








MEDIA CENTRE UPPER LEVEL

WORKING IN THE MEDIA CENTE

The Media Centre is located on the **Formula 1® Paddock** (driver's right). All accredited journalist and photographers must register at the Media Centre Reception on the lower level of the building on first arriving at the circuit. Staff at Reception will assist with seating allocation, internet access and locker keys if required.

> Standard telephone and IT services

Standard phone services will be available to all media without a connection fee. Phones will be available in the Media Telecom Centre located in the lower level of the Media Centre, also in this room there will be computers with internet and printing access.

> Free wireless internet services

Free wireless internet will be available in the Media Centre and Photographer's Centre. This network will allow 50 Mbps services for national and international press. Ethernet will be allowed in the Photographer's area, this will include internet browsing, mail services and FTP services. A technician is available everyday (during opening hours). Inquire at the Reception Desk.

Lockers

Lockers are available on the upper and lower levels for photographers and press with a refundable deposit of \$10 USD / \$100 Mexican pesos.

> Electrical power

Each workstation is equipped with power outlets. Voltage in Mexico is 114-140 volts. Members of the international press must inquire about compatibility of their electronic and electric devices. To obtain a transformer, please inquire at the reception desk.



Is the real name of the game

Mexico makes the message clear


Guadalajara, Mexico, June 7, 1970 – At football's most unforgettable World Cup Brazil have beaten world champions England 1-0. In an iconic photograph Brazilian genius Pele and England's captain Bobby Moore embrace at the end of an epic encounter. Their gesture is pure sportsmanship – two men separated by race, color, background, language, and history but united in celebration of their respect for each other and the game.

This is the spirit Mexico would like the Mexican Grand Prix, and its own global sport of Formula 1, to embrace in its **#Racepect** campaign.

In recent years Formula 1 has been marred by incidents that suggest a lack of respect and tolerance among members of the community, like fans booing drivers other than their own favorite, controversy over race results or ill-considered comments about ethnicity. With **#Racepect**, Mexico urges everyone in F1 – drivers, management, officials, media, fans – to remember that ours truly is a sport: rivalry and camaraderie can go hand-inhand.

Two decades after Moore and Pele shared their moment, F1 itself, thousands of miles away, engraved another example of sportsmanship on our memories, with another great Brazilian at the heart of it.

We knew Ayrton Senna was fast in a Formula 1 car – but the 1992 Belgian Grand Prix showed us he was fleet of foot and quick-thinking as well.





In Friday practice Erik Comas crashed heavily in his Ligier. Senna rounded the corner, came upon the debris strewn all over the track, and realized the Frenchman was unconscious in the cockpit, his engine still racing. Ayrton leaped from his McLaren, sprinted back to a car which he knew might go up in flames any moment, turned off the engine, and held Comas's head up until he could be extracted.

Fast forward another 30 years: in the 2022 British Grand Prix Chinese driver Zhou Guanyu has a terrifying accident on the first lap. George Russell stops his Mercedes and races towards the wreckage. *"I wanted to go and see if he was okay and if I could have helped in any way,"* says the Englishman – another case of sportsmanship in a critical moment.

Russell's Mercedes teammate Sir Lewis Hamilton – F1's first Black driver – has worked tirelessly out of the cockpit to make the sport a more allembracing community, through The Hamilton Commission, through support for the UNHCR refugee agency, and in his daily demeanor. As the seven-time World Champion insists, *"It's not just about creating better life chances for young people, helping them to find their purpose and forge their own futures. It's about the knock-on effects of that: greater diversity in positions of leadership and influence, in the world of work, in sport, culture, politics."*

On track too, Hamilton leads by example. Criticized for a clash with Australian rookie Oscar Piastri at this season's Italian Grand Prix, Hamilton said: *"The incident with Oscar was just unfortunate. I misjudged the gap that I had and it was totally my fault. I went and apologized to him straight away."*

Coming back to Mexico, Sergio Pérez will be the focal point of his home race this year for all the wrong reasons. Driving himself to the limit to compete with a teammate who is a once-in-a-generation talent, Checo has found himself having a very challenging season.

Pérez rose above it and will have earned even more admiration from his legion of local fans. As **#Racepect** aims to restore the true essence of motorsport, so everyone can enjoy Formula 1 in a space free of prejudice, a tolerant place where aggression is not admitted at any level. We must understand that Checo's greatness is based on his loyalty to competition and recognition of his rivals. In that sense, we would like all attendees at the Mexico GP to show passionate support for their own man but also respect for the other 19 drivers on show.

What happens on track stays on track. What happens off it makes respect the badge of honor for our sport, a global spectacle with drivers of more than 15 nationalities and team members from countless more.

As American sports anchor Bob Ley once said, "If character is what you do when no-one is watching, sportsmanship is that conduct with everyone watching." Let's remember that not only 300,000 fans will be watching at the Autodromo Hermanos Rodriguez on race weekend, but a worldwide audience numbered in the hundreds of millions.

#Racepect, endorsed by all 10 teams in the World Championship, believes its really more about the spectacle than the battle – and Mexico's Grand Prix really is one of the most spectacular events on our planet.



THERE'S NO PLACE LIKE HOME Checo still chasing his Mexican dream



Can a sportsman who only 'plays at home' once in 22 races have anything we might call home advantage? That's the question Sergio Pérez wants to answer with a resounding 'Yes!' at the Autodromo Hermanos Rodriguez this weekend. Like most of his F1 rivals, the man from Guadalajara spends most of the 10-month season based in Europe, where his bases have included Madrid and Monaco, to reduce the physical and mental effects of long hours in airplanes.

But if Checo's Mexican predecessors in F1 are anything to go by, the answer to our question about home advantage must be 'No'. After all, Moises Solana started his home race six times but never scored a point; nor did Esteban Gutierrez; and even Pérez's idol Pedro Rodriguez, who raced at home seven times, scored points only once, when he finished fourth for BRM in the final race of 1968. But if we look at Checo's own record at AHR, the answer heads toward positive territory. **Mexico's top man** has raced here seven times – and failed to score just once, when he failed to finish in 2018. Not only that, but he has been a podium finisher in each of the last two seasons in third place.

So he must feel comfortable playing at home. And when we add his international record, we see that **Checo deserves to be recognized among the superstars of Mexican sport.** The man who drives a Red Bull is up there with 'The Bull of Etchohuaquila', LA Dodgers pitcher Fernando Valenzuela. He scores points like Hugo Sánchez, 'The Golden Child', scored goals for Real Madrid. He has a legion of adoring fans, like 'The Caesar of boxing', Julio César Chávez, who once drew a crowd of 132,275 to the Azteca Stadium.



When you have **six Grand Prix victories** under your belt, plus two poles and **11 fastest race laps**, theirs is the company you keep. And after notching up his **250th race start in Singapore** a few weeks ago, Checo is on a list of names that includes the Alonsos, Schumachers and Hamiltons of the racing world. His tally also far outstrips the combined total – 168 – of his Mexican F1 predecessors.

"It has been a dream," said Pérez when that 250th start came around, "and I am proud to have represented Mexico all over the world for this many years." The 2023 season has been a controversial one for Perez: a season that will be the best of his career, if he achieves second place in the Drivers' Championship, but full of certain disadvantages that undoubtedly affected his performance on the track.

It all began so well. He won the second round in Saudi Arabia, saying "I had a wicked race – a new word I learned this week! I love being a part of this team, because of the way we push and the way we deliver." He won again in round four in Azerbaijan, which had the Red Bull team calling him 'the king of the streets' as he added to his victories in Monaco and Singapore in 2022. "I am definitely in the hunt for the title," said Pérez. "I believe I can be very good anywhere this season."

There were just two setbacks. Number one: his teammate, as Max Verstappen expressed his oncein-a-generation talent with a string of 10 straight victories. Setback number two: his own form. By the time of his 250th start in Singapore Checo had not won again and had been on the podium only five more times.

Already at round five in Miami Pérez admitted, "I think the performance Max showed today was not reachable for me, so I have to understand why." Come Canada and round eight he was saying, "Right now I am more concerned about my drop in performance than my place in the Championship because the pace is just not there." A double podium in Austria, one of the season's Sprint race weekends, was a boost. But Checo is nothing if not honest and another underwhelming weekend in Britain brought this comment: "I have full support from the team, I'm mentally very strong and I know that I will overcome these issues and turn around my season."

By the time he left Japan, the 16th race of the season, Pérez was 33 points clear of Mercedes' Lewis Hamilton as he chased second place behind Verstappen in the Drivers' Championship. He has made almost uninterrupted progress from 16th overall back in 2011 to fourth, fourth, and third in the last three years. With just four races to go, a best-ever second place is still firmly in his sights - so playing at home is more important than ever. So there is another saying Sergio might want to remember this weekend. 'El que busca encuentra,' it goes. Keep chasing your dream – and Checo has no intention of giving up on it just yet. Some researchers say that 'home advantage' grows in proportion to the size of the crowd: with more than 300,000 fans flocking to AHR he should be on a winner.



PLENTY TO PLAY FOR IN MEXICO

Lucky break in Texas but Checo still checking the rear-view mirrors

Sergio Pérez and Max Verstappen arrive in Mexico City for Checo's home race with two messages ringing loud and clear in their ears – and they both spell trouble for the all-conquering Red Bull Racing team.


Verstappen took his **50th Formula 1 victory** in Austin last weekend and Pérez claimed a fighting fifth place that turned into fourth, but warning shots still came from two British drivers who shared the spotlight with the Dutchman in Texas.

'Keep pushing, we're getting closer,' Lewis Hamilton told his Mercedes team after pushing Verstappen all the way to the line. Bitter disappointment followed when Hamilton was disqualified for a technical infringement on the #44 car's underfloor plank, but the on-track performance was there for all to see.

'Just not enough today,' said Lando Norris, who celebrated his 100th Grand Prix start by taking second place for McLaren after leading for the first part of the race. 'I just couldn't hold on long enough – but we're getting there.'

While the Mercedes revival is no surprise, what's happening at McLaren is one of the stories of this 2023 season. It was back in 1963 that a young New Zealander raced in Mexico for the first time. Sixty years later, almost to the day, the race team Bruce McLaren founded in that same year is hot on the heels of the runaway Red Bull train.









McLaren started the season by christening their 2023 car the MCL60 in honor of Bruce and his legacy. They made a sluggish start to this anniversary year: neither Norris nor Australian rookie Oscar Piastri could score a podium finish until Round 11, their home race at Silverstone. But since the season break and the latest upgrades to the MCL60, McLaren have been the stars of the fastest show on Earth.

Already in Hungary, the final race of the first part of the season, Norris was able to celebrate McLaren's development. *"We're very happy with the progress we've made, to go from where we were four, five races ago, to be fighting for poles and fighting for podiums,"* said the 23-year-old Briton.

By the time they reached Japan, where Norris and Piastri were both on the podium, he was positively euphoric. 'We're not close to Max,' he conceded, 'but we're not miles away either.' And when the McLaren duo repeated the double podium next time out in Qatar it became clear that McLaren, with its young driving line-up, is the coming force in F1 once more.

In the last three races McLaren have scored 103 points – just six fewer than Red Bull. Too little, too late? If McLaren had started the season that way, they would be Championship contenders. As it is, they are fighting it out for fourth and fifth with another great British racing name.

Aston Martin – or rather, their star driver Fernando Alonso – did start their season with a bang: four podiums in the first six races. '*This is an incredible result from the entire team, and we must enjoy this moment*,' said the 42-year-old Alonso when he and teammate Lance Stroll took third and sixth places in the season-opener in Bahrain.

Alonso was also careful not to get carried away: *'This feels like a dream'*, he added, *'but we must stay realistic because this is just one track, and this is the first race*.' Spoken like a man who has taken part in 364 Grands Prix – and Fernando was right, because things have nose-dived since then.

Alonso has been on the podium just three more times and Stroll, outperformed by his World Champion teammate, hasn't been up there at all. But the Canadian has taken heart from a seventh place in Texas: *'We'll be working hard to take this momentum into Mexico next weekend,*' he said after being promoted from ninth following Hamilton's misfortune and a similar penalty for Ferrari's Charles Leclerc.

McLaren's devastating return to the front means they now sit six points ahead and look certain to stop their rivals hitting the target that Aston Martin team principal Mike Krack set out early in the year. 'At least fourth,' he said bravely. That may now be a stretch.



Sergio Pérez went back to school – the simulator at Red Bull HQ in England – in his bid to break his recent run of poor results. Austin was a lucky break, but Checo will still be looking in his mirrors for the final four rounds of this season as Mexico's Red Bull driver seeks to crown his most successful year ever.

That's because Hamilton is still only 39 points behind Checo as the finishing straight looms. Although Red Bull have snared 25 of the 54 podium places so far, Pérez hasn't been up there since the Italian Grand Prix way back in September. But the Mexican saw good things from his car in Texas: *'We need to make sure we learn from this weekend as there are some good understandings to make for Mexico*,'he said. *'There is a bit more pace in there and I am massively looking forward to my home Grand Prix.'*

Meanwhile Hamilton and teammate George Russell have an extra incentive: Mercedes and Ferrari are locked in battle for the runner-up spot in the Constructors' Championship and the extra millions of dollars that go with it.

Despite another disappointing season the men and women from Maranello are just 22 points behind Mercedes, helped by the Texas result and Carlos Sainz winning in Singapore – the only victory for anyone not wearing a Red Bull driving suit this year. Mercedes looked to have shot themselves in the foot in Qatar when Hamilton and teammate George Russell came together on the opening lap. While the seven-time World Champion was out, Russell fought hard for the fourth place that kept Mercedes ahead when Charles Leclerc came fifth and Ferrari sidekick Carlos Sainz did not even start with fuel feed issues.

'It was difficult after the last race in Qatar,' Hamilton said in Texas. 'I really felt like I let the team down, so I had to go through such a deep process to get myself back to here. It's one of those experiences of "it's not how you fall, it's how you get back up". I came here in the mood to fight hard, felt great and I'm really happy with my performance.'

So: Can Norris finally take his first victory to help McLaren celebrate 60 years? Can Pérez keep Hamilton at bay and cement his own most successful season? Will Lewis fight back from his recent troubles? Can the Silver Arrows stay ahead of the Prancing Horses? Behind Verstappen, the next seven drivers are all still fighting for the points to decide their final standing.

All these questions and more are still to be answered at AHR this weekend.
