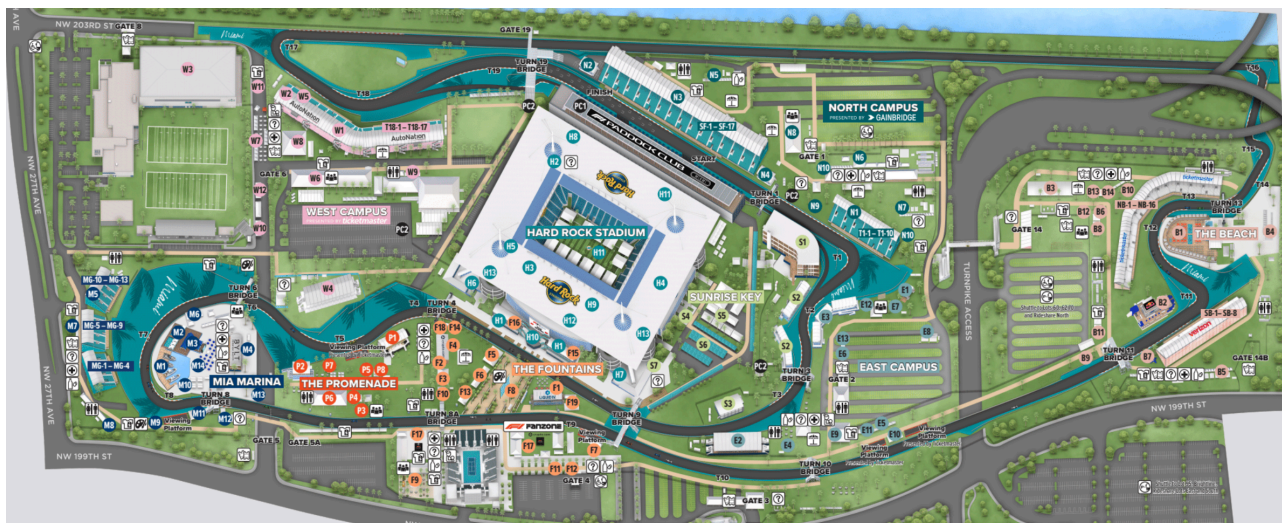

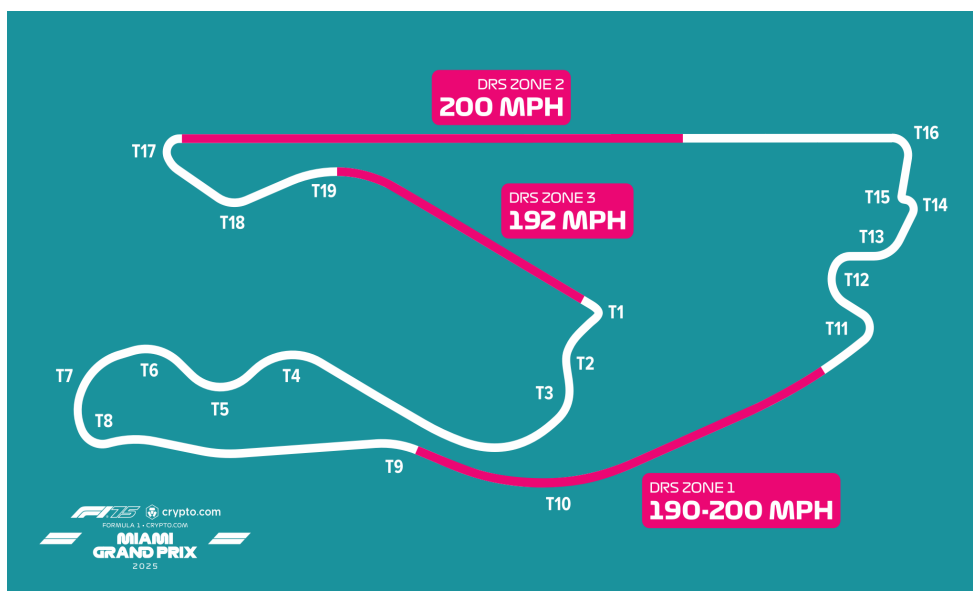

Greater Miami & Miami Beach is a tapestry of diverse and exciting neighborhoods. Each is a unique destination in and of itself thanks to the diverse cultures, landscapes and people that call these places home. There's something new to experience each time you visit.

MIAMI BEACH

Miami Beach is a global arts and culture destination. It has a rich history as a cultural center, from the world-famous entertainment scene of the 1950s to today's modern South Beach. The Atlantic Ocean stretches along the beach for miles, lined with Art Deco and mid-century modern hotels. Visit the Art Deco Historic District, explore Miami Beach museums, visit cool shopping districts, enjoy family-friendly activities and see performances at unique venues. This slender, nine-mile-long barrier island is divided into three distinct neighborhoods: South Beach, Mid Beach and North Beach.

Currency

The national currency of Miami, Florida is the American Dollar (USD) and supplied by the U.S. Federal Reserve. American paper currency come in seven denominations: \$1, \$2, \$5, \$10, \$20, \$50, and \$100.

Language

English is the official language in Miami, but due to the large immigration of people from various Spanish speaking regions, Spanish is also a dominant language and is spoken by 60 percent of the population.

Gratuities

Taxes

Sales tax in Miami-Dade County is 7 percent. Hotel taxes (including sales tax) range from 11 to 14 percent depending on the location of the property.

Driving & Traffic Regulations

Right turns are permitted at red lights unless otherwise indicated. Always note posted speed limits. All persons riding in an automobile are required to wear seatbelts. Children under five years of age must be fastened securely in government-approved child car seats.

Division of Drivers Licenses: 305/229-6333. The State of Florida recognizes valid U.S. driver licenses, international driver licenses and valid licenses in other countries.

Tow-away Zones: Tow-away zones are indicated by signs posted at the curb.

Liquor Laws & Smoking

The legal drinking age is 21. Smoking and vaping are prohibited inside restaurants in Miami-Dade County.

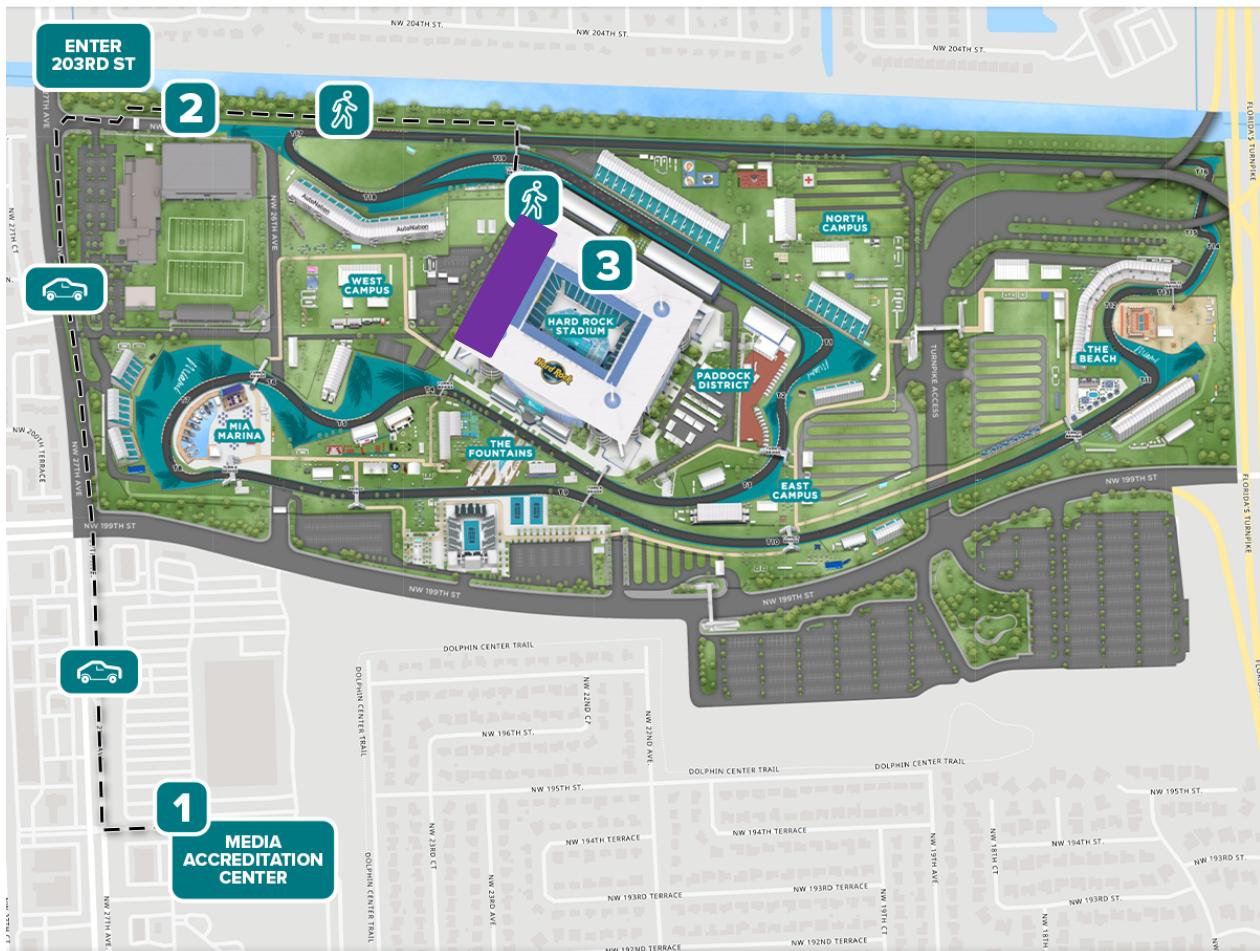

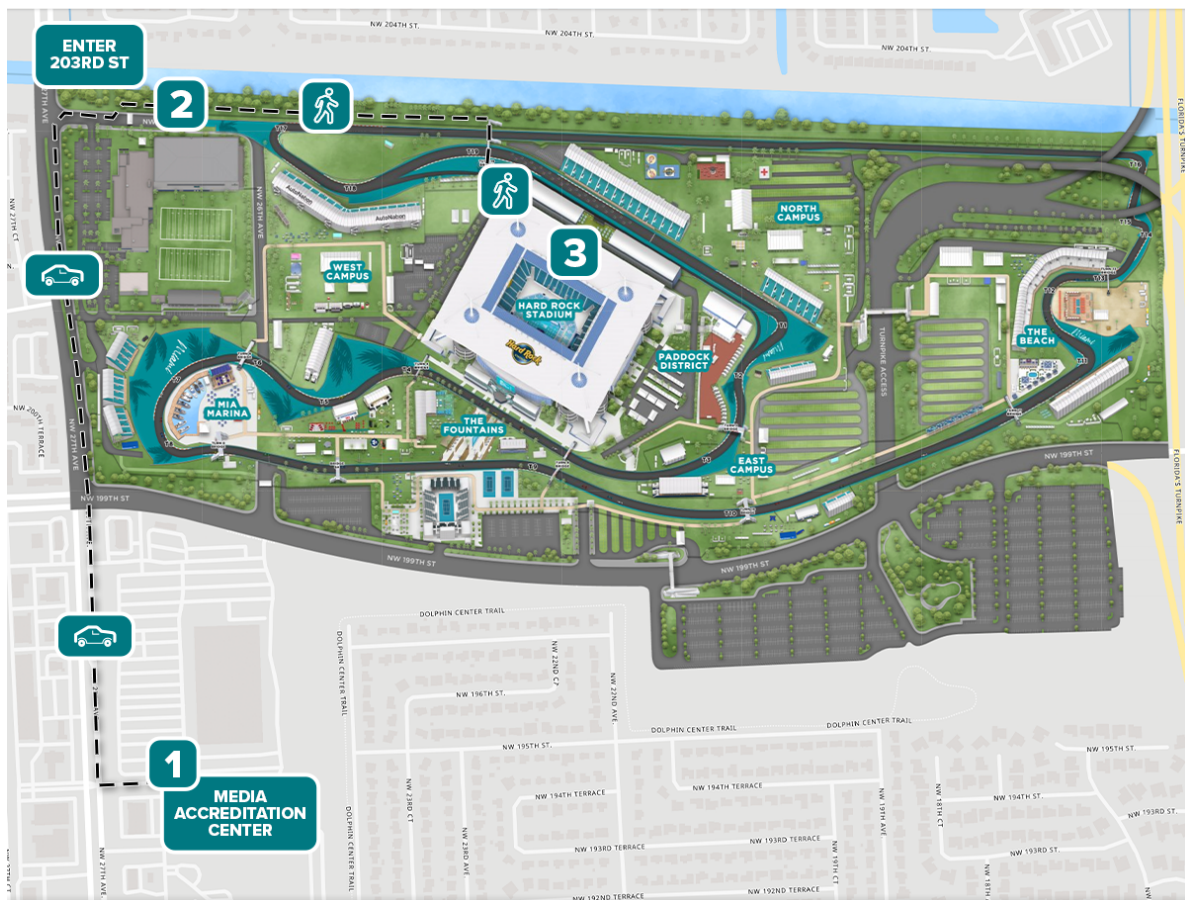

3.4 CHANGES IN FORMULA 1 IN 2025 (SOURCE FORMULA 1.COM)

One year out from a major overhaul of the technical regulations, you'd be forgiven for thinking that nothing is changing this year. But there are still a number of tweaks to the rules for the 2025 F1 season, and here we run you through the main ones that are worth knowing about.

1. The removal of the fastest lap point

Since 2019, a driver finishing in the top 10 could earn a bonus point by setting the fastest lap of the race. Sometimes that meant drivers would still be pushing late on trying to take the accolade, or even make late pit stops for fresh rubber to increase their return. But it also opened up the possibility for a car outside the top 10 to pit and take the point away from another driver, even if they weren't going to score themselves.

And with the bonus sometimes proving a controversial topic, the decision was taken to remove it from the scoring system this year. The rest of the points system remains unchanged, with the top 10 drivers scoring in a Grand Prix, and the top eight in a Sprint.

2. Driver cooling systems

If a weather forecast predicts temperatures of 31C or above at some time during a Sprint or Grand Prix, a Heat Hazard can be declared. Teams will subsequently be notified by the FIA of the declaration and will be required to fit a mandated driver cooling system.

This, in turn, leads to an increase in the weight limit of the cars with two different limits applied - an additional 2kg for practice, Qualifying and Sprint Qualifying sessions, but a total of +5kg for a Sprint or Grand Prix. The two different weight limits are in place to allow teams to fit the base system to ease workloads, but without needing to fill it with cooling fluid - as it is not considered necessary to mandate use of the system in a practice or qualifying type session due to the shorter run nature of these sessions.

A driver cooling system is "defined as a system, the sole purpose of which, is to provide additional cooling for the driver", and is set to be delivered in the form of a fireproof shirt that allows a fluid to be pumped around a series of tubes. It also includes a pump, plumbing and a thermal store to generate the cooling (such as an ice block).

3. Limits to race drivers testing old cars

A year ago, there was a tweak to the Testing of Previous Car (TPC) regulations as teams had to use components that had run during a race weekend at least once. This time around, the changes relate to the drivers getting behind the wheel.

While teams can carry out up to a maximum of 20 days of TPC running in any given calendar year, their race drivers are only allowed to take part in four such days, during which they are not allowed to exceed 1000km of running in total.

The restriction only relates to TPC track time - using a car that is at least two seasons old - and not tyre testing or promotional running with current machinery. Teams are also only allowed to have one TPC car available to run during a test at any one time.

4. More running for rookies

The mandatory FP1 running for rookie drivers has been expanded for 2025, ensuring double the amount of track time during a race weekend for those who have participated in no more than two F1 races in their career.

Teams have had to run a rookie at least once in each of their cars - so on two occasions in total - each season since 2022, but as of this year that number increases to twice per car. So, with each team made up of two cars, that means four occasions during the year when they will run an inexperienced driver for the first practice session of a weekend.

5. Tighter restrictions on DRS designs and wing deflections

The FIA has tightened up the technical regulations surrounding the rear wing and DRS (Drag Reduction System), with the main changes focusing on defining the state of deployment and restriction to only two positions (closed and open).

This has been brought in to close off "mini-DRS" concepts - where the top elements of a rear wing tilt backwards at speed to reduce drag.

There will also be more stringent testing of the rear wing slot gap to limit how much deflection is acceptable, up from an applied load of 10 newtons to 30 newtons.

Other related areas include a new deflection limit on the upper rear wing, to reduce the gap allowed between the rear wing profiles and the rear wing tips.

6. Tweaks to qualifying classifications

Last year's Sao Paulo Grand Prix raised the possibility of qualifying not being possible due to the weather, and it has now been written into the regulations that, as long as the stewards accept that a qualifying session can't take place, the grid for the race will be defined based upon the Drivers' Championship classification.

The same applies for a Sprint Qualifying session not being able to take place. In both cases, if the Drivers' Championship order can't be used (such as at the first round of the season) then a grid order will be decided at the stewards' discretion.

The way a qualifying classification will be reached in the event of multiple drivers failing to set a time in Q2 or Q3 (or SQ2 or SQ3) has also been clarified. While drivers will continue to be ordered based on whether they started a flying lap, ahead of those who left the pits to make an attempt, if there are any drivers who don't set a lap time and can't be separated by those metrics, then the order from the previous segment of the session will be used.

As an example, if two drivers start flying laps in Q3 but fail to complete them due to a red flag and don't set a time, then they will be classified in the order based on who was fastest between them in Q2.

7. A mule car tyre test

The end-of-season test in Abu Dhabi will take on a slightly different form this year, due to the major change in regulations that will come into force in 2026.

While the Young Driver Test will run as usual - with a current car being used by a driver who has started no more than two Grands Prix - the second car has to be a mule car that is adapted for the purpose of testing the 2026 tyres.

Those tyres will be of a different dimension and specification to the 2025 Pirelli rubber, and the expected performance characteristics of the next generation of cars will also differ, so teams can use either their 2025 car, or any car falling within the previous four years, that has been "suitably modified for the purpose of providing the appointed tyre supplier with a means of track testing of its future products".

Sprint Events

This year Miami will host an F1 Sprint again which will bring three days of competitive track action to the Miami International Autodrome. Originally devised in 2021, the Sprint offers an extra qualifying session and a 100km race in place of practice. The Sprint is one-third of the distance of a Grand Prix and lasts for approximately half an hour.

Miami is the second of six events to host a Sprint in 2025, following the first in China at the previous round. Belgium, Austin, Brazil and Qatar will also feature Sprint races this year. All tracks were chosen based on their overtaking potential, as drivers are encouraged to race flat-out to the checkered flag.

Last year, it was decided to update the weekend timetable for races hosting this format. Sprint Qualifying (formerly known as the Shootout) takes place on Friday afternoon with the shorter-distance race taking place on Saturday at lunchtime. Qualifying for the main event will continue in its usual Saturday afternoon slot with the 57-lap FORMULA 1 CRYPTO.COM MIAMI GRAND PRIX on Sunday.

Sprint Qualifying on Friday afternoon follows a similar format to traditional Qualifying, with five drivers eliminated at each stage, but with a shorter time for each session to increase the jeopardy. The three stages, SQ1, SQ2 and SQ3 last 12 minutes, 10 minutes and just eight minutes respectively. Medium compound tires are mandatory for the first two sessions, while softs must be used for SQ3.

When the Sprint was expanded to six events last year, it became a standalone feature of the weekend with points now awarded to the top eight finishers. There are no points for fastest lap and no mandatory pit stops.

While the Sprint no longer determines the grid for the Grand Prix, it can still have an influence on the outcome. For example, any significant crash damage might lead to a chassis change and that would result in a pit lane start for the main event. And any drivers that pick up a grid penalty for an on-track misdemeanor would need to serve those in the Grand Prix itself. It's why you'll need to keep an eye on all the track action in Miami across the whole weekend.

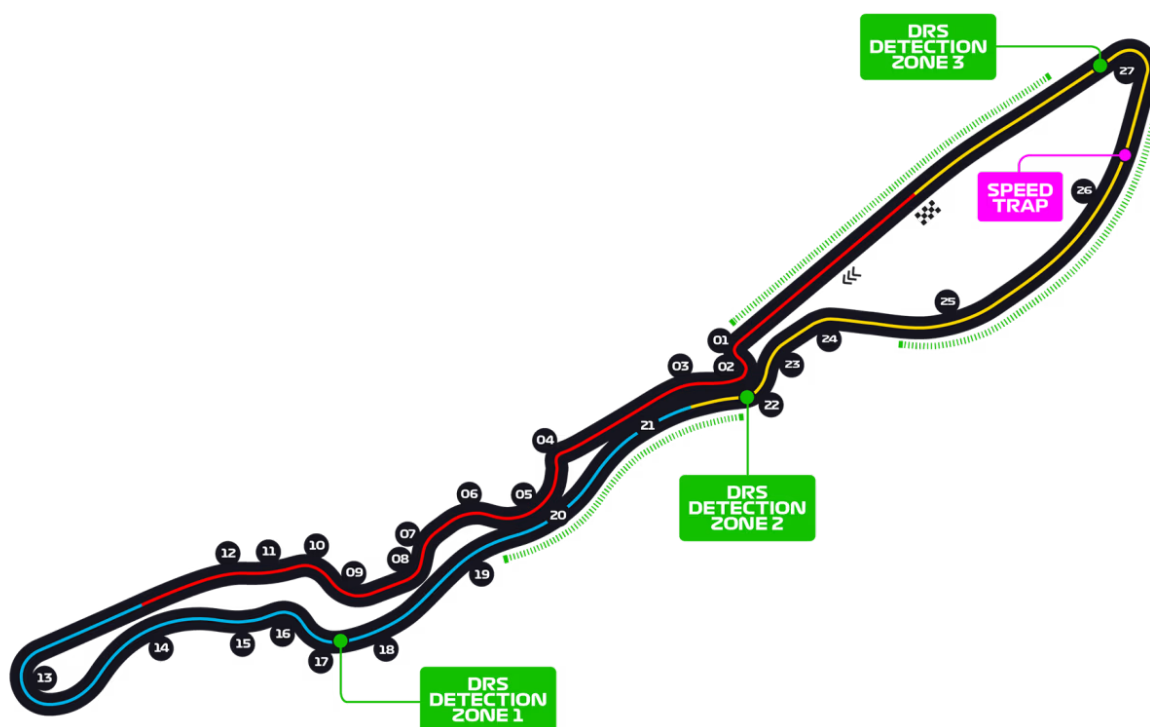
You can usually expect great racing and decent amounts of overtaking in Bahrain, while the drivers have to contend with wind, racing under floodlights and the difficulty of finding a decent set-up with the wide temperature fluctuations between sessions. The track's most challenging point is the tight, downhill, off-camber Turn 10 left-hander, while the fast run through Turn 12 is another highlight, allowing the racers to really feel their cars coming alive.

Since the inaugural Saudi Arabian Grand Prix took place in 2001, it has been recognised as the world's longest and fastest street race. It joins its Middle Eastern counterparts in Bahrain and Abu Dhabi - while like those races, the Saudi Arabian Grand Prix also takes place under floodlights.

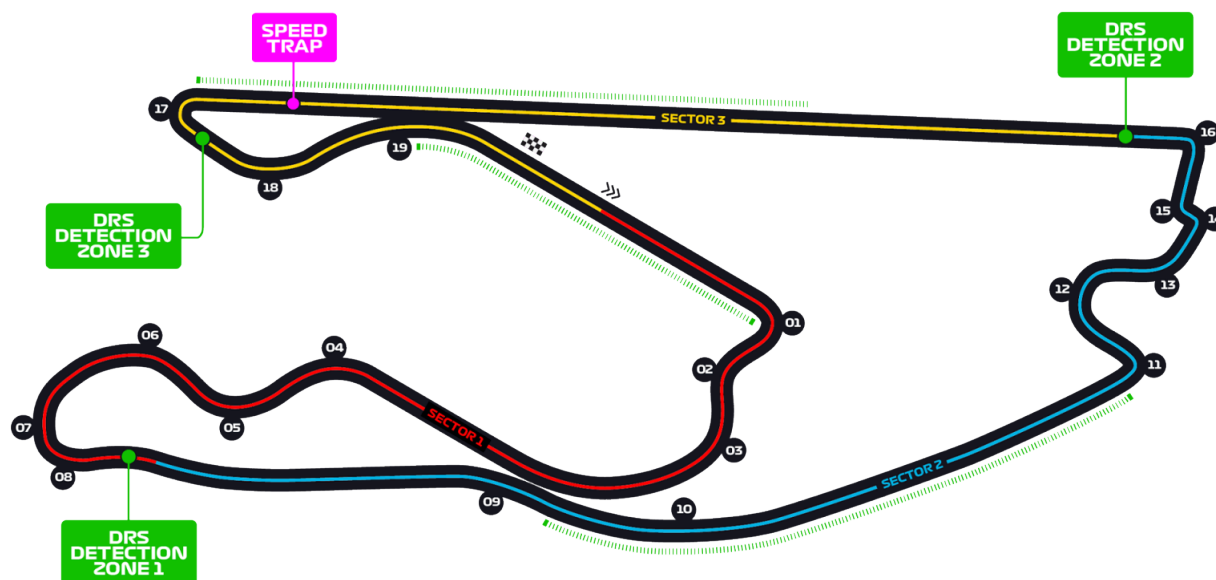
The circuit is fast. Very fast. Average speeds around the Jeddah Corniche Circuit are around 250km/h - quicker than those at Silverstone, and second only to Monza - aka 'The Temple of Speed'. It is, quite simply, the fastest street circuit ever seen in Formula 1 - while the track also features the most corners on the calendar with 27, many of them quick, sinuous bends as the drivers wend their way along the Jeddah waterfront.

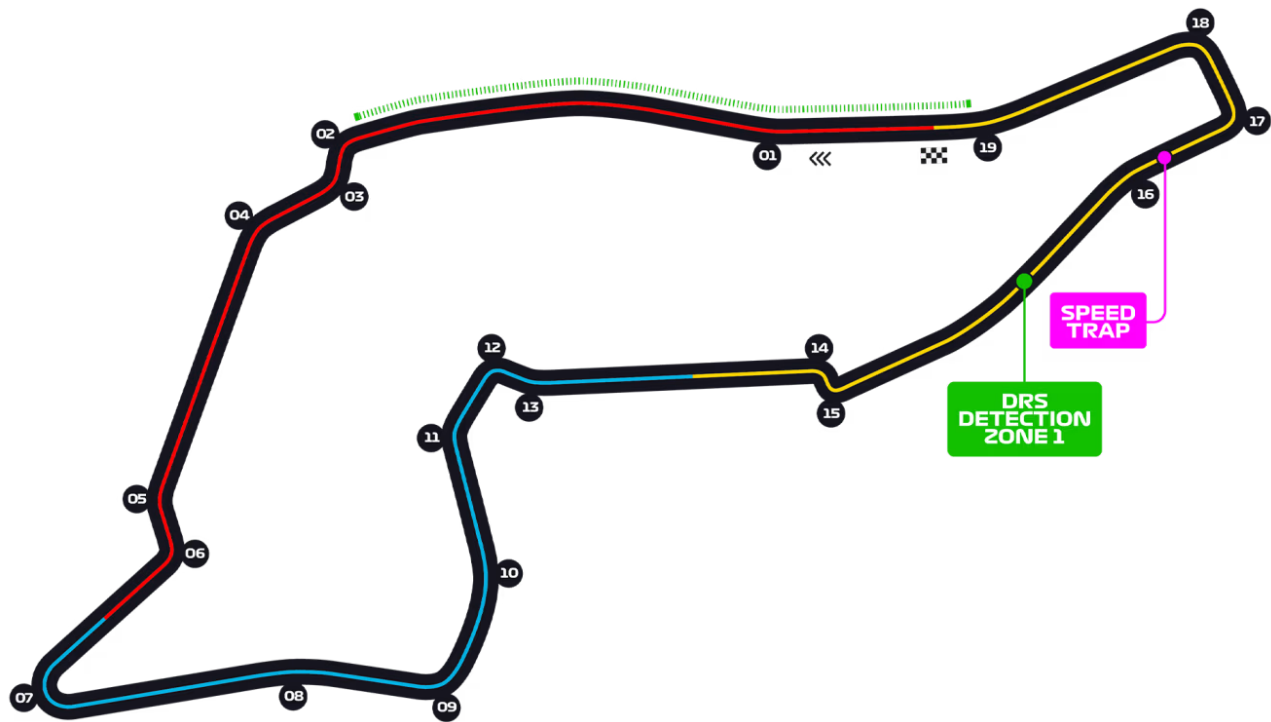


Having made its F1 debut in May 2022, the Miami International Autodrome is a temporary circuit, but one designed to have a permanent feel. Set in the Hard Rock Stadium complex in Miami Gardens, home to the NFL's famous Miami Dolphins franchise, the track is the culmination of a development process that simulated no less than 36 different layouts before settling on a thrilling, 19-turn lap that provides a street circuit vibe, not dissimilar to Melbourne's Albert Park.

The Florida race is one of three US races on the calendar alongside the Austin and Las Vegas Grand Prix.

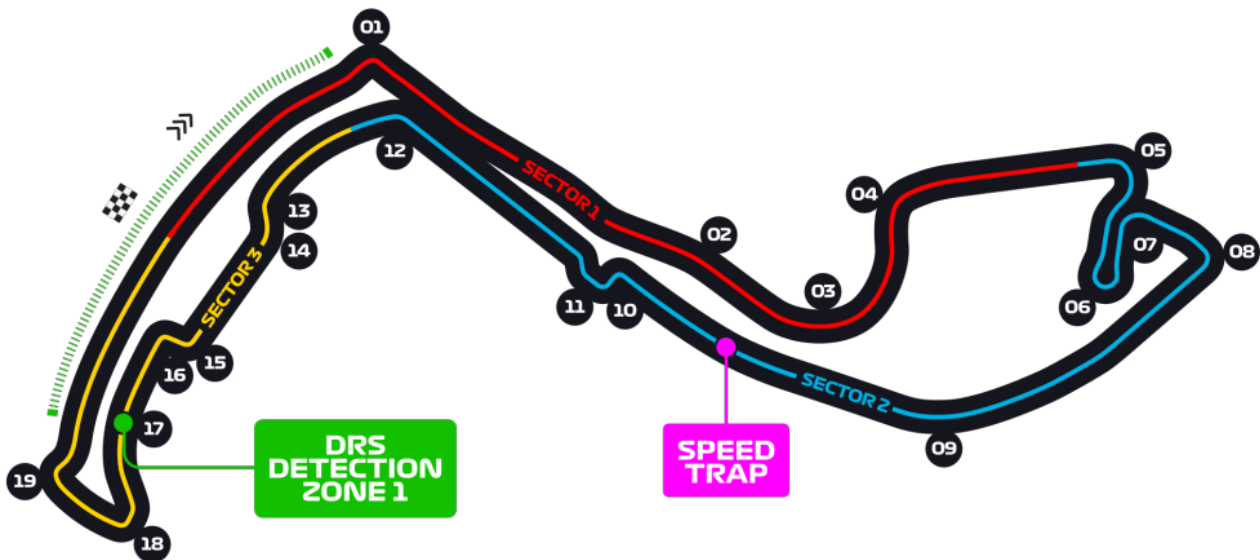


Imola had its foundation stone laid in March 1950. It was ready for testing by October 1952, while racing began at the circuit in 1953. The track was first awarded the honour of hosting the Italian Grand Prix in 1980. From 1981, Imola was taking on its famous 'San Marino' title and going on to host a total of 27 Grand Prix up until 2006. Imola returned to the F1 calendar amid the Covid-19 changes of 2020 and only recently signed a contract until 2025.

The circuit offers a thrill ride. After testing his AlphaTauri AT01 at the track in the build-up to the 2020 season, Pierre Gasly called the experience one of the best he'd ever had in a Formula 1 car. The anti-clockwise circuit is certainly fast, with an old-school feel as the drivers put it on the line in iconic corners like Acque Minerali and Piratella.

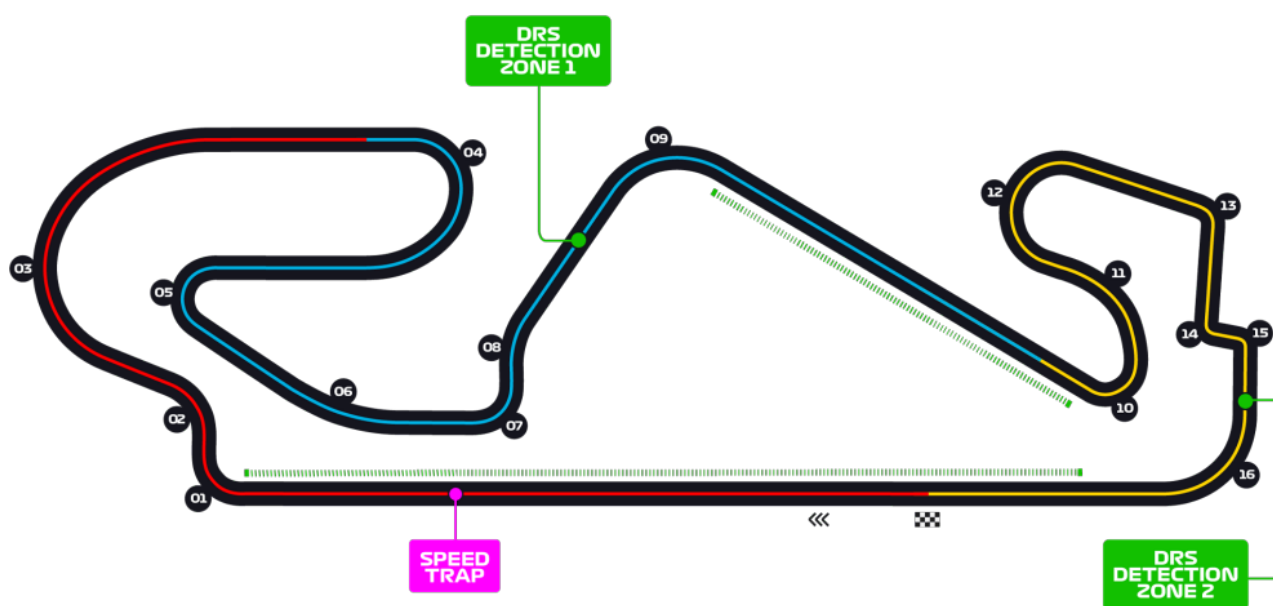


Monaco remains one of the most prestigious and iconic auto races in the world, long recognized for its entertainment and celebrity presence. It is a track nearly all drivers love, forcing them to put their skills on the line and rewarding millimetric accuracy. Overtaking on the tight streets is harder, however, with the 2003 Grand Prix witnessing a grand total of zero passing moves.

Motorsport's most famous street circuit takes six weeks to build up and organize, offering drivers with the challenge of negotiating numerous elevations shifts and very tight corners, including one of the slowest corners in F1 racing.

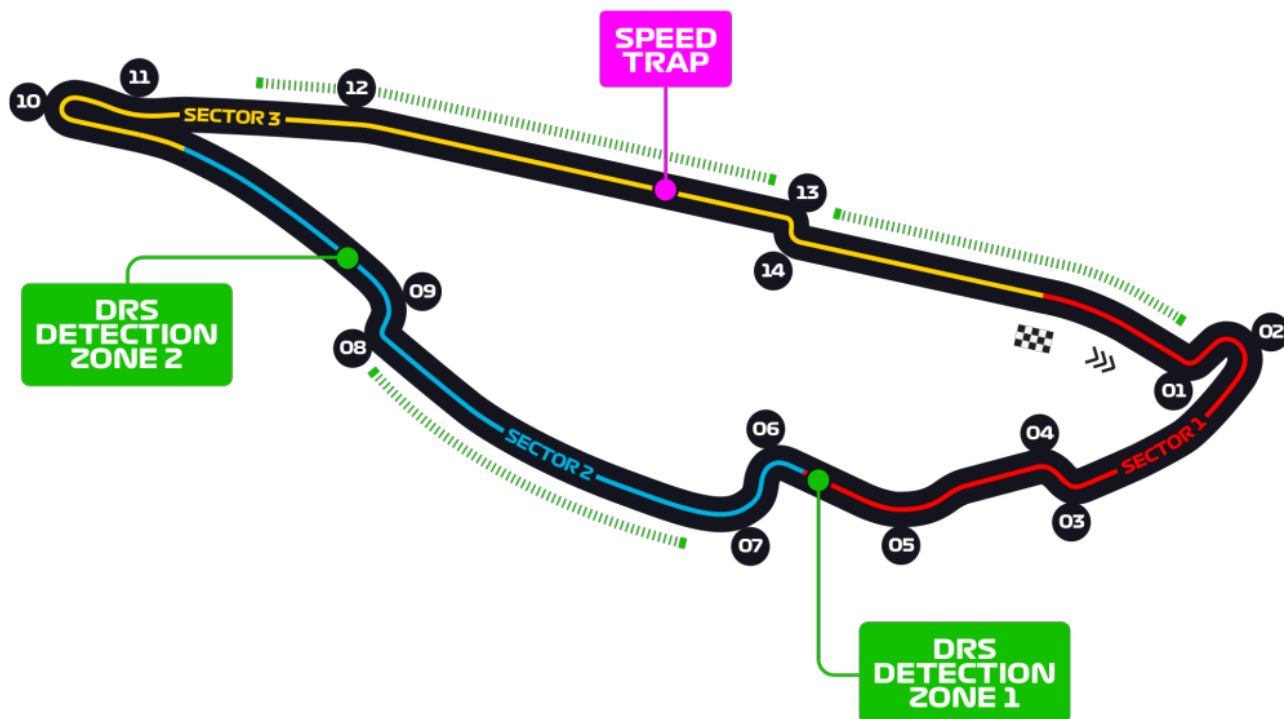


The Circuit de Catalunya was built in 1989 through the efforts of a Consortium composed of the Catalan Government, the Reial Automòbil Club de Catalunya (RACC) and the Montmeló Town Council. In September 1991, the 35th Spanish F1 Grand Prix was held following a 17 year absence. The circuit features a good mix of high and low speed corners, with the challenging Turn 3 right-hander a great chance to evaluate the balance of the car.

The track offers plenty of choice for spectators with almost the whole track overlooked by grandstands or general admission areas. On the outside of Turn 1, Grandstand A will let you see the best overtaking spot on the track, while the general admission area around Turn 3 will provide the awe-inspiring sight of Formula 1 cars being pushed to the limit of their downforce capabilities.

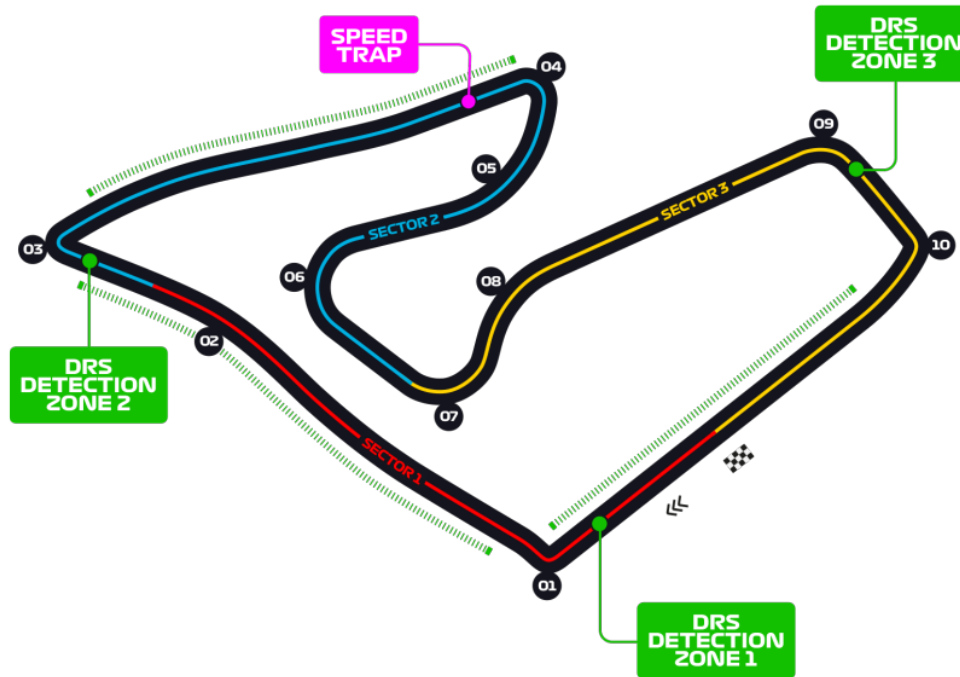

The fast, low-downforce circuit is one of the drivers' favourites. The track is quite stop-start, with lots of heavy-braking chicanes and the famous hairpin to get the anchors working hard. Out of the corners, though, the track is quick and flowing, while the most iconic piece of the circuit comes right at the end of the lap: the Wall of Champions, so-called after excursions into it from Damon Hill, Jacques Villeneuve and Michael Schumacher during the 1999 Canadian Grand Prix weekend.

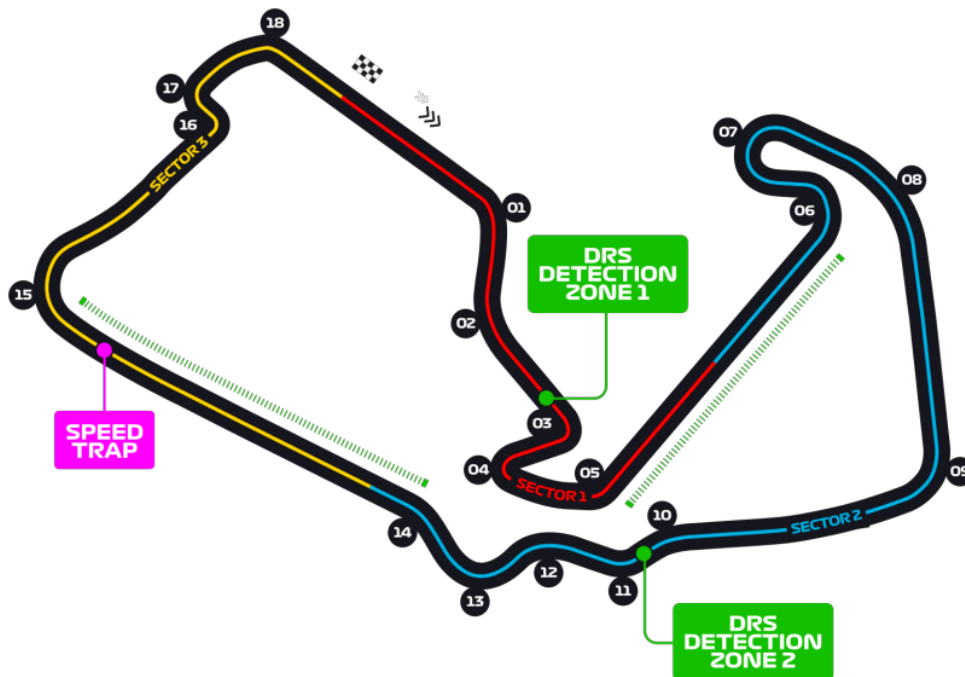

The Red Bull Ring packs a lot into a short lap. The first half rewards power, as the cars blast along three straights separated by a pair of uphill right-handers. 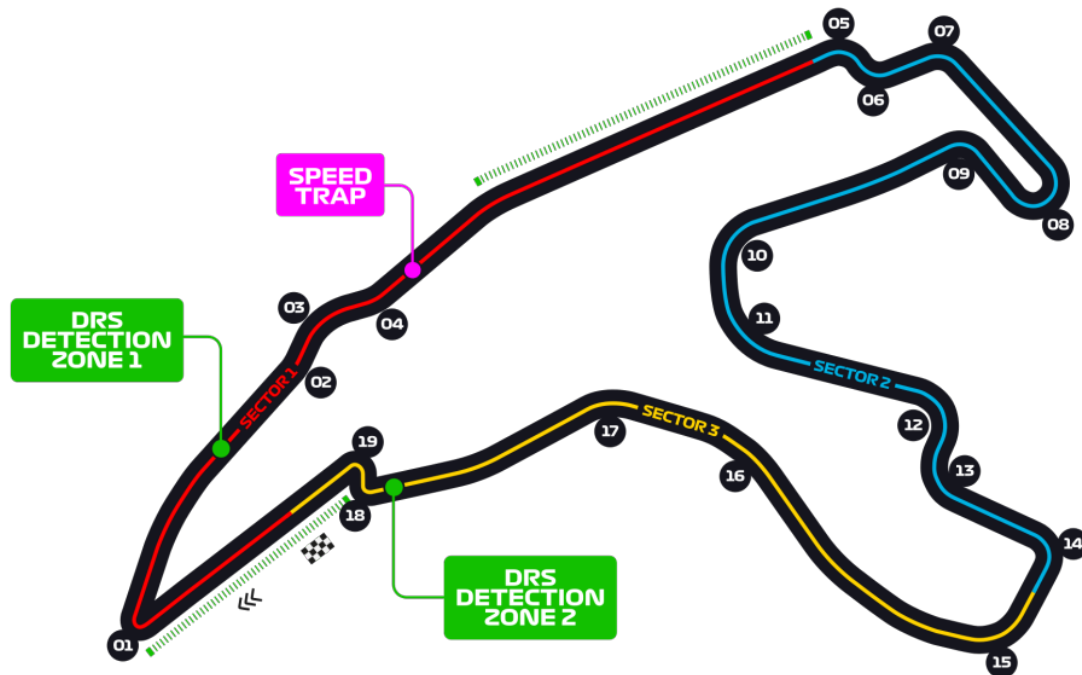


The first Formula 1 World Championship round on May 13th, 1950 was hosted at Silverstone. It continues to be a top draw for fans of Formula 1, offering a rich tradition of racing, a fast and challenging track, as well as the constant prospect of weather playing a critical role in race day strategy. It's hard to stop the goose bumps from prickling as you walk around one of the great cathedrals of motorsport, while in terms of atmosphere, the British fans are always reliably raucous.

At the 2018 British Grand Prix, Lewis Hamilton compared a flat-out lap around Silverstone to flying a fighter jet, which should tell you all you need to know about the Northamptonshire circuit. Despite numerous layout changes over the years, Silverstone has always maintained its essential character as one of the fastest tracks on the F1 calendar, while historic corners like Maggotts, Becketts and Abbey provide some of the biggest challenges for racing drivers anywhere in the world.

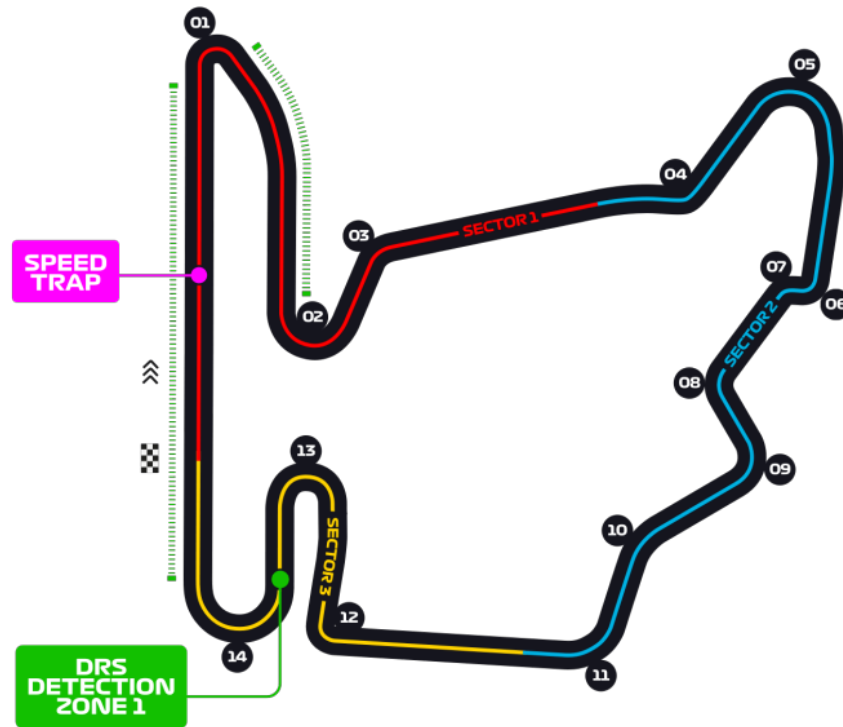


The Circuit de Spa-Francorchamps is legendary among race enthusiasts for its long-standing history and unique setting. It is considered one of the most challenging tracks in the world, mainly due to its fast, hilly, and twisty layout within the Ardennes Forest. The size of the track and the nature of Belgian weather means it can sometimes be raining on one part of the track and dry on another, meaning grip can vary from one corner to the next.

Spa is among Formula 1 drivers' most loved tracks, with its mix of long straights and challenging fast corners allowing them to push their cars to the edge of their capabilities - if it's dry, that is. The size of the track and the nature of Belgian weather means it can sometimes be raining on one part of the track and dry on another, meaning grip can vary from one corner to the next. Keep an eye on the thrilling Eau Rouge, arguably the most famous sequence of corners in the world, as the drivers flick left, right, and then up the hill through Raidillon.

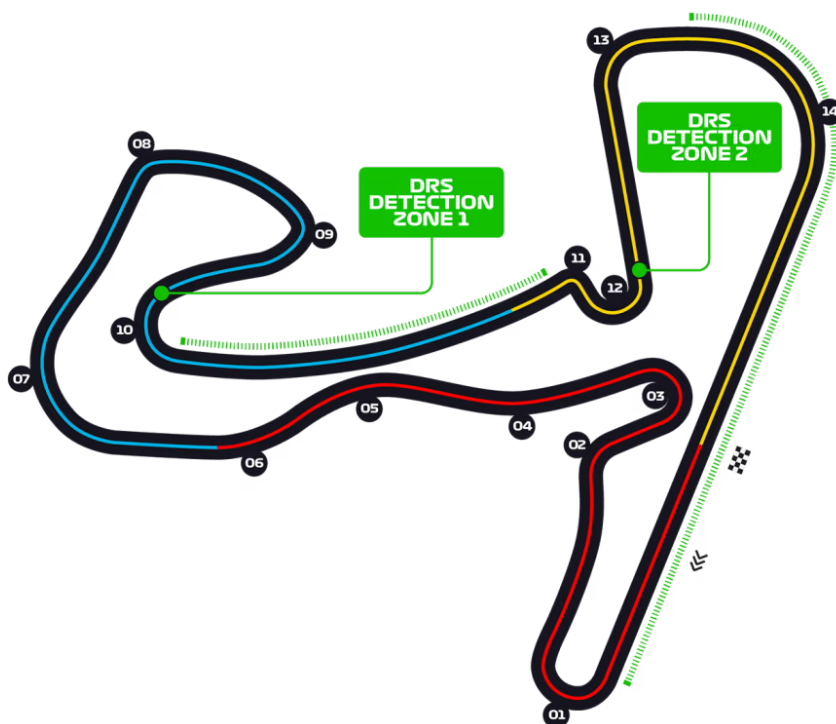
Home of the first Grand Prix to have been held behind the “Iron Curtain” in 1986. The Hungaroring was built in record time and remains today a major attraction in Hungary.

Held in the summer, the circuit is built in a natural bowl allowing excellent vantage points for spectators. That means that any of the grandstands located on or around the main straight should provide a view of other parts of the track too.

The lack of straights at the Hungaroring often sees it compared to a karting circuit - and it's true, the resemblance is uncanny. With several series of corners to string together, teams opt for Monaco levels of downforce, with a well-sorted chassis tending to be rewarded over horsepower given the short straights on offer. It's a challenge many of the drivers relish, however, with finding a good rhythm key to setting fast lap times.

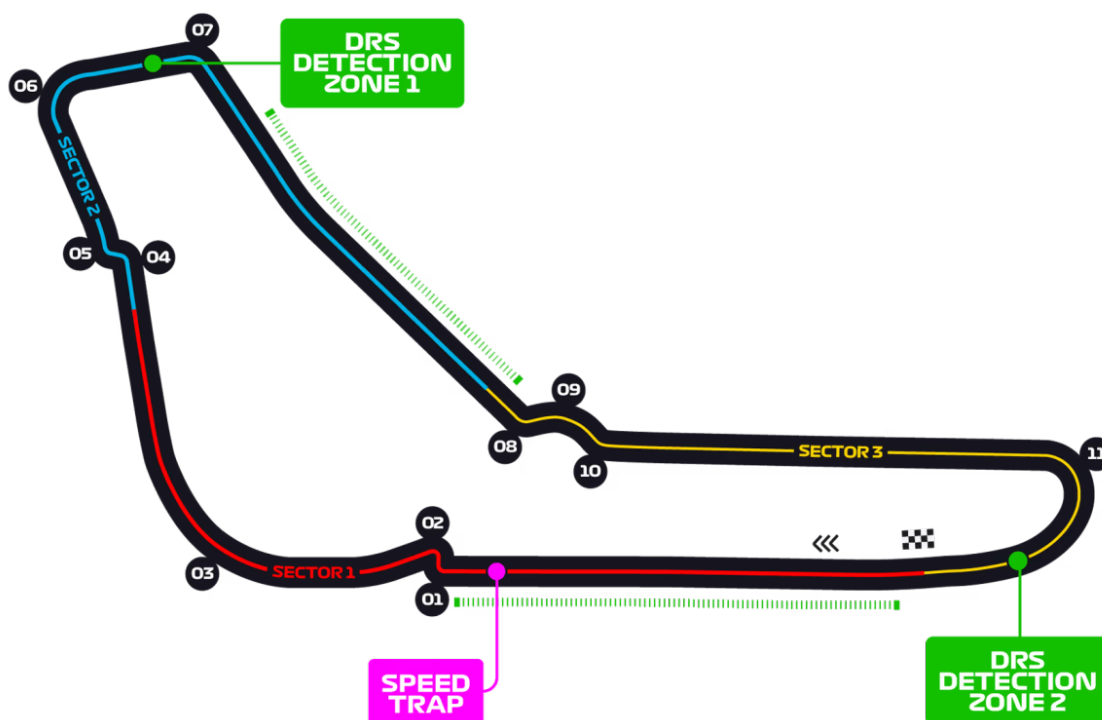


Zandvoort was first opened in 1948, part of the wave of post-war motorsport enthusiasm that swept across Europe. Originally made up of a mixture of permanent track and public roads that snaked through the sand dunes of the Zandvoort resort town, the Dutch Automobile Racing Club - who initiated the plans for the circuit - brought in 1927 Le Mans winner Sammy Davis to consult on the layout for the original 4.2km track. After a break since 1985, Formula 1 returned to Zandvoort in 2021.

The current F1 drivers describe the track 'really quick', 'pretty insane', 'crazy' and 'old-school' that many of them tackled in their junior category days. We'd also add 'undulating' to that list. The Zandvoort track swoops and flows through the sand dunes, creating a rollercoaster-like feel to the lap.

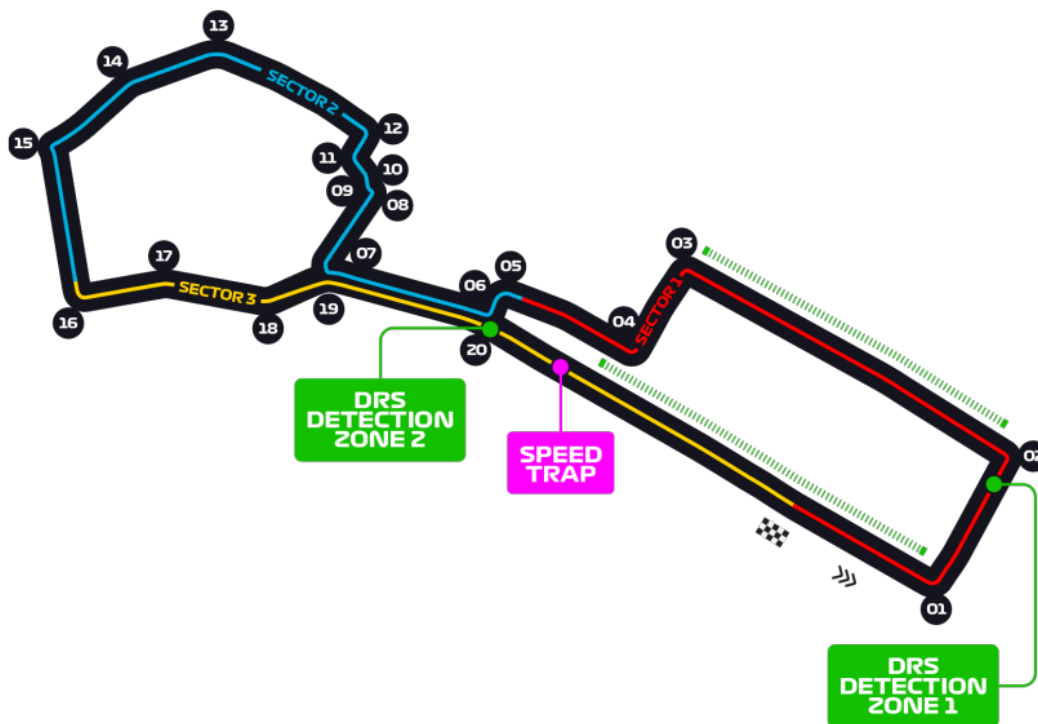


The Autodromo Nazionale Monza was built in just 110 days and is the world's third purpose-built racetrack, coming after Brooklands in the UK and Indianapolis in the US. Monza opened its doors on September 3, 1922, just a week before it hosted that year's Italian Grand Prix. It was then part of the original Formula 1 calendar in 1950 and has held the Italian Grand Prix every year bar one since.

Formula 1's fastest ever lap was set at Monza - Williams driver Juan Pablo Montoya's 260.6km/h effort during practice for the 2004 Grand Prix - which should give you some idea of the nature of the track the locals call 'La Pista Magica'. Cars are on full throttle for 80 percent of the lap and hit their Vmax on the circuit's 1.1km start/finish straight. From there, they roar off into the historic park section, where a series of big stops into tight chicanes give the brakes a good workout.

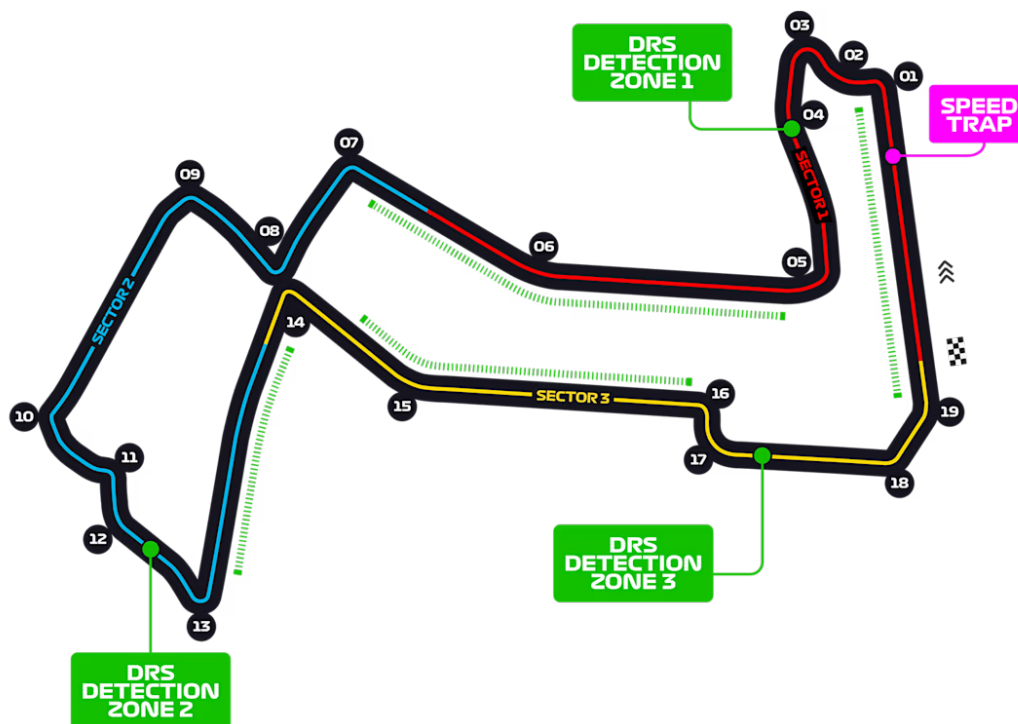

The six kilometre, anti-clockwise layout of the circuit offers a mixture of wide and open straights as well as tight and twisty corners. The circuit starts with a long main straight along the Baku shoreline, then loop around Government House before heading west to Maiden Tower. Here, the track has a narrow uphill traversal and then circle the Old Town before opening up onto a 2.2 km (1.4 mi) stretch along Neftchilar Avenue back to the start line.

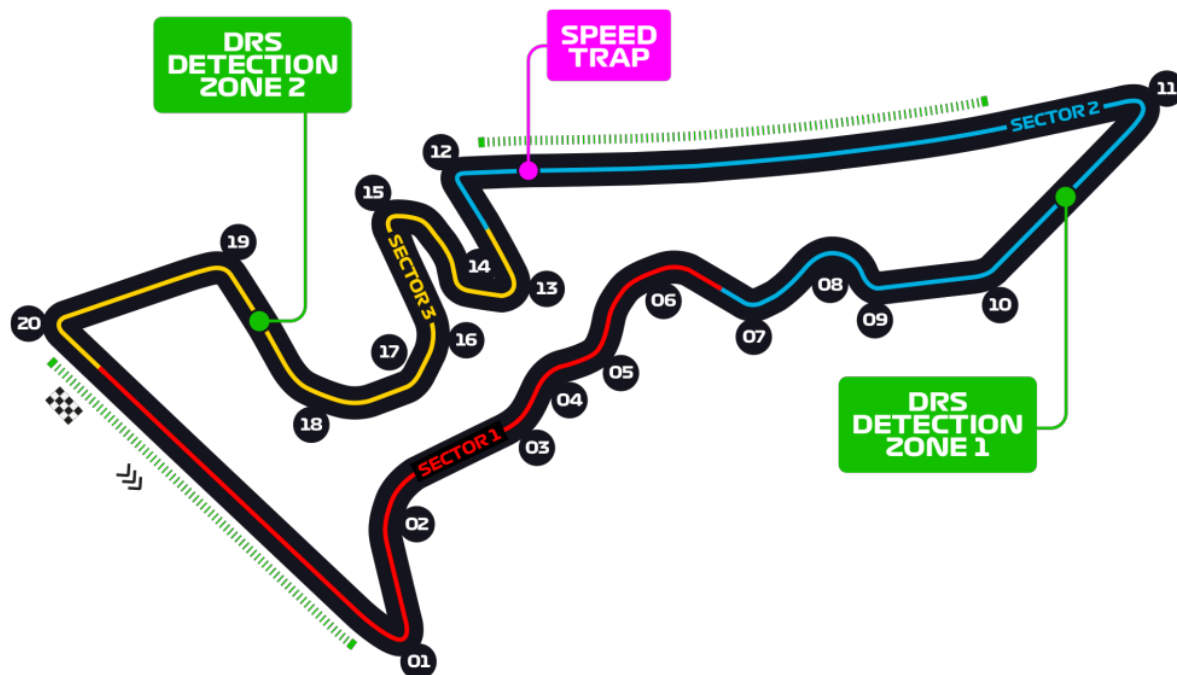

With 23 corners, they are working the wheel a lot, too, around the high-speed lap - the physical stress causing them to lose as much as 3kg over the course of a race.

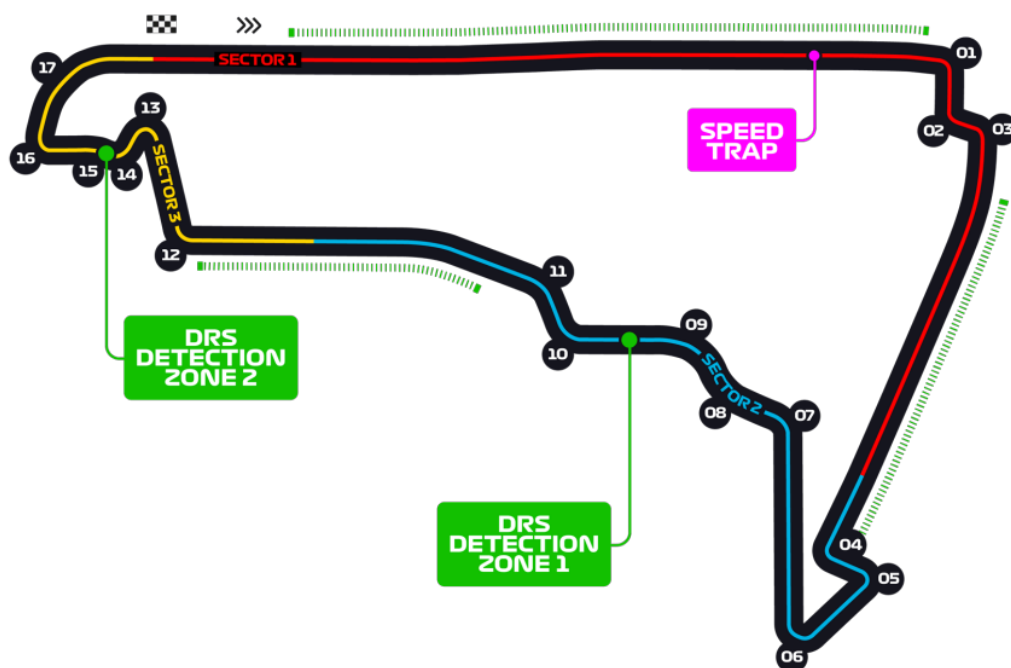


The Circuit of The Americas, designed by Hermann Tilke in collaboration with American architectural firm HKS, endured something of a nervy start, with construction suffering several setbacks. It was well worth the wait, though, when 1978 F1 champion Mario Andretti opened the track on October 21 2012.

If the corners at COTA seem familiar, they should be. Turns 3 through 6 look not dissimilar to Silverstone's high-speed run through Maggotts/Becketts or the S Curves at Suzuka, while Turns 12 through 15 mimic Hockenheim's stadium section. Meanwhile, the uphill run into wide, wide Turn 1 has provided some fine overtaking action in the track's short life.

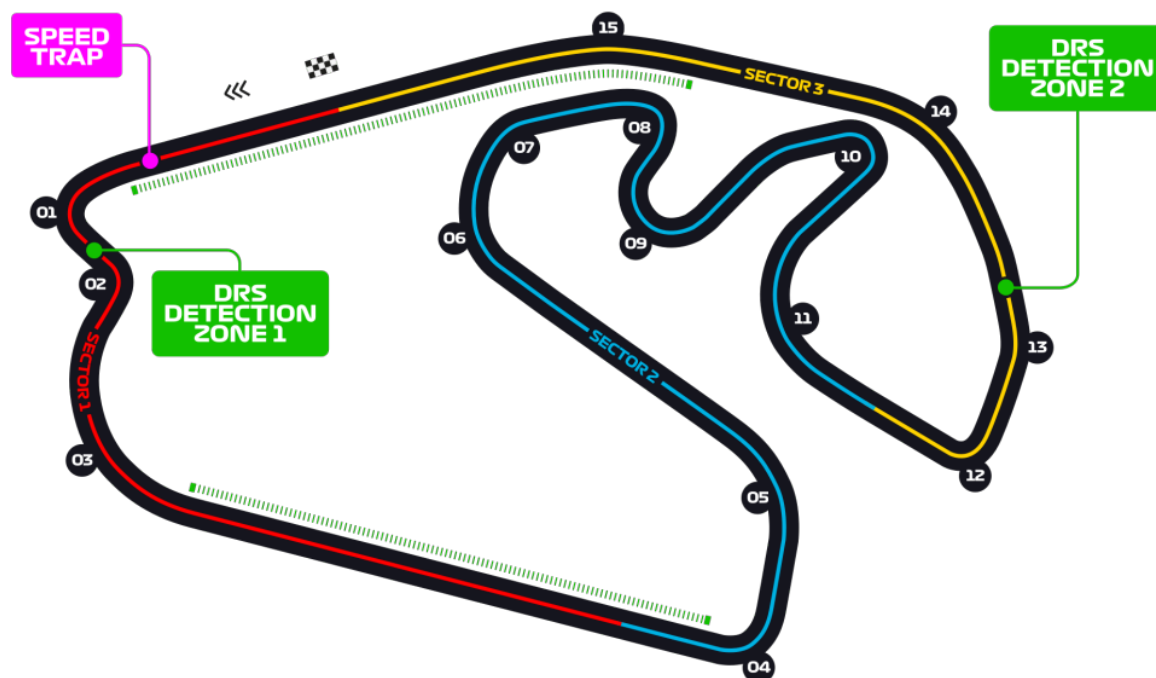
In 1959, the father of Mexico's most famous racing brothers, Ricardo and Pedro Rodriguez, was an advisor to Mexican President Adolfo Lopez Mateo, and had a word in his boss's ear about building a racing circuit in Mexico City's Magdalena Mixiuhca sports park using the existing internal roads. El Presidente liked the idea, and work on the track was completed in under a year.

The racetrack is located over 2,200m above sea level, which makes it the highest altitude venue on the F1 calendar. The thin air at this altitude presents a unique challenge for cars and drivers.

To put it in perspective, Brazil's Interlagos, the second-highest race location, is at around 800m above sea level.

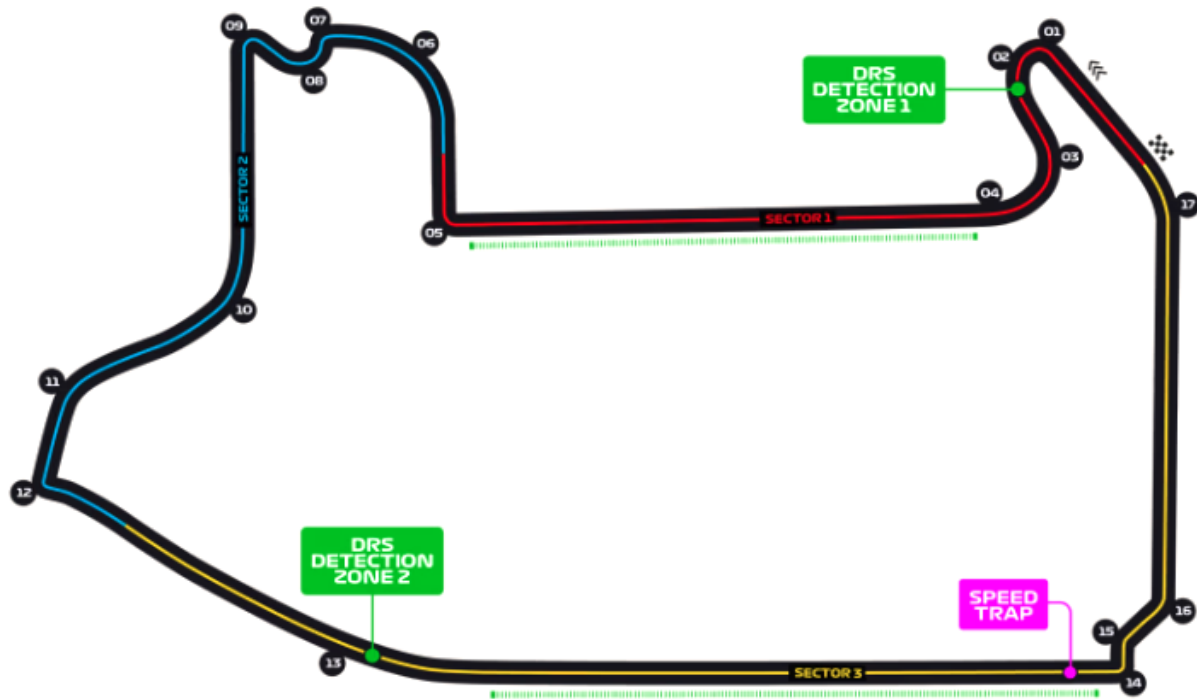


Building work began on what ended up being called the Autodromo Jose Carlos Pace - but what is more commonly referred to as Interlagos - all the way back in 1938. The track designers took their inspiration from three main circuits: Brooklands in the UK, Roosevelt Raceway in the USA and Montlhery in France.

Buoyed by the success of Brazil's Emerson Fittipaldi, Formula 1 first jetted into Interlagos for a world championship race in 1973. Fans were treated to a home win in the first three Brazilian Grands Prix, with Fittipaldi victorious in 1973 and 1974, while Carlos Pace won in 1975.

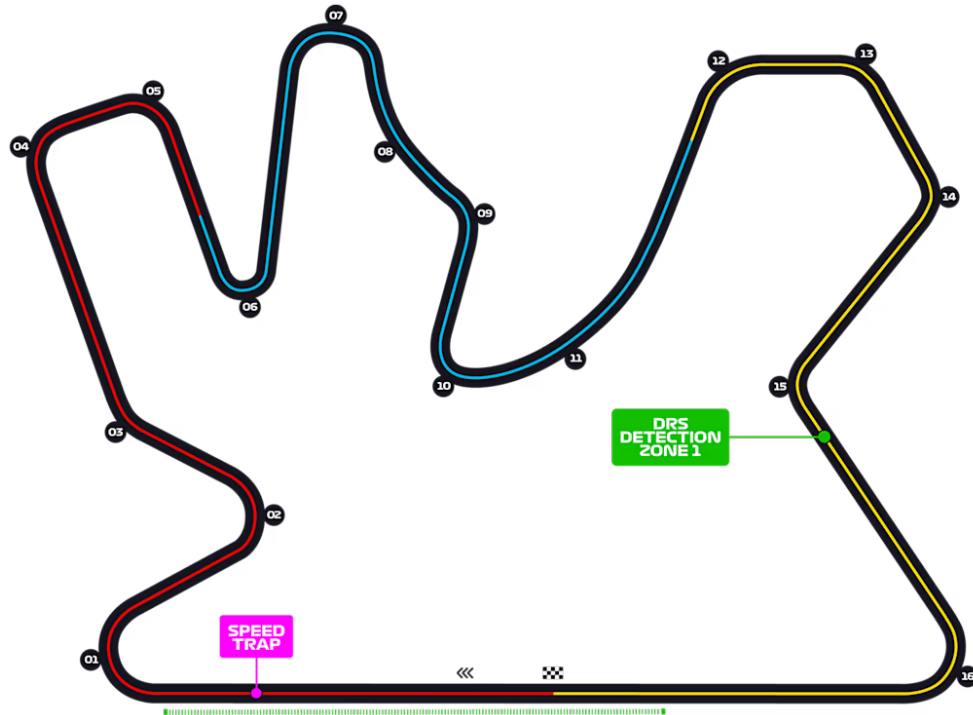

Las Vegas hosted two Formula 1 races in 1981 and 1982 on a temporary track next to the Caesars Palace hotel. The return of Formula 1 to the city took place in the heart of downtown Las Vegas - the new 6.12km, 14-turn street circuit winds its way past iconic locations like the aforementioned Caesars Palace, the Bellagio and the Venetian. Average speeds matched that of Monza, otherwise known as F1's Temple of Speed' and it provided plenty of action and overtaking.

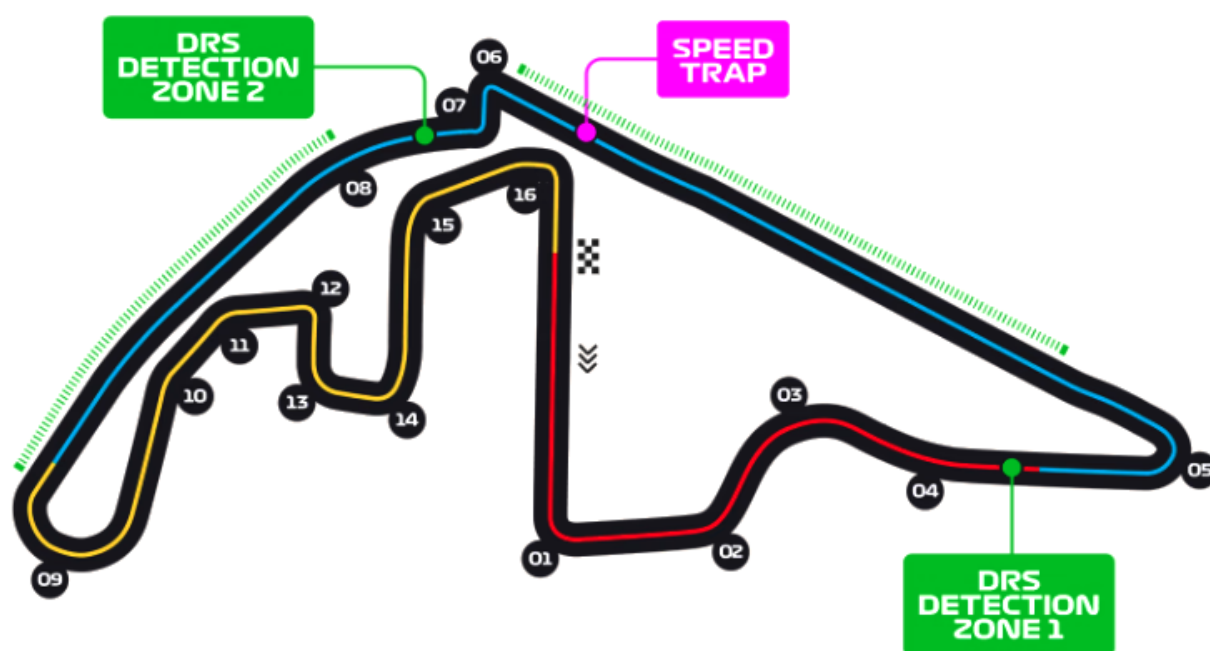


The circuit was built within just over a year in preparation for hosting Qatar's first ever MotoGP event in 2004. In 2021 Qatar hosted Formula 1 for the very first time and signed an additional 10-year deal to host the sport from 2023 - missing one year because of the FIFA World Cup.

The track is fast and flowing where medium and high-speed corners predominate. Over one kilometre of the track's total length is made up of the main straight, which provides plenty of overtaking opportunities into Turn 1.

The Hermann Tilke-designed track, inaugurated in 2009 and located on Yas Island was Formula 1's first ever day-night race, starting in the afternoon and finishing after sunset. Floodlights are activated from the start of the race to provide a transition into the evening.

The circuit is dominated by its 1.2km straight between Turns 7 and 8 - which, with slow-speed corners marking its beginning and end, makes it a honeypot for overtaking moves. Other highlights include the tricky run through Turns 15 and 16 into 17, which forces the drivers to brake hard with bags of lateral load still on the car.

6. SUPPORT RACES

6.1. F1 ACADEMY

INTRODUCTION

Launched in 2023, F1 ACADEMY™ is an ambitious new project from Formula 1 to improve female participation in motorsport, both on and off the track.

The series is designed to develop and prepare female drivers to progress to higher levels of competition by giving drivers access to more track time, racing and testing, as well as support with technical, physical, and mental preparations.

In its third season, F1 ACADEMY will once again race alongside the FIA Formula One World Championship™ featuring 14 races at seven events. This year also sees the grid expand to 18 cars, reflecting the series' rapid growth and the increasing talent pool of young female drivers. This increase will create additional opportunities for emerging talents ready to take the next step into F1 ACADEMY.

F1 ACADEMY returns to Jeddah, Miami, Zandvoort, and Singapore along with the addition of three new circuits, including the season opener in China, Canada and the season finale on Las Vegas Strip, making F1 ACADEMY the first single-seater support series to race on the streets of this major motorsport stage.

This season's calendar was designed to feature a mix of street circuits and traditional circuits and as part of the series' commitment to provide extensive seat time, the calendar will be supported by a comprehensive 15-day testing program.

F1 ACADEMY is also supported by all ten F1 teams, who each provide a driver to the series and have their livery on one car. The remaining drivers in the series are supported by Official Partners including Charlotte Tilbury, Puma, Tommy Hilfiger, American Express and TAG Heuer.

The weekend format of F1 ACADEMY for 2025 yields up to two Free Practices, one Qualifying and two races. This season Race 1 will be a reverse grid race. This grid is set by reversing the top eight fastest drivers in Qualifying, all other drivers will start where they qualified. One point will be awarded for the fastest lap within the top eight, but no points will be awarded for pole position. The Race 2 grid set by the fastest laps in Qualifying. The points allocation for Race 2 will be awarded to the top 10 classified drivers, with one point for the fastest lap within the top ten and two points for pole position.

The Wild Card entry was introduced in the 2024 season as part of an initiative to strengthen the talent pool in F1 Academy race locations, allowing talented young drivers to gain competitive experience. Six Wild Card entries were featured on the F1 Academy grid in 2024, with four previous Wild Cards securing full-time seats for 2025 with Haas, McLaren, Alpine and Red Bull respectively. The Wild Card entry will run at all seven rounds in 2025 operated by the newly added team Hitech TGR.

6.2. PORSCHE CARRERA CUP NORTH AMERICA

INTRODUCTION

Porsche Carrera Cup North America is the premier one-make race series in the United States and Canada utilizing a combination of the latest Porsche 911 GT3 Cup race car, type 992, and Yokohama's ADVAN® A005 racing slick to challenge the best road and street race courses on the continent. The fifth anniversary season of the championship is scheduled to host 16-races at eight rounds. Each 40-minute race counts toward a season-long driver and team championship in each of three classes: Pro, Pro-Am and Masters. The Porsche 911 GT3 Cup is the same race car used in the current iteration of the Porsche Mobil 1 Supercup, which has been a Formula 1 support series at European races since 1993.

As the pinnacle one-make series of the Porsche Motorsport Pyramid North America, the series is a launching point for young drivers looking to move up to open competition. Previous champions Seb Priaulx (2021), Parker Thompson (2022), Loek Hartog (2024) and two-time runner-up Kay van Berlo (2021, 2022) have each moved into open competition racing, where they compete in the SRO GT4 America, IMSA Pilot Challenge or the IMSA WeatherTech SportsCar Championship during the 2025 season.
