

Welcome Letter

Dear Presidents and Delegates,

Thank you again for your registration for 2013 Mobility Conference Week and we look forward to welcoming you in The Hague next week.

We would like to share some tips with you to make your visit and participation easier.

Travel:

1: If you travel to Amsterdam Schiphol Airport

a. Buy your train ticket online

Trains depart directly from Schiphol Airport to The Hague Central Station every 15-20 minutes and take you into the heart of The Hague within 40 minutes.

Unfortunately we have come to on the site of the Dutch railroad company (www.ns.nl) one can only pay with a Dutch bank card. It is therefore advisable that you arrive with enough Euros in cash to be able to buy your ticket upon arrival from one of the machines.

A ticket in first class will cost you €13.30 per person, a ticket in second class will cost you €7.80 per person.

Alternatively, you can buy them at the Customer Centres at the Schiphol station. There, both credit cards and cash are accepted but you will have to allow for some time to be attended by a representative.

From The Hague Central Station it's a 5-10 minute ride by taxi to any of the FIA Conference Week hotels. Alternatively you can plan your onward journey

by public transport on www.9292.nl/en#

b. If you take a taxi-bring cash

If you prefer to travel by taxi it will be a 40 minute ride from Schiphol to The Hague. Taxis are expensive and a ride from the airport to The Hague will cost around €100.

2: If you travel via Rotterdam The Hague Airport: take a taxiPublic transport options are very limited from Rotterdam The Hague Airport.The 30 minute taxi ride will cost approximately €60.

3: Construction railway Amsterdam

In the weekend of 7-8 September, construction work will take place at the railway between Schiphol and Amsterdam Sloterdijk and between Schiphol and Diemen Zuid/Amsterdam Bijlmer ArenA. The Dutch Rail travel planner http://www.ns.nl/en/travellers/home will show you what the exact consequences are for your trip and how long you will have to travel. The planned construction work will affect only the trains between Schiphol and Amsterdam; the trains from the airport to The Hague will run as scheduled.
