Appeal by the Motor Sports Association (MSA) on behalf of its competitor Chevrolet, car $\mathbf{N}^{\circ} 23$, driver A. Menu against the Decision of the Panel of the Stewards of the Meeting taken on 20 November 2005
Event run in Macao on 20 November 2005 and counting in the 2005 FIA World Touring Car Championship

The International Court of Appeal (ICA), comprising Mr Xavier CONESA (Spain), elected President, Mr Pierre TOURIGNY (Canada), Mr Reginald REDMOND (Ireland) and Mr Laurent ANSELMI (Monaco),

Meeting in Monaco on Thursday, 8 December 2005 at the Hôtel de Paris,
Ruling on the appeal lodged on 22 November 2005 by the Motor Sports Association (MSA) on behalf of its competitor Chevrolet, car $\mathrm{N}^{\circ} 23$, driver A. Menu, against the decision taken by the Panel of the Stewards of the Meetings on 20 November 2005 during the event run on 20 November 2005 in Macao and counting in the 2005 FIA World Touring Car Championship,

WHEREAS in a letter dated 28 November 2005, the MSA, on behalf of its competitor Chevrolet, announced that the latter was withdrawing its appeal,

WHEREAS no objections were raised in this respect either by the FIA or anybody else,

## ON THESE GROUNDS,

NOTES the withdrawal of the appeal of the competitor Chevrolet represented by its ASN, the MSA,

PRONOUNCES the withholding of the appeal fee, in accordance with Article 185.2 of the International Sporting Code,

LEAVES the costs to be borne by the appellant, in accordance with Article 190 of the International Sporting Code.
