




CIRCUIT MAP

Pit Building

- Formula 1® has constructed an iconic pit building which will become a landmark in Las Vegas, located on Harmon Avenue and Koval Lane. It is currently the largest pit building on the Formula 1 calendar at the length of three American football fields.
- 39-acre site.
- Two tunnels for pedestrians under Turns 1 & 2.
- Four levels (three stories and rooftop).
- A 28,000-square-foot video screen in the shape of the F1® logo will be lit on top of the Pit Building, visible to airplanes above.
- 13.75 miles of stainless-steel cable was used in building the perimeter handrail system.
- Groundbreaking: November 5, 2022.





Track Build

 During the construction of the Las Vegas Strip Circuit™, the track build involved removing between 5 to 10 inches of existing asphalt that was replaced with 60,000 tons of base layer pavement. The track was completed with an additional 21,000 tons of intermediate and 22,000 tons of race layer pavement to create a high-performance racing surface.

Temporary Construction

- 1,750 temporary light units will illuminate the track.
- 18 grandstand structures.
- 10 hospitality club structures.
- 7.6 miles of track barriers.
- 3,500 track barrier blocks.
- 12 ticketed zones.
- Four temporary vehicular bridges.
- Three temporary pedestrian bridges in addition to eight existing bridge enclosures around the resort corridor.




LAS VEGAS STRIP CIRCUIT™ DETAILS

Start-to-Finish

The Las Vegas Strip Circuit™ begins with a curved start and culminates with a long straight from Turn 17 through the finish line, providing a thrilling finish for fans. As drivers make their way to the end of the track they pass the Las Vegas Grand Prix Pit Building—a 300,000-square-foot, state-of-the-art facility measuring three American football fields in length—before being met by fans in the main grandstand and Skybox.

Turn 1

In the opening moments of the race, drivers will accelerate towards 190 mph / 305 kph, before their skills are immediately put to test 218 yards / 200 meters in with a hard-braking hairpin turn. Turn 1 represents the first opportunity for drivers to overtake their competitors and jockey for position.



Turn 2 - Turn 4

Turns 2 through 4 are packed with the first mid-fast corners for drivers, providing high-speed action at an estimated 125 mph / 200 kph. With an arena-like ambiance, surrounded by grandstands and hospitality, this stretch will test drivers' strategy and technical knowledge of the circuit as they face pit exit battles and a prime opportunity to secure DRS overtaking in the following straight.



Turn 4 - Turn 5

Following an exit from Turn 4, a back straight awaits drivers to enter the DRS zone. This stretch presents a prime opportunity for drivers to hit the throttle and reach speeds up to 193 mph / 310 kph. This is a pivotal moment in the race for drivers to overtake each other before reaching a hard-braking point at Turn 5.






Turn 5 - Turn 9

Turns 5 through 9 represent the slowest and most technical part of the racetrack. As drivers accelerate past the hard brake of Turn 5, they will be forced to brake leading up to Turn 6, which is followed by a blind corner before Turn 7. Drivers will then enter a short elevation drop down prior to Turn 7's off-camber turn. This will be a major moment for drivers to defend while braking and understeering as they speed under the glow of Sphere, creating another arena-like atmosphere through Turn 8. Turn 9 will test drivers prior to the long straightaway to Turn 12 later in the race.




Turn 10 - Turn 11

Following the turns, drivers can reach high-speeds once again with the S-turns on Turn 10 and 11. Located in a high-downforce section of the racetrack, drivers will pass legendary Las Vegas resorts, including the Wynn and Venetian, reaching speeds of approximately 187 mph / 300 kph and facing lateral G-forces of 3.8 G's.



Turn 12

Turn 12 is another technical zone that requires off-camber braking, with a corresponding risk of tire graining and understeering. Leading up to this turn, drivers will reach speeds up to 193 mph / 310 kph, adding another element of difficulty to the turn's already challenging layout. Exiting Turn 12 with speed is critical as drivers will enter a long run down the Las Vegas Strip, with DRS activation waiting in front of the turn.





Turn 12 - Turn 14

Following Turn 12, drivers will enter the longest acceleration area of the Las Vegas Strip Circuit™, spanning approximately 1,936 yards / 1,775 meters. This DRS zone flows through Turn 13 and represents the second longest straight on the F1 calendar. As drivers proceed down the Las Vegas Strip, they are met with exquisite views of the city's most notable landmarks, including Caesars Palace, The Mirage, Harrah's, the Fountains of Bellagio and more. During this segment of the race, drivers will reach estimated top speeds of over 210 mph / 337 kph and have a pristine overtaking opportunity in front of Turn 14.



Turn 14 - Turn 16


Successfully navigating Turns 14 through 16 is crucial for ensuring a faster lap time. Hitting the apex through this tricky chicane is key to obtaining as much speed as possible before entering the start-to-finish straight, where competitors will look to counterattack. Just after the braking point before Turn 14, drivers will be able to accelerate nearly flat out as they traverse Turns 15 and 16 and make their way to the start / finish line.





Turn 17

Turn 17 leads into a pulse-pounding finish with plenty of overtaking opportunities following the Strip. The turn entry leads over the road crest of the public road and drops down to the start finish line. These are the final moments for drivers to attack as they zoom past pit entry on the right and head towards the coveted finish line.

The CATCH Garage tickets also come with a paddock pass and access to the Paddock Club Rooftop which features 360-degree views of the Las Vegas Strip Circuit ™ and the Elevation Lounge pouring Volcan X.A.

East Harmon Zone presented by Virgin Hotels Las Vegas

DESTINATION INFORMATION

Language

English

Time Zone

Las Vegas, Nevada is in the Pacific Time Zone (GMT-7).

Currency

The national currency of Las Vegas, Nevada is the American Dollar (USD) and supplied by the U.S. Federal Reserve. American paper currency come in seven denominations: \$1, \$2, \$5, \$10, \$20, \$50, and \$100.

ATM + Credit Card Information - ATMs in Casinos

Credit Cards are widely accepted around Las Vegas. ATMs are readily available, although ATM Fees are much higher inside of casinos than at a bank.

Gratuities

Customarily, gratuities of 18% to 20% of the pre-tax total are paid to hospitality industry personnel who render personal services. You may find a restaurant has already added the gratuity to the bill. If you are in a larger group (usually 6+), many restaurants will automatically add a 20% gratuity to your final bill. In that case, you are not required to give any additional amount.

It is also customary to provide tips for bellmen, usually \$2 a bag, and \$2 - 5 a day for housekeeping.

Alcohol

The legal drinking age is 21 in Nevada. Carrying an open container & consuming it in public is legal in Las Vegas & unincorporated Clark County, including The Strip. It is prohibited to have glass containers outside of a bar or restaurant, open containers when a passenger of a private vehicle.

Smoking

Smoking and vaping are not permitted in the Media Center, the Paddock and Pit Building.

Gambling

The legal gambling age in Nevada is 21. While some resorts prohibit videos and photography on the casino floor, others may allow small camera or cell phone photos. It is highly recommended that you clear any filming requests with property public relations prior to arrival. 1-800-GAMBLER is the 24/7 National Problem Gambling Helpline.

Electricity

The standard voltage is 120 V and the standard frequency is 60 Hz. In the U.S., the power plugs and sockets are of type A and B, which is the plug that has 2 rectangular pins (A) and sometimes a third circular pin (B).

Telephones

+1 is the international code used to dial to USA. Las Vegas mobile phone numbers have 10 digits and most mobile numbers start with 702 and 725. All 10 digits must be dialed for calls within Las Vegas. For example: 702-123-XXXX. When calling from outside the US, you will need to dial +1 (the US country code) + (US area code) + (7-digit US local phone number). For example: +1 702-123-XXXX.

Taxes

The minimum combined 2023 sales tax rate for Las Vegas, Nevada is 8.38%. This is the total of state, county, and city sales tax rates.

Hotel Tax

In addition to a 13.38% hotel tax, there may also be additional taxes and fees charged by individual hotels, including: Resort fees – These daily mandatory fees cover amenities like internet, gym access, etc. and are typically \$20-50 per night.

Driving & Traffic Regulations

U.S. law stipulates driving on the righthand side of the road and passing on the left. Right turns are permitted at red lights unless otherwise indicated. Always note posted speed limits. All persons riding in an automobile are required to wear seatbelts. Children under five years of age must be fastened securely in government-approved child car seats.



GETTING AROUND LAS VEGAS

Media Hotel

The designated media hotel is at Tuscany Suites & Casino. Tuscany Suites & Casino also houses the media center and provides very convenient proximity to the paddock and pit building – an approximately five-minute walk on foot. Shuttle buses will be available to facilitate transportation between the Media Accreditation Center, the Media Center, and other areas of the track.

Driving & Media Parking

Parking is limited and is assigned on a first come, first-served basis. The media car park is located at the Tuscany Suites & Casino where the Media Center is located. An official car pass is needed to park there. Please inquire at the Media Accreditation Center for more details. Media parking is walking distance from both the Media Center and the paddock.

Harry Reid International Airport (LAS)

Harry Reid International Airport is conveniently located just 2 miles from Las Vegas Boulevard and 3.4 miles from the MGM Grand Conference Center (MAC) and Tuscany Suites & Casino (Media Center and Media Hotel), with most hotels located within a 15-minute drive from the airport. Harry Reid International Airport currently has nonstop service to nearly 160 U.S. and international cities (as of October 2022).

Taxis

Taxis are a reliable form of transportation used throughout Las Vegas. Taxi service is regulated by the Nevada Taxicab Authority, a Nevada State agency responsible for issuing medallions and setting fares. There are several companies to choose from and taxis are available. Unlike other cities, you cannot hail a taxi on the street in Las Vegas. Taxis are required to pick up passengers at a physical address, such as a hotel taxi line. Hotels have specific areas for taxi pick-up, usually near the valet or main entrance. Taxis are common around Las Vegas and queue at most major resort casinos. All taxi companies accept credit cards. The maximum number of passengers allowed in any cab is six.

Rideshare

Lyft and Uber are authorized to provide services at the airport and most locations around the city. Use the apps on your mobile device to arrange for a ride.

Las Vegas Monorail

With trains arriving every 4-8 minutes at seven stations spanning the eastside of the Las Vegas Strip, the <u>Las Vegas Monorail</u> is a convenient, cost-effective option to navigate the Strip corridor. As part of the event's commitment to sustainability, the inaugural FORMULA 1 HEINEKEN SILVER LAS VEGAS GRAND PRIX 2023 has instilled environmentally conscious practices.



Energy efficiencies at the Las Vegas Grand Prix Pit Building include:

- Upcycled existing concrete from demolition into the new build.
- Energy sub-metering and air quality monitoring.
- Mechanical Cooling to conserve water.
- Energy efficient lights both inside the building and on the rooftop LEDs.
- Nevada-based renewable energy credits to offset our year-round energy consumption with the help of our partners like Switch.

Event-focused efforts include:

- Reducing and eliminating single use waste by providing compostable cups, plates, and utensils
 in fan areas
- Eliminating plastic water bottles and serving canned water and water in glass containers throughout the circuit with the help of our partners Liquid Death and Evian.
- Each of the event areas will use hybrid energy systems (generators) and test to scale up after year one.
- Food rescue programs for all fan zones and hospitality, eliminating food waste ending up in a landfill and providing hunger relief to local organizations who need it most.
- Recycling & minimizing waste throughout racing facilities.



LAS VEGAS GRAND PRIX WATER CONSERVATION PROGRAM

In October, Las Vegas Grand Prix, Inc. announced the launch of a first-of-its-kind water conservation program to implement technologies that can reduce, and eventually offset, outdoor water consumption at large-scale sporting events. The initiative will be rolled out at MGM Grand Hotel & Casino in partnership with Southern Nevada Water Authority (SNWA), WaterStart and MGM Resorts ahead of the FORMULA 1 HEINEKEN SILVER LAS VEGAS GRAND PRIX 2023. At scale, the water conservation program could make it possible for the event to be the first Net-Zero Water Consumption race in Formula 1® history.

The Las Vegas Grand Prix has installed an atmospheric water generator ("AWG") to offset the expected outdoor water usage throughout race weekend. Atmospheric water generators are used around the world today to capture water vapor that would otherwise be considered waste product and return it back into the system – in some areas of the world, this process is being used to create drinkable water in settings where there is no access to running water. The second largest consumption of water in Las Vegas is commercial cooling, a process that utilizes water to cool the temperature inside buildings. These cooling systems also produce humid air that is lost to the atmosphere. To maximize the amount of water captured and ultimately produced, the Las Vegas Grand Prix and its partners will leverage the high relative humidity generated from a commercial cooling tower at MGM Grand during the race.

Currently, a pre-pilot phase is being conducted to install the atmospheric water generator and assess its performance as it converts the "plume" of moist air released from the cooling tower into water. Specific targets for water conservation during the race will be further informed by the pre-pilot phase.

"As responsible stewards of resources in the communities where we race, we are honored to partner with our neighbors on this innovative water conservation program," said Renee Wilm, Chief Executive Officer of Las Vegas Grand Prix, Inc. "This project not only benefits our home in the Valley but also sets a new aspiration for global motorsports. If successful, the Las Vegas Grand Prix is aiming to become the first Net-Zero Water Consumption race in Formula 1 history."


In 2019, F1® launched a sustainability strategy with a target to be a net-zero carbon sport by 2030 and host more sustainable events. The Las Vegas Grand Prix has committed to various sustainability initiatives in support of these goals, such as the elimination of avoidable single-use plastics and has identified water conservation efforts as a key component to ultimately achieving a more sustainable event.


The Las Vegas Grand Prix's primary water consumption is the water used to prep the surface of the streets, which helps ensure the safety of the track for racing. However, more than two decades of drought conditions in the Colorado River Basin have reduced reservoir levels in Lake Mead, the source of 90 percent of Las Vegas's water supply. In 2022, the federal government declared an official water shortage on the Colorado River, impacting roughly 25 million people in the U.S. who rely on Colorado River water from Lake Mead. Water conservation is a critical component of Las Vegas' sustainable water management practices.

"As Las Vegas continues to manage its limited water supply, it's important that we do our part in reducing Las Vegas Grand Prix's total outdoor water consumption," said Pilar Harris, Senior Director of CSR, Sustainability, and Government Relations at Las Vegas Grand Prix, Inc. "With this innovative program, we hope to identify new solutions for any business looking to reduce water consumption in our desert home"



"Given the severity of our drought in Clark County, we always appreciate proactive efforts from private partners to minimize their water use," said Clark County Commissioner Marilyn Kirkpatrick, who serves as chair of the Board of Directors of the Southern Nevada Water Authority. "This project has the potential to serve as a template for other events held in our community and reaffirming our collective commitment to water conservation in our destination."

MAIN RULES & REGULATIONS IN FORMULA ONE

A Concise Summary

General Provisions

Both cars entered by a competitor must be presented in substantially the same livery at every Competition, any significant change to this livery during a championship may only be made with the agreement of the FIA and the Commercial Rights Holder.

In order that the cars of each competitor may be easily distinguished from one another whilst they are on the track, the on-board cameras located above the principal roll structure of the first car must remain as it is supplied to the Competitor and the second car must be predominantly fluorescent yellow.

Each car will carry the competition number of its driver as published by the FIA at the beginning of the championship or the competition number that has been allocated to his replacement in accordance with Article 32.4c). This number must be clearly visible from the front of the car and on the driver's crash helmet

Scrutineering

Each competitor will be required to carry out initial scrutineering of his cars which will commence four hours prior to the start of P1 and submit the duly completed declaration no later than two hours before the start of P1.

Event Schedule

At each competition where a sprint session is not scheduled:

Two free practice sessions (P1 and P2), each lasting one hour and separated by no less than two hours and no more than three hours, take place on the first day of on track running.

Within three hours of the end of the second free practice session (P2) all cars used during each session (or which were intended for use but failed to leave the pit lane) must be covered and ready for FIA seals to be applied in order to ensure that they remain secure until the following day.

A further free practice session (P3), lasting one hour and starting no less than eighteen hours after the end of P2, will take place on the second day of on track running. Three hours before the start of P3, the FIA seals and covers may be removed.

The starting grid of the race will be determined by the results of the qualifying practice session which will take place on the second day of on track running, and will start no less than two hours, and no more than three hours after the end of P3.

Qualifying

The qualifying practice session will be run as follows:

For the first eighteen minutes of the session (Q1) all cars will be permitted on the track and at the end of this period the slowest five cars will be prohibited from taking any further part in the session. Lap times achieved by the fifteen remaining cars will then be deleted. The eliminated five cars make up grid positions 20 to 16.

After a seven-minute break the session will resume for fifteen minutes (Q2) and the fifteen remaining cars will be permitted on the track. At the end of this period the slowest five cars will be prohibited



from taking any further part in the session. Lap times achieved by the ten remaining cars will then be deleted. The eliminated five cars will make up grid positions 15 to 11.

After an eight-minute break the session will resume for twelve minutes (Q3) and the ten remaining cars will be permitted on the track. The remaining ten cars will make up grid positions 10 to 1.

Each car will be deemed to be in parc fermé from the time at which it leaves the pit lane for the first time during the qualifying practice session until the start of the race. Any car which fails to leave the pit lane during the qualifying practice session will be deemed to be in parc fermé at the end of Q1. Between these times, other than when cars are sealed overnight, a certain amount of work may be carried out.

Race

When the green lights are illuminated, all cars on the grid should begin the formation lap with the pole position driver leading. When leaving the grid all drivers must respect the pit lane speed limit until they pass pole position. Marshals will be instructed to push any car (or cars) which remain on the grid into the pit lane by the fastest route immediately after cars able to do so have left the grid. Any driver being pushed from the grid may not attempt to start the car and must follow the instructions of the marshals.

During the formation lap practice starts are forbidden and the formation must be kept as tight as possible. Overtaking during the formation lap is only permitted if a car is delayed and cars behind cannot avoid passing it without unduly delaying the remainder of the field. In this case, drivers may only overtake to re-establish the original starting order. Any driver delayed in this way, and who is unable to re-establish the original starting order before he reaches the first safety car line, must enter the pit lane and start from the end of the pit lane.

When the cars come back to the grid at the end of the formation lap or laps, they must stop within their respective starting grid positions, keeping their engines running. There will be a standing start, the signal being given by means of lights activated by the permanent starter. Once all the cars have come to a halt the five-second light will appear followed by the four, three, two and one second lights. At any time after the one-second light appears, the race will be started by extinguishing all red lights.

A chequered flag will be the end-of-session signal and will be shown at the Line as soon as the leading car has covered the full distance.

The car placed first will be the one having covered the scheduled distance in the shortest time, or, where appropriate, passed the line in the lead at the end of two hours. All cars will be classified taking into account the number of complete laps they have covered, and for those which have completed the same number of laps, the order in which they crossed the line. Cars having covered less than 90% of the number of laps covered by the winner (rounded down to the nearest whole number of laps), will not be classified.

Safety Car

The safety car may be brought into operation to neutralize a race upon the order of the clerk of the course. It will be used only if competitors or officials are in immediate physical danger on or near the track but the circumstances are not such as to necessitate suspending the race.

Virtual Safety Car Procedure (VSC)

The VSC procedure may be initiated to neutralize a practice session or a race upon the order of the clerk of the course. It will normally be used when double waved yellow flags are needed on any

section of track and competitors or officials may be in danger, but the circumstances are not such as to warrant use of the safety car itself.

Points

Points for both titles will be awards at each competition according to the following scale.

In addition to the above, one point will be awarded to the driver who achieved the fastest valid lap time of the race and to the constructor whose car he was driving, provided he was in the top ten positions of the final race classification. No point will be awarded if the fastest valid lap time is achieved by a driver who was classified outside the top ten positions, or if the leader has completed less than 50% of the scheduled race distance.

Tires

Although Pirelli provides three compounds – the softs, mediums, and hards – for every race, there are six tire compounds available that differ between events. The hardest of these six compounds is the CO, the second-hardest the C1, etc. until reaching the C5, the softest tire in the current F1 range.

For easier identification, the tire walls have a colored band on each side, with red denoting soft tires, yellow indicating mediums, and the white-walled tires are the hards. Green-walled tires (intermediate) are for damp conditions and blue (full wet) for heavy rain. Colors remain the same for each race despite different compounds being used.

Every driver must use at least two tire compounds during a race, unless the race is declared wet. Pirelli provides 13 sets of tires for each driver for the weekend, divided into eight sets of soft tires, three sets of mediums, and two sets of hards. Additionally, each driver gets four sets of intermediate tires for damp tracks and three sets of full wets for heavy rain.

After every free practice session, a driver must return two sets of tires to Pirelli, so by the time Qualifying begins, a driver will have just seven sets of tires to make it from Q1 until the race's chequered flag.

To give a slight advantage to drivers that don't qualify in the top 10, any driver who doesn't make Q3 will retain all seven sets of tires for the race, while P1-P10 qualifiers hand Pirelli back one final set after qualifying ends.

Sanctions

The stewards may impose the penalties specifically set out in the FIA Sporting Regulations in addition to or instead of any other penalties available to them. Any driver who receives five reprimands in the same championship will, upon the imposition of the fifth, be given a ten-grid place penalty for the race at that competition. If the fifth reprimand is imposed following an incident during a race, the ten-grid place penalty will be applied at the driver's next competition. The ten-grid place penalty will only be imposed if at least four of the reprimands were imposed for a driving infringement.
