a coworking space with a café, where the community trains and socialises in equal measure.
Beauty	
Beldon Beauty Beldon Beauty has three addresses, each with its own focus: Lagasca for cutting edge treatments, Beldon Wellness at the BLESS Hotel for holistic rituals, and Beldon Medical on Conde de Aranda for prevention and longevity. What brings clients back is not a treatment, but the feeling of being truly accompanied.

6.5 RESTAURANT AND DINING SUGGESTIONS

Malasaña District	
<u>Bodega de la Ardosa</u> The Bodega de la Ardosa has been open since 1892, its original red doors and period glass still in place. It was founded by Rafael Fernández Bagená, a man from Toledo who brought the wine from his Consuegra vineyards up to the capital.	<u>Casa Camacho</u> Casa Camacho has run since 1928 on the simple logic of the three brothers who keep it. There is no menu, so the choice is easy. This is no re-creation of old Madrid: it is old Madrid, still open.
Barrio de las Letras District	
<u>Viva Madrid</u> Viva Madrid has occupied since 1856 a tiled façade whose Cibeles was hand-painted by Casa Mensaque and is now part of the city's heritage. Inside survive the original ceiling of harpies, the zinc bar and the period tiles.	
Centro District	
<u>Gofio</u> Gofio has championed Canarian cooking as haute cuisine for ten years, confirmed by a Michelin star. At the helm, Saïe Cruz and Aída González, Tenerife natives by Madrid adoption, welcome you with cauldrons on the fire before you descend to an earth-toned dining room whose round tables evoke La Geria in Lanzarote.	<u>Brach Madrid</u> Brach Madrid inhabits a 1919 building, the former Palacio de Masserano where Victor Hugo spent part of his childhood, brought back to life by Philippe Starck: high ceilings, dark wood, braided leather and antique mirrors shipped from the United States. Chef Adam Bentalha crosses the Mediterranean with South American accents and plenty of fire.
<u>Lhardy</u> To understand how Madrid eats when it truly wishes to eat well, Lhardy, open since 1839 with mahogany brought from Cuba, serves its cocido in three courses on silverware.	
Salamanca District	
<u>Ramón Freixa Tradición</u> Ramón Freixa Tradición opened not to prove a point but to remember: the bread from his grandparents' bakery, the sauce bound with patience. In a double-height room designed by Alejandra Pombo, the menu runs from midday to the small hours, with Iberian ham croquettes, Russian salad with langoustine and sea bass Wellington in champagne sauce.	<u>La Bien Aparecida</u> La Bien Aparecida, the most gastronomic venture of Grupo Cañadío, which Paco Quirós began in Santander in 1981, brings Cantabria to the table with fine produce and precise technique.

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<u>Cristina Oria</u> Cristina Oria works non-stop with produce from her estate in Morata de Tajuña, and everything resting on the table, from the crockery to the oil, can be bought as you leave.	
Chamartín District	
<u>Rubaiyat</u> Rubaiyat has spent two decades with its open grill, Angus and Wagyu from its own Brazilian ranch, and a garden terrace that invites you to linger.

Dr. You Where Dr. You could easily be mistaken for a design gallery: warm wood, stainless steel and every product in its place for a reason. Siblings Juan José and Andrea describe it as a modern herbalist's, and the visit begins before you choose a thing, with a glass of electrolyte water and a personalised assessment.	Atelier Pottery Every piece at Atelier Pottery is born in the Madrid studio of María Vega de Seoane, where it is shaped, sanded, fired twice and glazed. Nature rules over collections whose signature is porcelain jewellery, earrings, rings and bracelets, alongside bespoke medals and cufflinks for weddings and occasions that call for a keepsake made by hand.
Andrés Gallardo Andrés Gallardo occupies a restored former print works with exposed brick and original beams. Andrés Gallardo and Marina Casal found in broken porcelain a territory few had explored, and while jewellery put them on the map, it was the bags that carried them to the world: a bold piece of porcelain, fired at over 1,600 degrees, set upon Ubrique leather.	Boutique de la Prensa Boutique de la Prensa began in 1998 as a ten-metre kiosk and is today a matter of rarity rather than quantity: more than five hundred international titles that Antonio Torán and Margarita Martín stock only if they are worth it. They safeguard a hand-decorated edition of Vogue Portugal, just one hundred copies, and champion Acne Paper, Marfa, Candy and Apartamento with devotion.
La Oficial La Oficial was born in 2017, after Toni Torrecillas drove across the pottery workshops of Portugal. Today he travels in person to Granada, Córdoba, Alicante, Valencia and L'Empordà to select artisan ceramics found nowhere else.	Pedro García Craftsmanship is worn on the feet, too. Pedro García opened his first workshop in Elda, Alicante, in 1925, and a century later the factory remains in the same place, with every pair hand-stitched by Mila and Pedro García, the third generation.
Rowse For skincare with a Mediterranean accent visit Rowse: plant-based formulas with biotechnology, and no empty promises. At The Greenhouse, at Argensola 26, that philosophy becomes tangible, with armchair treatments, cabin rituals and workshops on astrology and beauty.	El Corte Inglés Castellana El Corte Inglés Castellana, at Raimundo Fernández Villaverde 65, unfolds across six floors and three basements of fashion, home, sport and technology. Its Gourmet Experience holds a surprise: Ravioxo, Dabiz Muñoz's one-Michelin-star restaurant, where pasta takes the lead. With parking and a direct link to Nuevos Ministerios, it is the convenient stop at any hour of the day.
