FIA JUDICIAL AND DISCIPLINARY SYSTEM

National Court of Appeal of ASNs

- Each ASN through its national court of appeal constitutes for its own licence-holders the final court of judgement empowered to settle any dispute which may have arisen between its sole licence-holders on its own territory in connection with national motor sport.
- The competent sporting tribunal for an appeal formulated within the framework of an event that is run over the territory of several countries shall be that of the ASN that requested the registration of the event on the International Calendar.
- Appeals may be submitted to the International Court of Appeal in accordance with the rules on competence and procedure set out in the FIA Judicial and Disciplinary Rules (JDR).

Stewards of the Meeting

- **Authority:** The stewards shall have supreme authority for the enforcement of the International Sporting Code (ISC), of national and Supplementary Regulations and of programmes. They shall settle any claim which might arise during a meeting, subject to the right of appeal provided in the ISC.

FIA International Tribunal (IT)

- **Role:** Without prejudice to the powers of the Stewards of the Meeting, the IT constitutes the **first level of jurisdiction** of the FIA, in particular for infringements and offences referred to in Article 8.2 of the JDR and committed by the persons referred to in Article 8.1 of the JDR.

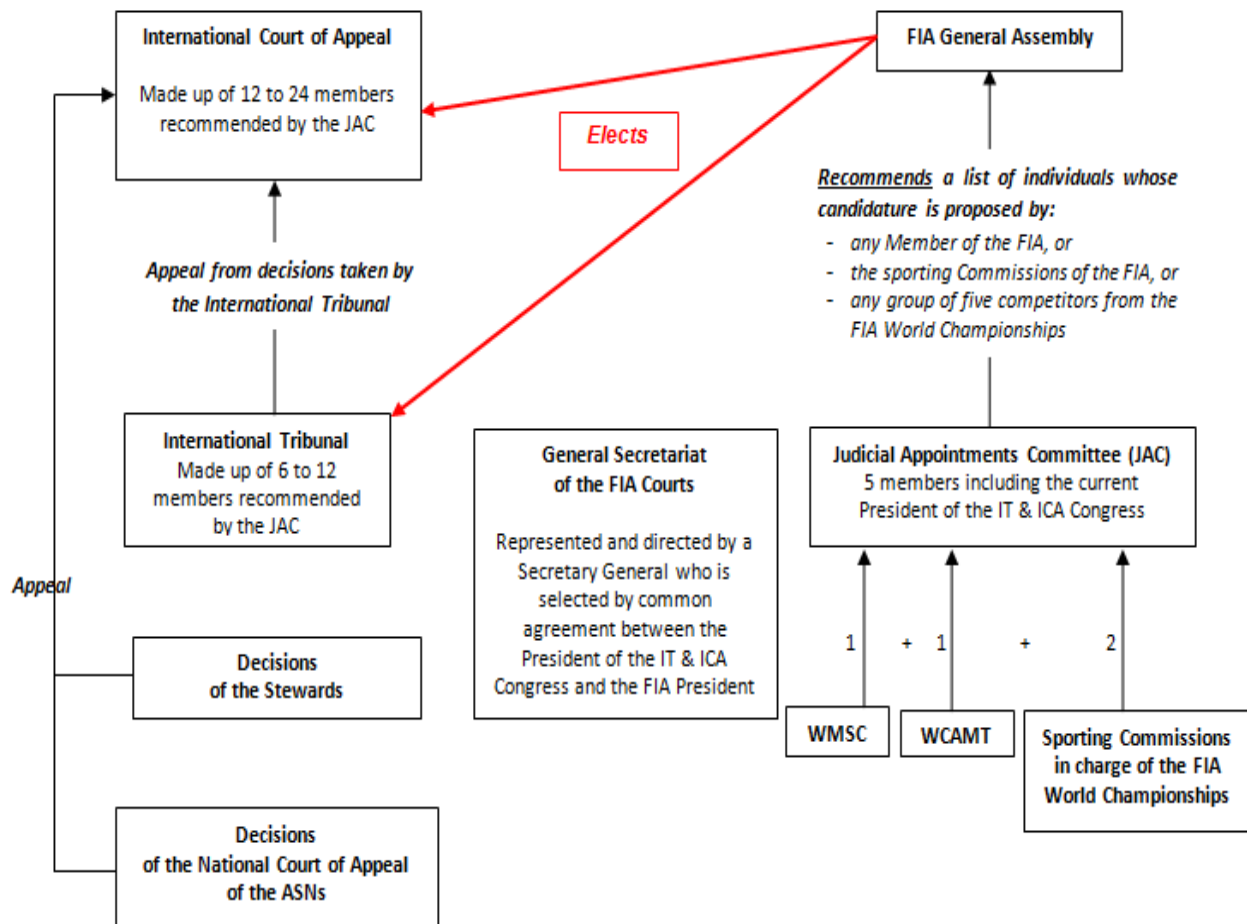
FIA International Court of Appeal (ICA)

- **Role:** Pursuant to its competences as set out in the FIA Statutes, the ICA will hear **three types of appeal case:**
 - (1) appeals concerning sporting decisions;
 - (2) appeals concerning decisions taken by the IT; and
 - (3) appeals concerning the interpretation or application of the FIA Statutes.

Court of Arbitration for Sport

Appeals against the decisions of the **FIA Anti-Doping Disciplinary Committee** may be brought only before the Court of Arbitration for Sport.
