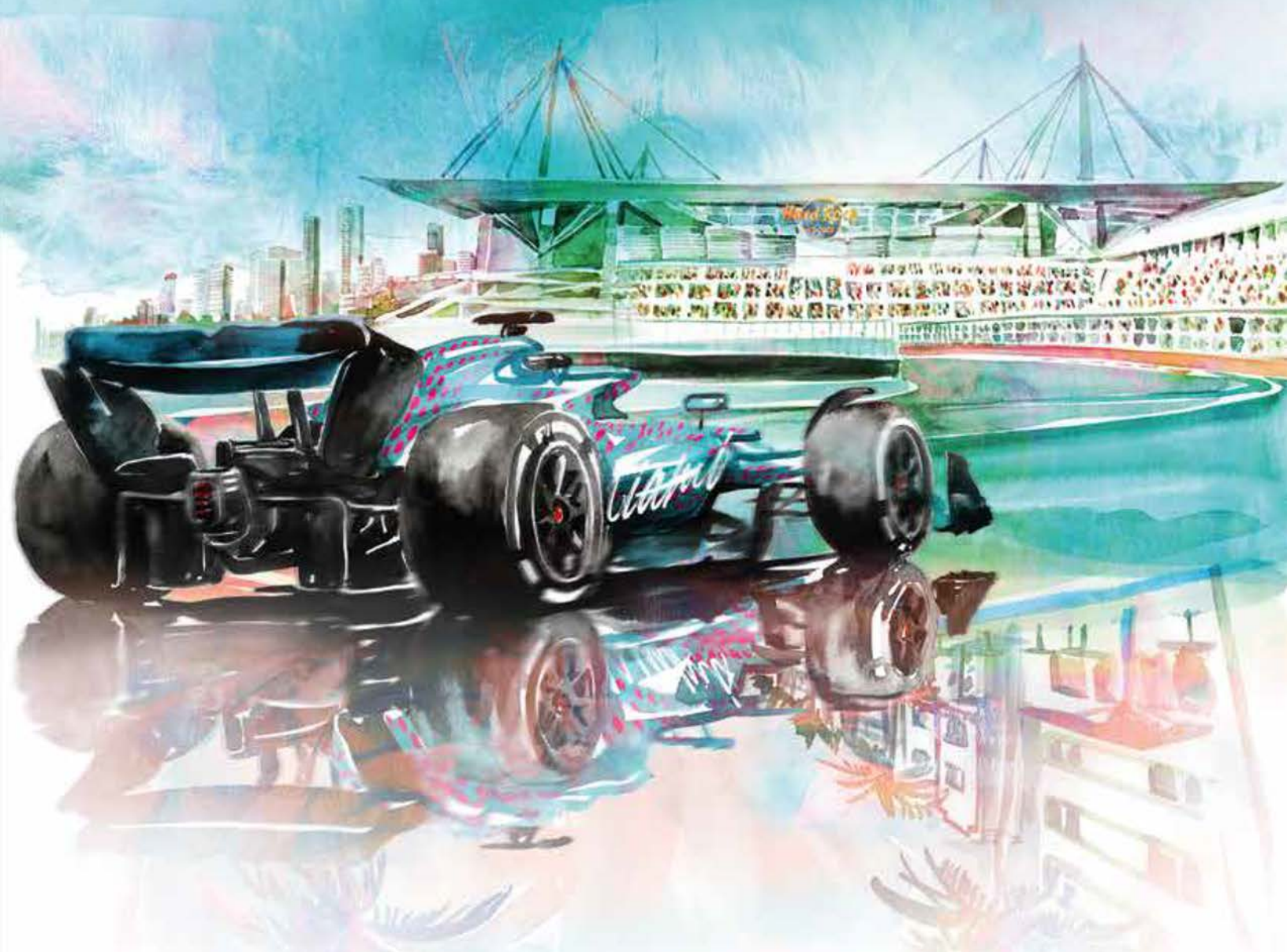

We have reimagined this iconic space to create an even more immersive and refined guest experience, while also opening up parts of the Marina with a new viewing platform that gives all ticketholders another dynamic vantage point from which to enjoy the action.

We are also proud to celebrate the very best of Miami by bringing more of the city's spirit directly to the racetrack. As fans explore the MIA campus this year, they will discover new zones inspired by some of Miami's most recognizable districts - Wynwood, Coconut Grove, Miami Beach, Key Biscayne, Brickell, Little Havana and Miami Gardens.

Each area has been designed to capture the character of those communities and will be complemented by outstanding food and beverage offerings from across the South Florida region.

Expanding the energy beyond the racetrack

Another major addition for this year's race is something I am especially proud of: our free-admission Fan Fest at Lummus Park in Miami Beach. This five-day event is designed to bring the energy, atmosphere and spectacle of the race into the city of Miami.

Our official Fan Fest offers a free opportunity for fans to experience the excitement of Formula 1 through activations, entertainment and special appearances, while also introducing new audiences to one of the fastest-growing sports in the United States.

Every moment of on-track action will be shown live on giant screens next to the beach, creating a shared race-weekend experience to help bring the sport to an even broader audience.

Building connections with local schools and businesses

The local community is fundamental to our race and central to our long-term vision. Now in its fifth year, our Community Restaurant Program remains a cornerstone of our commitment to the region, celebrating Miami's vibrant food culture while creating meaningful exposure for locally-owned small businesses. Forty percent of this year's selected vendors are female-owned, and 47% are based in Miami Gardens.

Beyond food and beverage, our engagement also extends to workforce development through MIA Academy. This year, 21 students from local colleges and universities are gaining hands-on experience across our departments, from event operations to guest management. Over the past three years, 62 interns have participated in the program, with more than 30% continuing to work with us.

Our MIA in Schools program is a STEAM-focused initiative designed to inspire future careers in science, technology, engineering, arts and math. The program culminates each year when local students are invited to the Miami International Autodrome during race weekend for an exclusive behind-the-scenes visit to the pit garages for a chance to meet F1 drivers.

Last year, I was proud to champion Women Drive, a special initiative spotlighting influential female voices across business, sport and culture. I am pleased to say it will return this year with a new discussion focused on leadership, visibility and the expanding role of women in shaping the future of global motorsport and sports entertainment.

This will form part of ABX Miami, the first-of-its-kind collaboration between the Autosport Business Forum and our race. As the premier global forum for business and racing, it represents another exciting opportunity to connect our event with wider conversations shaping the future of the sport.

Welcome to new faces

Finally, as the green flag flies on the Miami International Autodrome, we are excited to welcome new friends to Miami, including the Cadillac F1 Team, which makes its home debut with us this weekend, as well as Audi and, of course, Apple, the new home of Formula 1 in the United States.

Lastly, thank you to the media for your continued support of the Formula 1 Crypto.com Miami Grand Prix. We appreciate the important role you play in helping us share this event with the world, and we hope you enjoy the hospitality, energy and spectacle of this year's race weekend.

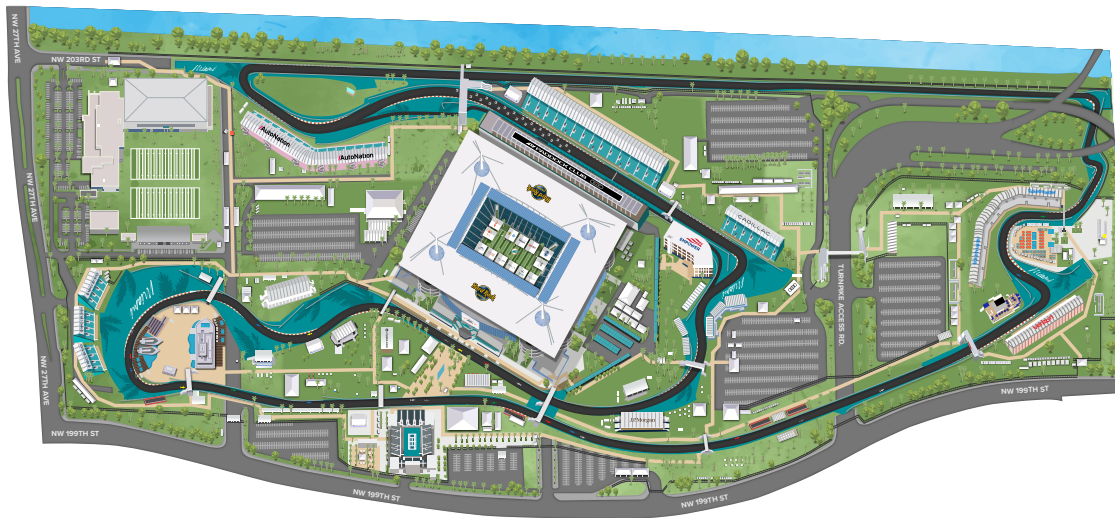
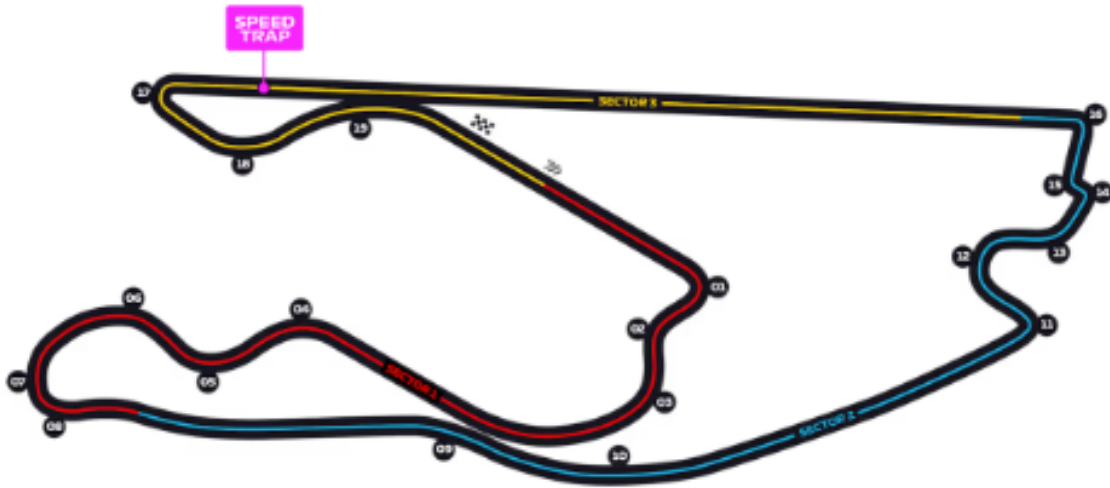

1.2 MIAMI INTERNATIONAL AUTODROME - CIRCUIT MAP OVERVIEW



A street-track spectacular. With the Hard Rock Stadium at its epicentre, the 5.41km layout features 19 corners, three straights, and top speeds of over 350km/h. There are elevation changes too, the main one found between Turns 13 and 16, with the track heading over an exit ramp and under various flyovers across uneven ground. The Turn 14-15 chicane, meanwhile, has an uphill approach, with a crest in the middle, and then drops down on exit.

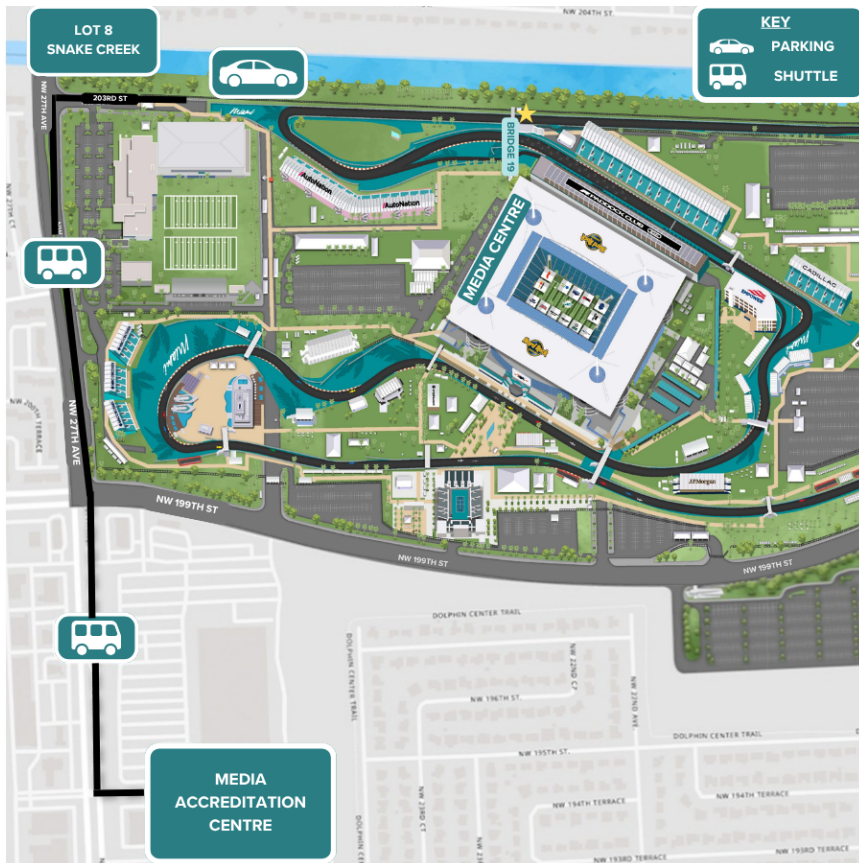

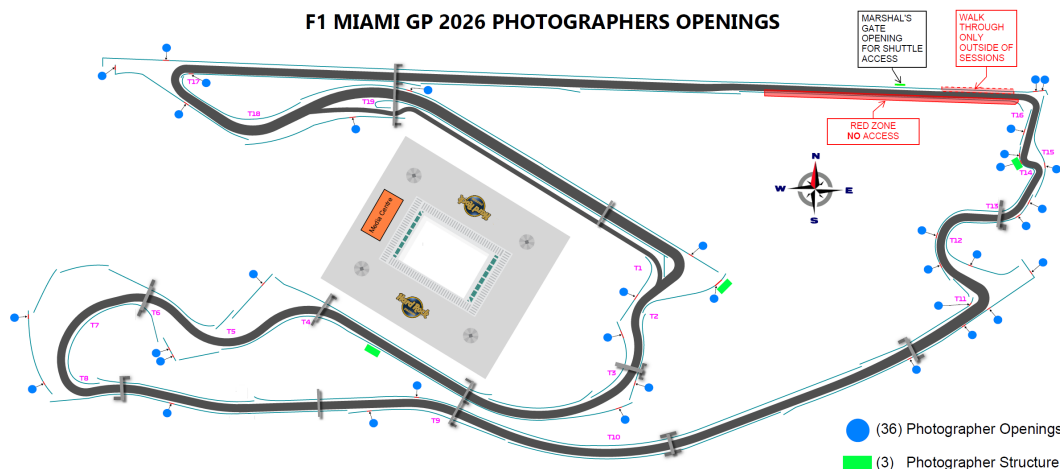

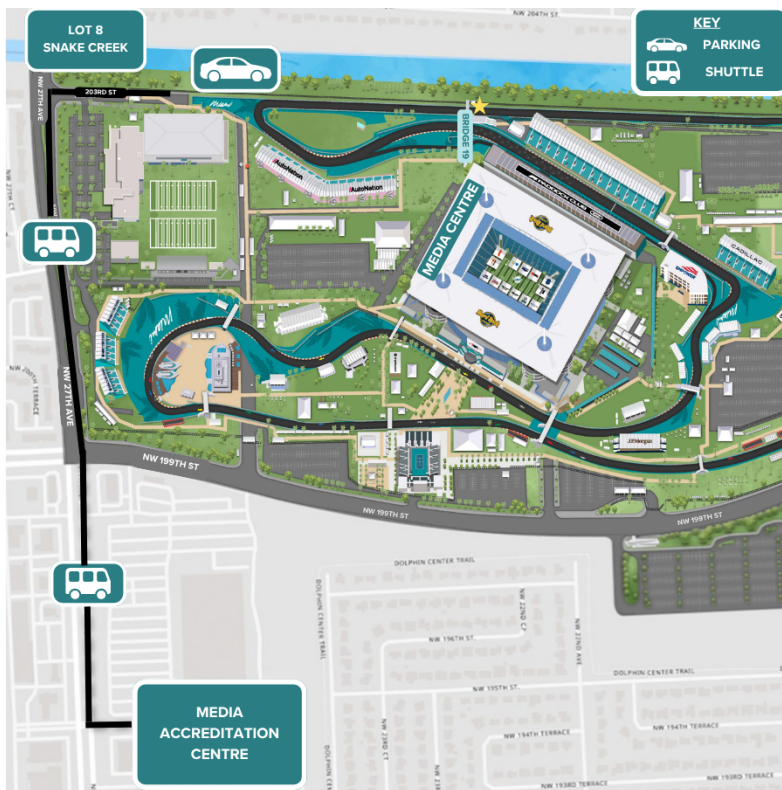

3. 2026 FIA FORMULA 1 WORLD CHAMPIONSHIP™ - RULES & REGULATIONS 3.4 CHANGES IN FORMULA 1 IN 2026 (SOURCE FORMULA 1.COM)

2026 is a year of significant change in the world of Formula 1, with this year's cars having to adhere to brand new power unit and aerodynamic regulations.

With so much that's different, it can be hard to stay on top of all the developments, so here we run you through the main changes you need to know ahead of the new season.

SMALLER CARS

A number of changes have been made to [the dimensions of the cars in 2026](#), including a shorter wheelbase. The distance between the front and rear axle is 200mm shorter than last year - 3400mm instead of 3600mm - creating what drivers have been calling a more nimble car than in 2025.

The cars are narrower, too, with 100mm taken off the width of the floor, and the tyres adding to that. The front tyres are 25mm narrower than last year, and the rears have had their width reduced by 30mm.

While the new proportions can have an impact on racing - giving that little bit more space for two cars to battle in - they also can impact grip, with a smaller contact patch for the tyres.

LIGHTER CARS

The removal of the MGU-H (Motor Generator Unit - Heat) has played a part in being able to lower the weight limit, as have the above reductions in size. With smaller car and tyre dimensions, there has been a significant drop in the minimum weight limit, down from 800kg in 2025 to 768kg this year.

Drivers have [already commented](#) on their ability to feel that difference in weight behind the wheel, as an improvement in handling despite the lower downforce levels that are a result of new aerodynamic regulations.

FRESH AERODYNAMICS

The main rule change from last year is the removal of the Venturi tunnels underneath the car that generated so much aerodynamic performance through ground effect. Although the new floor regulations still allow a lot of performance to be gained in this area - particularly with a bigger diffuser - it's not as dominant as in the past.

The front and rear wings have been simplified; wheel covers have been removed (another weight-saver) and bargeboards included that are designed to direct turbulent airflow from the front wheels inboard. The intent is to reduce outwash - the practice of pushing that turbulent air away from the car, often disturbing the car behind - and improve the ability for cars to follow each other.

NEW POWER UNITS

Running on Advanced Sustainable Fuels for the first time, the V6 turbo hybrid has become... a V6 turbo hybrid. But it is a very different power unit.

Gone is the MGU-H - a complex and heavy motor - and the Internal Combustion Engine (ICE) now has a reduced power output of around 400kW. However, the MGU-K (Motor Generator Unit - Kinetic) remains and is more powerful, with the electrical energy output increasing from 120kW to 350kW, to make for a roughly 50-50 split between internal combustion and electrical power.

The battery is now allowed to be recharged with more than double the previous 4MJ (megajoules) per lap, and in tandem with the increased electrical power output that places a greater emphasis on harvesting that energy.

That is done under braking, on part-throttle, through what is being termed 'super clipping' (the MGU-K operating in reverse when still at full throttle at the end of straights, permitted with certain limitations) or a driver lifting off the throttle themselves before hitting the brakes.

THE INTRODUCTION OF ADVANCED SUSTAINABLE FUELS

In tandem with the new power units comes the significant change of the fuel that will be used by the teams this year. Instead of a fuel derived from crude oil or fossil feedstocks, Advanced Sustainable Fuel is one where the molecules have to be extracted from an advanced sustainable feedstock.

In basic terms, that is anything second-generation that is not in competition with the food chain. That could be residues from different industries or even organic waste, with the FIA measuring the CO2 equivalent to every step in order to also control the processes to extract the molecules.

It also has to be a drop-in fuel, meaning they're designed to replace fossil fuel equivalents without requiring any adjustment to the engine.

OVERTAKE MODE

Replacing the Drag Reduction System (DRS) as an overtaking aid is a new power mode simply known as Overtake Mode, that allows a driver to recharge an extra +0.5MJ, and generate an additional electrical power profile, so they can sustain a higher speed for a longer period.

There is one detection point per lap for this mode - expected to be out of the final corner on many occasions, leading onto a long straight - and the mode will be available to drivers on the following lap as long as they stay within a second of the car in front at that detection point.

Its use will be most effective on longer straights as the delta speed it will deliver should have a greater effect on closing the distance between the two competing cars.

STRAIGHT MODE (ACTIVE AERODYNAMICS)

Straight Mode is a different aerodynamic configuration that allows cars to reduce their drag, making them more efficient when accelerating up towards top speed.

The rear wing continues to open up a gap - just like it did when drivers used DRS in the past - but now the front wing also moves. The uppermost front wing elements drop down at the same time the rear wing's top element does.

This is a mode that is used automatically on every single lap in dry conditions, in every area that is designated for it (see below for more on the track zones). Essentially, the car will adapt between two different configurations depending on where it is on the track, providing maximum downforce in corners but then less drag on straights.

Sprint Events

This year Miami will host an F1 Sprint again which will bring three days of competitive track action to the Miami International Autodrome. Originally devised in 2021, the Sprint offers an extra qualifying session and a 100km race in place of practice. The Sprint is one-third of the distance of a Grand Prix and lasts for approximately half an hour.

Miami is the second of six events to host a Sprint in 2026, following the first in China earlier in the year. Montreal, Silverstone, Zandvoort and Singapore will also feature Sprint races this season. All tracks were chosen based on their overtaking potential, as drivers are encouraged to race flat-out to the checkered flag.

In 2024, it was decided to update the weekend timetable for races hosting this format. Sprint Qualifying (formerly known as the Shootout) takes place on Friday afternoon with the shorter-distance race taking place on Saturday at lunchtime. Qualifying for the main event will continue in its usual Saturday afternoon slot with the 57-lap FORMULA 1 CRYPTO.COM MIAMI GRAND PRIX on Sunday.

Sprint Qualifying on Friday afternoon follows a similar format to traditional Qualifying, with six drivers eliminated at each stage, but with a shorter time for each session to increase the jeopardy. The three stages, SQ1, SQ2 and SQ3 last 12 minutes, 10 minutes and just eight minutes respectively. Medium compound tires are mandatory for the first two sessions, while softs must be used for SQ3.

When the Sprint was expanded to six events in 2024, it became a standalone feature of the weekend with points now awarded to the top eight finishers. There are no points for fastest lap and no mandatory pit stops.

While the Sprint no longer determines the grid for the Grand Prix, it can still have an influence on the outcome. For example, any significant crash damage might lead to a chassis change and that would result in a pit lane start for the main event.

5. SUPPORT RACES

5.1 F2

INTRODUCTION

Inaugurated back in 2017, the FIA Formula 2 Championship was formed as the penultimate stage in the FIA single seater pyramid, the final stepping stone en route to Formula 1. Following an agreement between the FIA and the GP2 Series Organisation, F2 was created with the goal of being the most competitive single-make Championship in the world.

After nine seasons of incredible racing, hard-fought Championships and record-breaking moments, F2 has helped numerous drivers on the Road to F1, including a record graduating class from 2024 that included four drivers stepping up to Formula 1. Champion Gabriel Bortoleto, Oliver Bearman, Andrea Kimi Antonelli and Isack Hadjar all had tremendous rookie seasons, having joined several alumni on the grid, including Charles Leclerc, George Russell, Oscar Piastri and Lando Norris, who, in 2025, became the first F2 graduate to win the Formula 1 World Drivers' Championship.

2024 also marked the start of a brand-new era of Formula 2, as the latest Dallara F2 car was introduced to be a closer match to the cars found in F1, both in terms of FIA Safety Regulations and technologies. In partnership with Aramco, the Championship runs on Aramco's advanced fuel, which is being developed to the FIA's 100% sustainable fuel standard. 5.2. PORSCHE CARRERA CUP NORTH AMERICA

INTRODUCTION

Porsche Carrera Cup North America is the premier one-make racing series in the United States and Canada, utilizing the all-new Porsche 911 Cup race car (Type 992.2) and Pirelli's P Zero DHG racing slicks to challenge competitors on the continent's top road courses and street circuits. The championship's sixth season is scheduled to feature 16 races in support of eight of the largest racing events in North America. Each 40-minute race counts toward season-long driver and team championships across three classes: Pro, Pro-Am, and Masters. New for the 2026 season, the Porsche 911 Cup car based on the 992.2 generation is the same model used in the current iteration of the Porsche Mobil 1 Supercup, which has served as a Formula 1 support series at European races since 1993.

As the pinnacle one-make series within the North American Porsche Motorsport Pyramid, the championship serves as a launching point for young racers aspiring to become factory drivers and compete in the highest level of professional sports car racing. Previous champions Seb Priaulx (2021), Parker Thompson (2022), Riley Dickinson (2023), Loek Hartog (2024), and Ryan Yardley (2025) have each progressed into multi-manufacturer competition, racing in series such as SRO GT4 America, IMSA Pilot Challenge, and the IMSA WeatherTech SportsCar Championship during the 2026 season. 5.3 MCLAREN TROPHY AMERICA

INTRODUCTION

McLaren Trophy America was launched in 2025 and now forms part of a global one-make racing platform for the British supercar manufacturer. As the only marque to have achieved the Triple Crown—victory at the Indianapolis 500, 24 Hours of Le Mans and the Monaco Grand Prix—McLaren offers drivers and teams the opportunity to race with one of the most storied brands in motorsport.

Featuring the McLaren Artura Trophy EVO on Pirelli tires, the series comprises ten races across five of America's most iconic circuits, with the Miami International Autodrome joining the calendar for the first time in 2026. Each race weekend includes two 50-minute contests, with drivers competing across three classes: Pro, Pro-Am and Am.

Graduates of McLaren Trophy Europe have already progressed onto the factory GT driver roster, with 2023 champion Tommy Pintos and 2025 title winner Alejandro Geppert both becoming GT3 Junior drivers. In 2026, selected drivers from the American series will take the next step on the pathway to professional racing through the McLaren Trophy Academy. As part of the program, they will visit the McLaren Technology Centre—the brand's global headquarters—where they will be assessed for potential progression into the factory driver ranks.
