The FIA INTERNATIONAL COURT OF APPEAL, composed of Mr Graham Stoker (Great Britain), elected President, Mr Xavier Conesa (Spain), Mr Vassilis Koussis (Greece) and Mr Laurent Anselmi (Monaco);

Meeting in Paris on Thursday 24 February 2005 at the headquarters of the Fédération Internationale de l'Automobile, 8, place de la Concorde, 75008 Paris, concerning the appeal brought by the ÖAMTC on behalf of its licence-holder, the driver Robert Lechner, against the two decisions handed down on 1 July 2003 by the German NCA concerning the event entitled "International 31st ADAC Zurich 24 Hours", run on the Nürburgring circuit on 31 May and 1 June 2003;
