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## 6. MANUFACTURER'S CUP – ART. 6.4 AND 15.1.4

There will be Manufacturer's Cup for both categories Autocross and Cross Car with the season's entry fee of EUR 2,000 per Manufacturer. – Art 6.3.

The classification is made at each event with the score of number of points equal to the sum of points scored by the best Driver in every category and each division:

Autocross Manufacturer's Cup: Junior Buggy – Buggy 1600 – Super Buggy

Cross Car Manufacturer's Cup: Cross Car Junior – Cross Car

## ARTICLE 1 FOREWORD

### 1. FOREWORD

The Fédération Internationale de l'Automobile ("the FIA") organizes the FIA European Autocross and Cross Car Championships ("the Championships"), which is the property of the FIA and comprises:

- 1.1. three titles of FIA European Autocross Champion Driver, in the following specific Championships:
  - The FIA European Autocross Championship, contested by Drivers entering cars in the SuperBuggy Category,
  - The FIA European Autocross Championship, contested by Drivers entering cars in the Buggy1600 Category,
  - The FIA European Autocross Championship, contested by Drivers entering cars in the JuniorBuggy Category,
- 1.2. two titles of FIA European Cross Car Champion Driver, in the following specific Championships:
  - The FIA European Cross Car Championship, contested by Drivers entering cars in the Cross Car Category.
  - The FIA European Cross Car Championship, contested by Drivers entering cars in the Junior Cross Car Category.
  - the FIA Autocross Nations Cup ("the Nations Cup").
- 1.3. the FIA Autocross Manufacturer's Cup ("the AX Manufacturer's Cup") is contested by Drivers entering cars in the SuperBuggy, Buggy1600 and JuniorBuggy Category.
- 1.4. the FIA Cross Car Manufacturer's Cup ("the XC Manufacturer's Cup") is contested by Drivers entering cars in the Cross car and Junior Cross Car Category.

## ARTICLE 6.3 MANUFACTURE

### 6. ELIGIBLE DRIVERS, **MANUFACTURERS** AND COMPETITORS

#### 6.3 Manufacture

Applications to participate in a Competition of the AX or XC Manufacturer's Cup shall be submitted to the FIA by means of the entry form available on [www.fia.com](http://www.fia.com) and must be accompanied by copies of proof of payment of the season's entry fee of EUR 2,000 per Manufacturer. The season's entry fee payment must be completed at the latest 1 week before the first Event of the Championship.

With an FIA waiver after the closing date of entry, however, past events will not score championship points if the waiver is granted after the completed competition.

Eligibility requires that at least one car produced by the Manufacturer is entered in one of the categories, as verified by the FIA technical passport and roll cage certificate.

## ARTICLE 15.1.4 CHAMPIONSHIP STANDING

### 15.1.4 Manufacturer's Cup standing

- a) The classification of the AX & XC Manufacturer's Cup, will be drawn up on the basis of the final classifications from each competition obtained in each category of the FIA European Cross Car Championship or FIA European Autocross Championship.
- b) At the end of each of the Competitions, each Manufacturer entering the AX or XC Manufacturer's Cup will score a number of points equal to the sum of points scored by the one best Drivers in every category of the FIA European Autocross Championship or FIA European Cross Car Championship.
- c) The winner of the Manufacturer's Cup will be the Manufacturer which has scored the highest number of points at the end of the Championship.

All the results obtained in the course of the year will count towards the final classification. Should more than one Manufacturer have scored the same number of points, the tie will be settled on the basis of the greatest number of 1st, then 2nd, then 3rd (and so on) places obtained.

  - XC MANUFACTURER'S CUP (BEST DRIVER FROM CROSS CAR, JUNIOR CROSS CAR)
- WINNING MANUFACTURER IS THE ONE WITH THE HIGHEST TOTAL POINTS
- TIE-BREAKER BASED ON THE HIGHEST NUMBER OF TOP FINISHES (1ST, 2ND, ETC.)

## ARTICLE 7.1 ENTRY FORM AND ARTICLE 7.3 ENTRY CONDITIONS

- 7.1.5** Acceptance of entries will be decided by each organiser but priority will be given to the 15 leading point scorers in each category in the Championship classification by each category and entries will be selected and validated according to the following order of priorities:
- 1) Best 15 Drivers classified in the previous year of this Championship.
  - 2) Best 15 Drivers classified in the present year.
  - 3) Drivers with the most starts in competitions in the present year (from most starts to 2 starts).
  - 4) Drivers will be selected according to the order in which they completed their entry application with proof of payment on the FIA registration platform.
  - 5) Organiser has the right to propose 5 Competitors/Drivers as Wild Card, over and above priorities from 1) to 4). European Championship Entries always have priority in front of Support Race Entries.

- 7.3.1** The Organising Committee reserves the right to refuse the entry of a Competitor or a Driver, giving the reason for such refusal, with respect of priorities specified in Art. 7.1.5.

- NEW PRIORITY SYSTEM INTRODUCED FOR MANAGING A LARGE NUMBER OF DRIVERS
- TOP 15 DRIVERS FROM THE PREVIOUS AND CURRENT YEAR GET PRIORITY
- ADDITIONAL CRITERIA : NUMBER OF STARTS, ENTRY ORDER, AND ORGANIZER'S WILD CARD SELECTION
- EUROPEAN CHAMPIONSHIP ENTRIES PRIORITIZED OVER SUPPORT RACE ENTRIES

### ARTICLE 7.3.5 ENTRY CONDITIONS

7.3.5 The maximum space in the Paddock for each team should be 8m x 13m. The organiser provides each driver a service area of 8m x 13m in the paddock. The organiser may provide additional space in the paddock and has the right to charge a maximum fee of EUR 10 per sqm.

- ORGANIZERS MAY CHARGE FOR EXTRA PADDOCK SPACE, MAX. UP TO EUR 10 PER SQM
- THIS IS A RIGHT, NOT AN OBLIGATION, ALLOWING FLEXIBILITY IN PADDOCK MANAGEMENT
- STANDARD ALLOCATION REMAINS 8M X 13M PER DRIVER, WITH OPTIONAL PAID EXTENSIONS

### ARTICLE 10.2 SCRUTINEERING AND ARTICLE 10.6 FUEL USE

10.2.5 Additional scrutineering may be carried out at any time during the Competition. The scrutineers may in particular:

- check the eligibility of the car or of the Driver's equipment;
- require a car to be dismantled by the Competitor to make sure that the conditions of eligibility and conformity are fully satisfied;
- require a Competitor to supply them with such parts or samples as they may deem necessary;
- proceed with fuel controls; in order to do so, it must be possible for the scrutineers to collect ~~3 samples of 200ml~~ at least 1 litre and two times 0.6 litres of fuel each as a sample.

10.6.2 At any time during a Competition, it must be possible for the scrutineers to take at least ~~3~~ 1 litre and two times 0.6 litres of fuel as a sample.

**ARTICLE 10.2.7 COMPETITION NUMBERS AND DRIVERS NAME**

**10.2.7 Competition numbers and Driver's name**

The figures of the Competition numbers are displayed once on ~~each side of the car and once on~~ each side of the car and once on each side of a panel on the roof or on the bonnet. All other numbers are prohibited.

The roof number must be permanently fixed on a vertical support having no sharp edges, in line with the front-rear axis of the car. The panel must measure 24 x 35cm and ~~must be in white colour~~. The number must be 18cm high with a stroke thickness of 4cm in ~~Arial Black font and in black colour~~.

The name of the Driver in white letters in ~~Arial Black font~~ of a height of between 6 and 10cm, as well as his national flag, must be featured on the left and the right side of the body of each car.

**ARTICLE 11.1 START**

~~If the driver is late to the pre-grid or starting grid of the race, and if the race director deems that this hinders the running of the Competition, the start of this driver in this race will be refused. This decision of the race director is not subject to protest or appeal.~~

ARTICLE 12.2 SIGNALING AND ARTICLE 12.2.1 YELLOW FLAGS/ -S

12.2 ~~Flag-signals~~Signalling

If the organizer uses light panels, this must be specified in the Supplementary Regulations.

In competitions in which a race director is appointed, he/she is authorised to use flag signals, in accordance with Appendix H to the Code, including those flag signals that can be used by the clerk of the course.

Flag signals must be in conformity with Appendix H to the Code, with the following exceptions:

12.2.1. Yellow flag/-s

- a) One yellow flag is shown at one post only, immediately before the accident/obstacle. One yellow flag must be waved during 2 laps for the same incident. Once the flag has been shown, Drivers may reduce speed, shall not overtake and shall be prepared to change direction until they have completely passed the incident (last obstacle) for which it is shown, there being no green flag in this situation.
- b) Two yellow flags are waived if the incident is on the racing line. Once the flags ~~has~~ have been shown, Drivers may reduce their speed significantly, shall not overtake and shall be prepared to change direction until they have completely passed the incident (last obstacle) for which it is shown, there being no green flag in this situation.

ARTICLE 12.2 SIGNALING AND ARTICLE 12.2.2 BLACK AND WHITE / BLACK FLAG/ -S

12.2.2. Black and white/black flag/-s

- a) ~~The black and white flag will be shown during two laps together with the starting number.~~ The black and white flag together with a panel with the starting number (80 x 60cm) will be shown during two laps. Showing of the black and white flag means that the Driver whose number is shown will be under investigation.
- b) ~~The black flag will be shown together during two laps with a panel, 80 x 60cm, with the starting number. If a black flag is shown in a heat, The black flag together with a panel with the starting number (80 x 60cm) will be shown during two laps. If a black flag is shown in a heat practice/race, the Driver has to go immediately to the paddock.~~
- c) The race director ~~and/~~ (or the clerk of the course in the absence of the race director) may use the black and white and/or black flag during practice, the race, or afterwards if further investigation is required. The official using the black and white and/or black flag must confirm the reason for its use in writing to the Driver and the Competitor before the amended provisional classification is published.

- SIGNIFICANT CHANGES TO BLACK AND WHITE AND BLACK FLAG USAGE
- FLAGS CAN NOW BE SHOWN AFTER PRACTICE/RACE IF FURTHER INVESTIGATION IS REQUIRED

- WRITTEN CONFIRMATION OF THE REASON FOR FLAG USAGE IS MANDATORY

**ARTICLE 12.2 SIGNALING AND ARTICLE 12.2.2 BLACK AND WHITE / BLACK FLAG/ -S**

- d) The decision to show the black or black and white flag may also be communicated to the Driver only in writing.
- e) Drivers who receive a Black Flag decision in Heats are credited with 95 points (BFL) and are classified last in the Heat, ahead of those who did not start in that Heat.
- f) Drivers who receive a Black Flag decision in Semi-/Finals (BFL) are classified last in the Semi-/Finals, ahead of those who did not start in that Semi-/Final.
- g) Drivers who receive a black flag more than twice in a single season will have 5 championship points deducted for each occurrence from third Black Flag onwards.

- **AUTOMATIC CLASSIFICATION AND POINTS FOR BLACK FLAG DECISIONS IN HEATS AND SEMI-FINALS**
- **DRIVERS RECEIVE 95 POINTS (BFL) AND ARE PLACED LAST, AHEAD OF NON-STARTERS**
- **EACH TWO BLACK FROM THE THIRD BLACK FLAG ONWARDS, 5 CHAMPIONSHIP POINTS ARE DEDUCTED PER OCCURRENCE**

**ARTICLE 12.2 SIGNALING AND ARTICLE 12.2.3 MARSHAL SIGNS**

**12.2.3. Marshal signs**

- a) Marshal "SLOW" or "STOP" signs (see Drawing No. 3) which can be used together with a red flag: a sign with a „SLOW" means that speed shall be reduced or continuously moving slowly; a sign with a „STOP" means that movement should be stopped at a marshal post which first shows the „STOP" sign.
- b) Marshal "ARROW" direction sign (see Drawing No. 4) which can be used together with yellow or double yellow flags. A sign with an arrow to the left or right indicates the recommended direction to pass obstacles safely, but the driver's responsibility is to choose the direction.

**14.3.3** The right of review must be made in writing in accordance with Art. 14 of the Code. The deposit for the petition of review is €2,000.

**ARTICLE 15.1.1 CLASSIFICATIONS OF A COMPETITION**

**15.1.1 Classification of a Competition**

...  
The winner of the Final will be the winner of the Competition. Position 1 to 20 in the final Competition will be according to the results of the Semi-Finals and Final; the remaining Drivers will be classified according to the three qualifying heats.  
**The last Event of the Calendar for every category will be declared as a SUPER FINAL and the number of scoring points for the Championship will be multiplied by the coefficient 1,5.**

- **THE FINAL EVENT OF THE SEASON IN EACH CATEGORY WILL BE DESIGNATED AS A SUPER FINAL .**
- **CHAMPIONSHIP POINTS EARNED IN THIS EVENT WILL BE MULTIPLIED BY A COEFFICIENT OF 1.5.**
- **THIS AIMS TO ENCOURAGE DRIVER PARTICIPATION AND SUPPORT EVENT ORGANIZERS .**

### ARTICLE 15.1.2 CHAMPIONSHIP STANDING

- a) For SuperBuggy, Buggy1600, and JuniorBuggy and Cross Car Categories  
Maximum number of classifications retained: from the total for the Championship, a certain number of best placing will be retained from the total number of Competitions, according to the FIA Calendar prior to the first Competition according to the following scale:
- up to 7 Competitions: the total,
  - for 8 and 9 Competitions: the total minus 1,
  - ~~for 9 Competitions: the total minus 1,~~
  - ~~up to 9 Competitions: the total,~~
  - ~~for 10 Competitions: the total minus 1~~
  - For 10 and 11 Competitions: the total minus 2
  - For 10 and 11 events the Competition will be divided into two groups (following the calendar chronologically), the first with 5 Competitions and the second with remaining Competitions. The best results from each group, minus 1 worst result, will be retained.
